

As parishioners, we are part of a community, a parish family. We do not visit on a Sunday morning, since we cannot visit a place that is home. We are the Body of Christ and every Sunday liturgy gathers Christ's Body to be re-created through Word and Sacrament. This primary activity of God re-creating the Church requires the gifts, talents, and time of each member. Each gift is an offering of love to one another and ultimately to God.

A danger of streamed liturgies was that we could find ourselves as passive spectators instead of active participants. Thoughts of the Pastor...

That was one fast Christmas Season! I was just settling into the joy of Christmas Carols and now, today, we bring the season to a close with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Even though some will say, "all good things must end," the mystery of the Incarnation is ever-present.



What does this particular Feast teach us about our ongoing journey with God in the mystery of the Incarnation? First, and most important, the journey is made in community! Our reading from Luke does not explicitly state this but it is deduced from the story of the Baptism of Jesus. After Jesus was baptized and was praying, "heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.'"

The revelation is made: God is One in Three Persons. Trinitarian life is community within the Godhead. If that be true, and it is, then we who are made in God's image and likeness are created for community. This truth has been brought to the forefront over and over again during the pandemic. The lack of being with family, friends, and community, isolation has wreaked havoc within so many lives.

Not only are we created for community, but it is in community that we live the gift of salvation and further God's Kingdom beginning with the Sacraments of Initiation. Begun in that simple act of "being baptized" Christ blessed water that would become the entry point to life with God in community. Baptized, Confirmed, and fed the Body and Blood of the Lord weekly, disciples of Jesus Christ are empowered and commissioned to live his mission.

The celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism is an exciting time for a family. It brings back memories of the parents' childhoods, grandparents see the continuation of family traditions, extended family is gathered for a celebration. Some will see a deeper truth: a child is welcomed into God's family, original sin is washed away, an intimate relationship with the Trinity begins, and yet there is more!

Unfortunately, many who bring their child for baptism have no intention to follow through on their stated commitment. The parental commitment made during the Rite of Baptism is this: I promise to raise my child in the practice of the faith. This faith is a communal experience. Gathering weekly with the Body of Christ is *necessary* to form a child in the practice of faith.

If the Sacrament of Baptism is misunderstood as simply removing Original Sin and imparting Sanctifying Grace, then it becomes one more thing to "get" from God, like Confirmation and Communion. Without the correct understanding, parents are ill-equipped to assist their child's growth in the faith. Baptism is a serious commitment that leads the beloved to the cross, and yes, Resurrection. This community is prepared and willing to fulfill our responsibility in supporting parents' efforts in raising their child in the practice of the faith.





Everyday Stewardship

I Hope I Am Like Him: “Who is this Christ? Is he like you?”

Perhaps you’ve heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

“He is nothing like me,” the saint is said to have answered. “But I hope I am like him.”

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ — and this is exactly as he wanted it. “One worthier than I is coming,” he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God’s will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let’s examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God’s plan?
