## Thoughts of the Pastor...

We return to Ordinary Time after a very short Christmas Season preceded by Advent. What exactly is Ordinary Time in the Roman Catholic calendar. Well, one could say it is the time after Christmas and before Lent, as well as, the time after Pentecost and before Advent. That is true. We could also say, as in the definition by Webster's, there is nothing special, no distinctive features, or simply normal. Here we need to be careful. But, more on that in a moment.

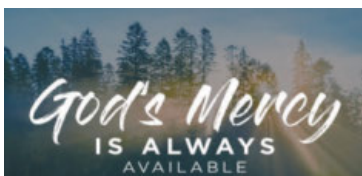
The meaning of Ordinary Time in our liturgical calendar is quite simple. The Latin word *ordinal*, meaning ordered, as in a sequence: first, second, etc. is the correct understanding of "ordinary" time in our calendar year. Last Sunday, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, was the final Sunday of the Christmas Season. The following Monday was the first Monday of the First Week of Ordinary Time. So, today we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. Next Sunday will be the Third, the next will be the Fourth, and so on. This manner of counting time outside of the Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter Seasons affirms progression or movement to our liturgical year.

Now back to what we need to be careful of when referring to Ordinary Time. As stated earlier, Webster's defines ordinary as nothing special, no distinctive features, or simply normal. This is far from the truth of our Catholic understanding of time. Because of the Incarnation, life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, time is now charged and permeated with the presence of God's Spirit. There is nothing "ordinary" about time. This is a very distinctive feature of time for a Catholic Christian. The Gregorian calendar even delineates time based on the Incarnation of the Word of God.

We obviously cannot live Sunday to Sunday at the same pitch or intensity as we are called to live during the Seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. It would be like going to a concert and every song was played as if it was the finale. It would just be too much. There has to be an ebb and flow; quiet to loud, slow to fast, and back again. We need to come down the mountain from time to time, to use another analogy, to live at a measured pace with a heart centered in the Christian mystery. We will then live the extraordinary in "ordinary" activities of daily life.

As Ecclesiastes states in Chapter 3, "There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under the heavens..." Listen carefully to what the author then says after the lengthy litany. "He (God) has made everything appropriate to its time, and put the timeless into their hearts." Yes, the timeless, that which is eternal, lives within each of us. Whether it is Ordinary Time or a particular season, may we grow in our capacity to recognize and celebrate the timeless in time.

## Everyday Stewardship

**It Takes All Kinds:** "If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of "varieties of tongues" might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the wedding at Cana and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, "Do whatever he tells you," her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother herself and give encouragement to follow God's word?

Let us examine our gifts and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us.

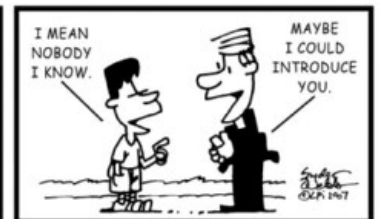
