

Thoughts of the Pastor...

Our Sunday liturgical readings are based on a three-year cycle: A, B, and C. This is year C. Each year a particular Gospel takes center stage. In year C it is the Gospel of Luke. In the prologue of the Gospel, the author tells Theopholus that he has decided to examine everything carefully so that he, Theopholus, might have full confidence concerning the words in which he has been instructed. It is important to note the author of the Gospel of Luke is also the author of the Acts of the Apostles. Therefore, both must be read as one work, each informing the other.

Biblical scholarship is uncertain as to the identity of the author. Most arguments settle on a companion of Saint Paul. Whether or not the author was a physician, as well as the writer of the Gospel, is disputed. As to the audience, we know the Gospel was written to Greek-speaking Gentile Christians living in urban areas in approximately the year 90.

As to sources for the material in the Gospel of Luke, we know the Gospel of Mark was available to the author. Luke follows the order of Mark's narrative rather closely. By comparing Luke to Matthew and Mark, scholars know there is material unique to both Luke and Matthew not contained within Mark. This source, known in biblical scholarship as Q, is not available to us today in written form.

One of the major life contexts addressed by Luke is table fellowship. Meals with Jesus are important in all four gospel accounts. No other gospel, however, equals Luke's emphasis on meals. From a banquet in Levi's house to the risen Lord's final appearance, meal accounts were introduced in nearly every major section of the gospel.

Within these meal stories, some object to the way Jesus and his disciples ate and drank with tax collectors and sinners, as well as the lack of fasting by the disciples of Jesus or Jesus not performing customary washings before eating, and curing the sick during a Sabbath meal. Some meal accounts deal more directly with the behavior of those who come together for meals with Jesus and the implications of these meals for life in the Christian mission. Finally, there are meal accounts which deal directly with the problem of faith experience, for example, the disciples on the road to Emmaus

As we make our way through the Gospel of Luke this year, be attentive to the various stories with table fellowship as the context. The author is not simply recounting an experience of Jesus with his followers and adversaries. The author is inviting us to evaluate our own experience of Eucharist; the call we have received to be fed and nourished, the communion created through Christ's self-gift, the invitation to live what we have received, and to become His Body for others.

Everyday Stewardship

Plant Your Works in the Word: One of the things about Scripture is that even the smallest word and shortest phrase can be critical to the overall message. When you take a quiet moment to rest with the Word, you find how quickly the most mundane sentence can reach out and grab you, pulling you into a deeper contemplation of some truth you hadn't even considered until then.

But we often fail to act as the Israelites in the Book of Nehemiah, standing before the Water Gate "listening attentively." Whether it's at Mass during the Liturgy of the Word or at home poring over the Bible, time after time we find ourselves less mindful than we could be. Our ears accept the sounds of the words and our eyes glance over the shape of the letters.

But are we mindful - truly?

The best answer is hopefully at least sometimes. There are always tasks to be completed, problems weighing on our minds that we can't quite give over to God. We lose ourselves in these things instead of in Scripture. We "clock in" with Bible reading instead of "diving in."

We can never forget that the words of the Lord are spirit and life. They are the soil that quickens the seed of all stewardship. There is no mindfulness, no prayer, no graciousness, no gratitude or accountability or sense of commitment unless there is the Word.

So let us pray today for mindfulness, that our every action will be grounded in the law of God — giving it true spirit and life.
