

# Thoughts of the Pastor...

Our second reading today from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians is commonly chosen for weddings, at least the first few verses, concluding with "Love never fails." It is



understandable that a reading rich in the imagery of love would grab the attention of a couple preparing for marriage. The important question for the couple is why did they choose this particular reading and what does it mean to them.

In the romance stage of their relationship an engaged couple views their relationship through rose-colored glasses. The faults of the other are minimized and the positive qualities of their fiancée are exaggerated. They truly believe, and thankfully so, that their love for one another will conquer all challenges.

Part of a couple's success in navigating the challenges that inevitably come in life is their understanding of love. For many people in our culture today love is simply a feeling. If only a feeling, what happens to a marriage when one or both parties no longer feels love for the other? It must be an indication that the relationship is no longer alive. It is time to part ways and look for love somewhere else.

That is not what we believe as Catholic Christians. It is not what has been revealed to us in Jesus Christ. Yes, we can and do have feelings of love. They are wonderful to experience. But a feeling cannot be the basis for a marriage. So then, what is love if not just a feeling. Love is a decision.

Whether in marriage, family, or friendship, love is a choice. It is grounded in the self-revelation of God. We see it most clearly in the decision of Jesus Christ to be for humanity through suffering and death. This expresses fully God's love for us. We live this gift when we make choices to be for our spouse, family, and friends, sometimes in spite of how we feel. The decision to love carries us through the various feelings. The Paschal Mystery is lived within us through our day-to-day decisions to love even when it is difficult, painful, and yes, even when it calls for a certain death to self.

Turning our attention back to Paul's letter to the Corinthians, what if we substituted "I" for the word love? I am patient, I am kind. I am not jealous, I am not pompous, I am not inflated, I am not rude, I do not seek my own interests, I am not quick-tempered, I do not brood over injury, I do not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoice with the truth.... This certainly puts a finer point on the invitation to make the decision to love.

Feelings are fickle. They come and they go. The decision to love will lead to the cross. But, that death also leads to Resurrection! As Paul says, "Love never fails." May each of us know this enduring love and be quick to offer it to others. It is the way to heaven.

**First Corinthians and the Stewardship of Social Media:** "Love is patient, love is kind ..." As familiar as these words are, they never seem to stray into the territory of becoming trite or silly. At their core they communicate a truth about us and about our Creator that never fails to inspire.

But despite the fact that you've probably heard it at many weddings over time, First Corinthians isn't just for newlyweds. It wasn't written for married folks. It's for every single one of us, in every state of life and every social situation, in every country and culture and language across the globe.

Which means that First Corinthians is even for the online world. It's for Facebook and Twitter and Instagram and all the other platforms I'm forgetting (there seems to be a new one every day, doesn't there?).

A sense of division — whether rooted in politics, culture or anything else — is growing in our world, and it's never more obvious than when we observe interactions online. It is far easier, after all, to remember what love is when a human being of flesh and blood stands before us. When all we see is an avatar or a profile picture on a screen especially accompanied by an opinion with which we vehemently disagree — even the most loving Christians can throw First Corinthians out the window.

As everyday stewards we know that we are charged to be not only gracious but grateful. We receive others but we also give thanks for what they bring to us — even if that's an opportunity to "strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts."

So before the next time you post anything online, I suggest giving First Corinthians a read — and remember, love never fails.
