Thoughts of the Pastor...

This weekend we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Easter. We are at the halfway point of this spectacular season which began with the Resurrection of Jesus. On the second and third Sunday we heard post-Resurrection stories from John and then Luke. John's passage contained that wonderful proclamation, "Peace be with you," a peace that can only come from God's benevolent love. Luke's passage contained that all important statement, "Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." In both gifts of peace and understanding of Scripture, disciples are missioned to be witnesses to the world of Christ's redemptive love.

From this Sunday until the conclusion of our Easter Season with the Feast of Pentecost, we are provided Gospel passages from John pre-Passion/Resurrection. This Sunday we have the powerful passage of the Good Shepherd from the tenth chapter. Jesus has just healed the man born blind. That story ended with Jesus confronting the Pharisees about their blindness, a blindness that crippled them from being good shepherds. The shepherd image will serve as an allegory, contrasting Jesus' leadership from that of the Pharisees.

When reflecting on this passage it is important to keep our focus on Jesus as the Good Shepherd rather than us as the sheep. As the Good Shepherd, Jesus reveals to us that his concern for the sheep goes way beyond the calculation of what may be in it for him. This is the ultimate contrast with the Pharisees. Their concern is for themselves, not for those entrusted to their care. We are told, "A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep," and later in another passage, "I will lay down my life for the sheep." We are told this self-sacrificing love is a "command I have received from my Father." In obedience to the Father, Jesus will bring forth salvation through the total gift of self. Jesus reveals two things that are critical for our consideration. First, the total gift of self as shepherd has no parallel in Jewish texts. This is a new revelation that builds on but supersedes the ancient image of shepherd that included Moses and David. Something new is happening with Jesus, his self-understanding, and revelation to humanity. Second, Jesus reveals mutuality with the Father, an intimacy that again goes beyond ancient Jewish understanding. It is his oneness with the Father that forms his self-understanding, and which propels the leap beyond past historical shepherd figures, revealing how close God desires to be to His people.

Jesus will willingly die a violent death but will take his life again because the Father loves him. Jesus will close this important discourse by speaking of his authority. The story that lies ahead will report the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. But these events will not fall upon Jesus like some terrible accident or merely because of the ill will of those who hate and persecute him. It is Jesus' decision, the exercising of his authority, that he will lay down his life and take it again. No one takes it from him. I think a good conclusion is a portion of today's second reading. "Beloved: See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God."



Why are Sunday Masses during Easter Time sometimes known as the Masses for neophytes?
- A:

The heart of the Period of Postbaptismal Catechesis or Mystagogy, the fourth stage of Christian initiation, is the seven Sundays following Easter and ending on Pentecost. They span fifty days, which the Church has long described as one great day of celebration of the Lord’s Resurrection. We honor and guide neophytes by reserving a place for them in the assembly during these liturgies. With alleluias, Scripture accounts of post-Resurrection appearances of the Lord, the Apostles’ proclamation of Christ to the world, and the Eucharistic banquet, these Masses are ideal settings for neophytes to explore and experience their new faith.

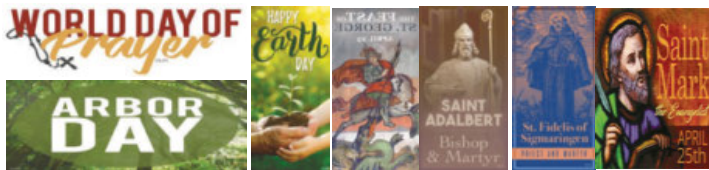

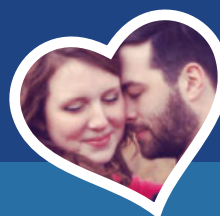
