

The Baptism of the Lord



Dear Believers in the Christ,

Today, we celebrate The Baptism of the Lord. His cousin, John, baptized Jesus in the Jordan River. This baptism initiated Jesus into his public ministry. After this moment in the Jordan, Jesus enters the lives of people to bring healing, forgiveness and peace into people's lives. Jesus becomes the living embodiment of love, the love only the Father can give from his Kingdom of Heaven.

Most people in the Church were baptized as infants. We never understood this transformation, this new life. We have relied on others to witness on our behalf such a transformation. This feast is an opportunity for us to live the mystery of our own baptism. Jesus' life, his passion, death and resurrection, become the life into which we are initiated. We belong to him because of our baptism. We are God's adopted children. We are rich in the presence of Christ Jesus through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in our baptism. God's love is thoroughly within our lives, our bodies and our souls.

Because we belong to God in baptism, then we also belong in the Church. We belong to one another. In baptism, we understand our relationship with one another. The waters of baptism in many ways become thicker and more relational than the blood of our relatives. The unique connection we have within baptism connects us to the lives and needs of other people.

Baptism is not a private sacrament. Baptism is not a sacrament of privilege. Baptism is a radical understanding that we belong to Christ's redeeming love and to the real life world of the Church. We belong to one another. This is why people in the early Church shared their gifts, their money and their goods. Baptism is an equalizer. Baptism does not put one person on a pedestal.

This year, we celebrate the Lord's baptism without water! During the pandemic, we may have forgotten how much we belong to one another. No matter how much we have been afraid to attend Mass or feel just lonely, we know that through our baptism, we belong to the Church and to one another. This year, we rely on the Holy Spirit to engage our hearts and to heal our misfortunes and our fears of being together in worship. Baptism is engagement with the Holy Spirit to compel us to move into the world to provide peace, healing and kindness.

There are several items used in the ritual of baptism that become images for our Christian lives. Of course, water, becomes an image of washing, cleansing from sin, and initiation into the lives of the community. In water, the old has been washed away. The Light of Christ, a candle given to godparents, becomes an image of life, of renewal and hope for the child or adult who is baptized. The light reveals Christ when darkness covers our path. The white garment is also given to a child. This garment may be the white gown or clothing worn. This garment, however, is really important. It signifies that we are clothed in Christ Jesus. The garment found in the empty tomb becomes the garment we all wear. This garment is revealed again in the pall at our funerals, that we are all one in Christ. We are one in the Mystery of Heaven here on earth.

In today's gospel, Mark 1:7-11 we hear the voice of God the Father, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." This is a profound sentence for every Christian under heaven. We are sons and daughters of our loving God. We belong to Him. We are cherished and given new life in Christ Jesus. Pray this sentence with love this week. Pray this sentence because our lives depend upon such grace and tenderness.

Reflection

“You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.” (Mark 1:11)

This small sentence is one of the very few times that God the Father directly speaks to anyone within the New Testament. This particular comment is found in the baptism stories of Jesus in three of the gospels. God also says basically the same thing at the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:5).

[The only other time God the Father speaks in the New Testament is in reply to Jesus’ prayer of anguish, just before His Passion begins (John 12: 27-28).]

When something is that rare, and then repeated several times, you can tell it is of some significance. We are told directly from the heavens above that Jesus is the beloved Son of God.


And it is significant as well because it harkens back to another famous and repeated line: God says, “It was very good,” at the end of each day of creation in Genesis. Just as the breath of God moved over the waters at the beginning of the story of Creation, so did the heavens open up and the Spirit descend upon Jesus in the Jordan River at the beginning of His earthly ministry.

The message is clear: through the Son, God re-creates the world. And through our baptism, we ourselves have become a new creation, and, most importantly, we have also become the beloved children of God.

Update on the St. André Meeting House

We continue to work on the pre-construction steps for the renovation of the old rectory into the St. André Meeting House. We completed design development drawings and submitted those to the Diocese for approval in November 2020. Preliminary project costs are \$1.25 million for ADA bathrooms and new meeting space upstairs and downstairs. With "next-step" Diocesan approvals in hand, bidding for construction will occur this spring. We will request parish approval, and final Diocesan approvals to proceed in May of 2021. If we stay on-track and complete a successful Capital Campaign, the parish will celebrate the St. André Meeting House throughout the 2021 Christmas season.

As of Dec. 17, 2020, the current figures for our parish are as follows:


Sacred Heart Church- \$27,763 pledged, 12% of \$145,458 goal collected;

When I look at the two pictures above of Christmas 2019 and Christmas 2020, I can't help but think of all that we don't have. I look at the picture of Christmas 2019 and see so much joy, and happiness and anticipation of Christmas. I see families and little children. I see people smiling and happy. I see people packed so tightly into the church that they are actually touching, shoulder to shoulder, in the pews. I see the picture of 2019 and I remember what it was like to be that way, so care-free, so excited to share our faith with each other.

I see the picture of Christmas 2020 and I am saddened. Hundreds of people from the year before are whittled down to 50 people with masks in place, sitting 6 feet apart. Looking at that picture, all of the joy is gone. The weight of the pandemic is felt. People are solemn, scared.

I look at these two pictures and I think "What a difference a year makes." To go from such joy to such sadness in only a year. I was thinking all of these things when on Christmas day my husband randomly shared "I know a lot of people say how awful 2020 was, but 2020 has been the best year of my life." Stunned, I asked him, "Why?" "This year I got to see my wife and daughter more than I ever would if the pandemic hadn't happened." he replied.

Suddenly, a different perspective! In all of my sullenness about the differences of Christmas 2019 and 2020, a bright light shined through. What was awful to me, was wonderful to someone else. Indeed, what a difference a year makes, but also what a difference a little perspective gives.

As we embrace 2021, let's not forget that although things may not be "back to normal" yet, there is so much good in the world and much to be thankful for. One day we will be able to pack the church again, sitting shoulder to shoulder, fearless of the virus that changed everything. Until then, don't lose hope. Don't lose faith. Try to change your perspective. After all, what a difference a year makes.


