



A View from the Front Desk



Have you ever felt like Job, who in our first reading talks about his restlessness, his waiting, and being without hope? Longing for happiness and only succumbing to misery? Certainly, like in the experiences of Job, these days can be fraught with anxiety that can wear heavy on our souls. We can feel the drudgery of being tossed about by trying to keep up to date with the newest COVID alerts, protocols, violence, and school schedules. Our readings today provide a remedy of sorts to Job and us, when life appears to be chaotic and uncertain.

Fortunately, as brothers and sisters in Christ, we have that which anchors us in hope, mitigates our anxieties and secures our footing along the path. Today, we can find our anchor in the Scriptures.

First, we begin with Psalm 147, in which we hear how the Lord rebuilds, gathers, and calls each of us by name, how there is no limit to God's mercy and that God will sustain the lowly. These are words of encouragement and conviction that God cares for his Creation and will heal the wounds of the brokenhearted. For Job and for us, these words can be a source of comfort that sustains in times of doubt. These words and actions of the Lord also empower us, not only to accept the grace of God, but also as a call for us to animate those words and actions for others. Next, this call is reinforced by today's second reading from St. Paul to the Corinthians, where he maintains that all that he does is for the "sake of the Gospel." We, like St. Paul, are obligated to make the Gospel known to others by our words and actions. When we wear hope instead of fear, the light of Christ becomes brighter for others to see and experience. Finally, in the Gospel from Mark, Jesus demonstrates the mercy and healing power of touch for Simon's mother-in-law. There is also another message. Jesus plainly states that to "preach" is the "purpose for which I have come." Sounds good for Jesus, but surely not for me, Lord! We may not see our call as going from village to village preaching the word of God. However, can you envision talking with family or friends about the way God has moved in your life? Or how reading a passage in Scripture can bring peace and calm? Or how a particular homily has moved or challenged you? Or how about just praising Jesus for the beauty of the mountains and sky? It can start simply by a kind smile—that lies underneath your mask—and ends as light seen and received by others through your eyes!

I have the privilege of being in the Parish Office as the new Parish Receptionist. I interact with a variety of people, either on the phone or those who stop by the office. Everyday brings an opportunity for me to wear that light for others and an obligation to do so, even when I am not feeling up to it. Sometimes that light is rejected and sometimes it is gratefully received. Whichever the case, I know that God provides the grace to animate that light and all I need to do is participate in that action. Like Job, I can give myself over to discouragement and doubt or consciously choose to put my energy into selecting a piece of Scripture that can lighten my day. Is Scripture the total answer? Perhaps not, but it can provide the inspiration and guidance I need during those Job-like times. Let Jesus' purpose become part of your purpose. Give it a try and let me know how it works for you.

Reflection

So I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me. (Job 7)

Job's words might well be our anthem these days. The virus has brought all of us months of misery, anxiety, and isolation, cut off from our previous lives. And I don't know about you, but even my dreams have been more vivid to me lately. (Yet I know that they're still dreams because in them no one is wearing masks or social distancing!)

Job, in his state of misery, says, "I shall not see happiness again." After all, he has lost his home, his family, and his health. How do you console that kind of loss? Job's friends try to, but they only wind up making things worse by trying to explain why things happened the way they did or by suggesting what Job should do next.

Trying to help solve each other's problems is not always as helpful as it sounds. Sometimes, the best thing to do is just listen. Allow others to share their grief and loss, and just let them know that they are being heard, that they have a friend who is listening.

God always listens patiently to our complaints. In return, we might just try listening to God more closely as well. What is God trying to tell us when we feel lonely and abandoned? Maybe God is telling us how much we long to be loved, how much we need to remain in God's embrace?

As with Job, I believe our lives will again be restored to us, that an end will come to our sufferings under this current plague. And like Job, we should always pray, "The LORD gives and the LORD takes away; blessed be the name of the LORD!"

We are happy to announce that we have increased seating for the Masses at Sacred Heart Church and the Parish Center Gym. Example: If you are registered at Sacred Heart but have donated to the OLPH Ramp project, you must also request a statement from OLPH.

IRA Distribution: IRA donations will not be on the contribution statement. A letter was sent thanking you for the donation when the donation was received by the Parish office. If you did not receive a letter or have misplaced your letter, please contact the Parish Office, 633-8711.

Online Giving: You must log into online giving to receive your statement. Follow these instructions: 1) Log into your online account. 2) Select "My Online Giving History" 3) Click the print button on the page. 4) Enter the desired date range and change the type of report to "Full Detail Report." 5) Print

OLPH Ramp Project Update:

OLPH is proud to announce that so far we have raised **\$88,327.72** through a combination of donations and a grant for our fund drive to raise money for the addition of a new ramp and deck, ADA compliant restroom and grotto restoration at the mission church. The project will cost around \$190,000. OLPH met and exceeded their goal to collect \$60,000 by Jan. 2021!

Returning God's Gifts Annual Appeal

The Returning God's Gifts (RGG) Appeal is a campaign that reminds Catholics that we are part of the larger Church and not just a local parish. When all parishes work together to provide support to diocese-wide ministries and services throughout Southern Colorado, we accomplish together what we cannot do alone.

The overall goal of the appeal is \$2.5 million. It has been reduced from previous years due to a reorganization and reduction of staff and offices at the Pastoral Center, as well as restructuring of the Appeal ministries and reporting requirements. Parishes will no longer receive an automatic 20% rebate when they reach their goal. Instead, parishes are invited to apply for grants to grow and strengthen their ministries and/ or programs and to provide supplemental funding for building and maintenance initiatives. 100% of any donations a parish collects over

their goal will be returned to the parish.

The goal for Sacred Heart Church is \$84,896, the goal for Our Lady of Perpetual Help is \$8,128, and the goal for Holy Rosary Chapel is \$8,494 for a parish total of \$101,518. Our parish goal is 100% participation in the RGG Appeal.

The RGG theme, "For the Glory of God" (1 Cor 10:31), brings life and meaning to our discipleship in its truest sense. When we glorify God through our words and actions, we reveal Jesus Christ to others. Through your continued support, you demonstrate your commitment to evangelization, formation for future priests and deacons, assistance for the most vulnerable, growth of youth and Hispanic ministries, promotion of the dignity of the human person, and to many other ministries.

The Returning God's Gifts Annual Appeal helps provide the funding necessary for the important ministries and programs within our Diocese by supporting three pillars: Know God, Love God and Serve God.

By Knowing God, we support Campus Ministry/ The Newman Student Center, Catholic School Tuition Assistance, Evangelization, Safe Environment Training, Young Adult Ministry, and Youth Ministry.

By Loving God, we support continuing Education for Clergy, Diaconate Formation, Pastoral Formation, Seminarian Formation, and Training of Catechists.

By Serving God, we support the Capuchin Mall Ministry, Catholic Charities, Catholic School Support Grants, Hispanic Ministry, Parish Support Grants, Partners In Housing, Prison Ministry, and the Respect Life Ministry.

Some of these ministries provide services beyond the scope of individual parishes and some exist for the sole purpose of assisting parishes in their own missions to teach, evangelize and serve. The appeal encourages participation from every Catholic household to uphold the mission of Jesus Christ in each parish for our local Church and allows us, as one faith community, to fulfill God's call to discipleship by sharing the Gospel message in word and deed, serving each other with mercy and love.

There are many ways to give to the 2021 Diocesan Annual Appeal:

Monthly Pledges: Many people feel that they can participate at a sacrificial gift level if they make payments over a period of time. This option enables them to work within their budget and, often times, to be more generous in their gift-giving. We currently work with monthly and onetime pledges. Donors who make a pledge will receive monthly reminders, unless they have set up a recurring gift with their debit, credit or checking account.

One-Time Gift: If donors prefer, a one-time gift can be paid at the time of commitment, or a commitment can be made and then paid by December 31, 2021.

Electronic Giving: We accept the following credit/ debit cards (MasterCard, Visa and Discover) as well as direct debit payments. Electronic giving can be completed in three ways: 1) Online giving is available through our diocesan website at www.diocs.org. Click on "GIVE NOW." 2) Donor can provide credit card information and authorization on their pledge card (located on remit envelopes in pews and at the bottom of all solicitation letters). 3) Visit Sacred Heart Parish's website www.sacredheartcos.org and click on the link.

Matching Gifts: Many companies have a Matching Gift Program for charity or educational purposes. The donor will need to contact their company to ensure they have completed the necessary application and procedures.

Gifts of Appreciated Stocks, Securities or QCDs: Federal tax law may allow a charitable deduction for the full market value of securities on the date of a gift.
