

Dear Followers of Jesus Christ,

Today's gospel Mark 9:2-10, reveals the Transfiguration of Jesus to his disciples and to our lives now. I love this gospel and this moment, always on the Second Sunday of Lent, when Jesus pulls back the veil and lets his disciples in on a secret. Jesus wants to show the disciples that he has the Father's authority in his ministry on earth.

First of all, Jesus tugs at their sleeves and invites them with him high on a mountain by themselves. As we understand living in Colorado, just going higher up the mountain is itself a transfiguration. Elevation brings a greater perspective; we can see things differently with a view from a higher elevation.

So, all of a sudden, his clothing becomes white, dazzling white as the gospel says. Elijah and Moses appear to them. The disciples are being totally overwhelmed with joy. They now have a sense of Jesus' authority and they find themselves belonging in this incredible religious history. They tell Jesus how cool this moment really is and

they want to build some tents there so they can hang out with the prophets from ages past.

Then something greater happens. A voice from a cloud opens up in their ears and in their hearts. This voice says, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Wow. This must have been so spectacular to the disciples. We have lost just how marvelous this scene is on our Lenten journey. We can't ignore this anymore. So, let's push the pause button and dive more deeply into this moment with the disciples.

Jesus desired to draw the disciples into the inner circle of love of the Trinity. This is also where we are headed in this Lenten season if we take our faith seriously. Revealing the Trinity to the disciples opens the door to the *authority* of Jesus to continue to his cross and ultimately to his resurrection. Our despair, our anxieties, our stubbornness, our hatred, and every aspect of our lives is being invited into the life of Jesus Christ. His authority heals us. We are also bearers of the mystery of the Trinity through our baptism. We are baptized, "In the name of Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." We must believe that Jesus has authority within us, within our human actions, to heal our sin and divisions. In other words, we are let in on a secret on this Second Sunday of Lent, along with the disciples, that if we, too, follow Jesus, he will lead us into a glorious relationship with the Holy Trinity.

Jesus invites us to hear his voice and follow him. One of the most important aspects of being a disciple of Jesus Christ is that we can listen to him still. The sacred Trinity resides within us through baptism. We find Jesus' voice through the gift of the scriptures, especially within the gospels. We can listen to him lead us into places of love, into forgiveness, into his heart through the stories, parables, and images of these holy writings. We can also listen most carefully to the voice of Jesus Christ in our silence and in our self-giving in prayer. His voice leads us well beyond our ego. Our stubbornness is not the place where his voice comes through us. Our self-hatred and our hatred toward others is not where the voice of love enters our hearts. It is interesting that so often we resist such a silence in God because we can easily resist Him. Our egos are strong and we can be so hardened toward how he desires to be with us. Jesus took his disciples up a mountain so that they could hear for themselves the voice of the Father. Jesus claims his place within our lives through Easter and through our baptism.

Jesus invites his disciples to go down the mountain and to get to work. I believe Jesus in this moment was teaching the disciples to put love into practice. He was embracing his Father's love for us in the world and showing us that in order to believe in Him, we must get to work lifting up the soreness of the world, the lack of encouragement to forgive one another. Love changes everything. The only problem is that most people think God only condemns them. I hear this all the time in my ministry. I hear such things as: I am not good enough or I am not worthy enough or I am not faithful enough or I am not pious enough or I am not holy enough. My prayer in this Lenten season is that all believers could put away these negative stories about their own lives and listen to the voice of Jesus leading us into the heart of the Father. The thoughts, the beliefs, the unworthiness of every believer is transfigured in love during this Lenten season.

Reflection

This week's second reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans (Rom 8:31b-34) works like an episode of *Law & Order: Salvation Unit*.

Our attorney, Paul, begins the case by asking rhetorically, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" He uses precise legal terminology: "Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us, who will condemn?"


It seems that we are on trial for our sins, and the court of Judgment is presided over by God. But the witness for the defense is God's Only Son, Jesus Christ. And both the Witness and the Judge are on our side, while the prosecutor doesn't even show up to court!

Paul's argument is that no matter what our sins are, we have a God who is always on our side, and that Christ Jesus, "who also is at the right hand of God... indeed intercedes for us."

In the passage that follows, Paul goes on to ask, "What will separate us from the love of Christ?" (Rom. 8:35a) The obvious answer is "nothing." We are acquitted, we are forgiven, we are loved. Just as Isaac was spared by Abraham in our first reading from Genesis, so we are spared by Christ, who was sacrificed for our sake.

Lent encourages us to repent of our sins, to turn away from selfishness, but it also encourages us to remember that our sentence will be set at forgiveness, as long as our defense is the love of Christ.

The Chapel at the Newman Student Center is open!

The dedication ceremony of the St. John Henry Newman Chapel at the Newman Catholic Student Center on the campus of UCCS was celebrated on Saturday, February 20. Fr. Kyle Ingels, Director of Campus Ministry, celebrated the first Mass with all the students last Sunday. The Chapel dedication was the first of several small blessings and ceremonies the Diocese is planning in order to meet current restrictions leading to a grand opening this summer when they hope restrictions will be lifted. While the overall Newman Catholic Student Center is still receiving final construction touches, the important part is that the students are finally able to celebrate and worship together in their own sacred space.



The Diocese continues to raise funds to pay for the \$7,500,000 student center project. To date they have collected \$4,877,472 of the \$6,630,104 pledged. Each of our three churches is responsible for helping to raise funds by meeting our individual goals over a three-year span of **\$145,458 for Sacred Heart Church, \$18,211 for Holy Rosary Chapel, and \$15,401 for OLPH**. Lenten Reflection by the Bowsky Family

Create a clean heart in me, O God.



In our home we share the chore of cleaning dishes. We flip flop between our daughter Mikayla, son Jameson, and the two of us. I've sometimes wondered if the dishes had a say in the matter, would they simply choose to avoid the constant burden of getting cleaned and re-used, over and over again? Sometimes I feel like that dish. I'd like to get it over with, once and for all, be clean, and be done. No more cleaning. But if I ask God to cleanse me, and then demand this be an instantaneous affair— no time required, no time given— then I know I'm being disingenuous.

When I think of time, I feel the Lord speaking to my heart about the many distractions we face everyday, some minor, some severe. We have this mountain of things *happening to us* like the pandemic, tragic loss, political unrest, the sacrifice of everything we once called normal. Then, standing nearby, not nearly as high, but certainly just as influential (if we're being honest with ourselves), we have this hill of things we *choose* to distract us, to add to the noise, numb the pain, or just help us get by. Food, possessions, media, these things in our pockets that demand attention one notification after another. Yet I feel the gentle tugging on my heart by the Holy Spirit, shifting my eyes to eternity, and what that means about how I live my life here and now.

Speaking of the here and now, why have a clean heart at all? I mean what's the point? Because "you are the light of the world"— Matthew 5:14. And what wonderful imagery. No one, no one at all, when asked to think of a light, say firelight, thinks first of what it consumes... wax, wick, or wood. Never. When you close your eyes and imagine firelight, you're drawn into that inviting warmth on a cold winter night that we're so familiar with in Colorado, or the beautiful flickering light pushing away the darkness on all sides. *That*, is what we are in Christ. Known not by what we consume, but what we give. We are known by our fruit.

So what distractions of choice are crippling your thirst for a clean heart... your thirst for Christ Himself, Lover of our souls? What are you consuming that's eating up the precious time that God would otherwise use to cleanse you? This Lenten season is a treasured part of the liturgical year challenging you to take these questions, and those like them, out of the church pew you sit in today, and into your homes, into your hearts, and before the throne of God. And when you do, ask God not only for the discernment and wisdom to see the answers, but also the courage to act, to take that first step, then the next one, and the next, on your journey with Christ.


