

Dear Followers of the Christ,

In our gospel, John 3:14-21, we hear the images of darkness and light as we approach these weeks toward the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We also hear that just like Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, the Son of Man will be lifted up, that he will be hung on a cross so that the world may come to know freedom, forgiveness and redemption.


This image of darkness and light is worth our reflection this week. The gospel says that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness instead. In other words, we still have trouble as human beings accepting the message of Christ Jesus. Sometimes we wallow in hatred than in hope. Sometimes we enjoy putting others down rather than lifting them up. Sometimes we shirk the possibilities of hope as we remain stuck in the mud of our self-reliance.

Jesus desires that we follow him from darkness to light. We learn a great deal simply through the images of the Lenten season. We all know what it means to be in the dark, not only on a strange, curvy road in the nighttime aching to make it home safely, but in the dark that keeps us clueless about what our spouse thinks of us or about the argument that has just happened. In the darkness, we miss out on something happening. The same occurs in Lent. We are invited into the mystery of our salvation, but if we prefer the darkness of sin, doubt and chaos, then we are missing out on longing for the person of Christ Jesus. Conversion of heart is the place for our redemption. Conversion of heart is the hope that light will replace darkness. Conversion of heart puts away our cowardice and moves us toward the Light of Christ.

Jesus desires for us the light of forgiveness. Christ's passion, death and resurrection are hope for our world. This is the Paschal Mystery. Our connection to Christ's love is our baptism. This light redeems us and offers us a home in faith, hope and love. Christ's love is also manifest in forgiveness. Forgiveness is never easy for anyone. Forgiveness, however, can create a new world. If we are willing to stand on this earth and learn to take responsibility for our actions and to name our faults when we are wrong toward our neighbor, the love of Christ will flourish. The mercy of Christ Jesus is powerful. The abundant gift of mercy comes to us as balm for our sin, our division, and ill will. The Light of Forgiveness leads us home.

Jesus desires us to become the light of love that we seek. The mission of the Church comes from living out our role through baptism. In our conversion of heart, we are to help others along the way. If there is room in our heart for darkness to be cast away in forgiveness, then we become capable of loving others. We live in a difficult time. We are tempted to constantly blame others for our suffering. We even sometimes think that we are better than others and that they deserve what they get. Instead, we are called into a change of heart. A change of heart rooted in faith that motivates us to live lives of self-giving and genuine purpose. As Christians we are to live as a beacon of hope on the hilltop. By our example, we draw others to Christ Jesus. This is the journey of the Lenten season.

Reflection

By the streams of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion. (Psalm 137:1)

Our psalm today is from an exiled and enslaved people. The Babylonians had destroyed all of Judah and had torn down the walls of their temple in Jerusalem. They took many prisoners back to the city of Babylon. But even there, the descendants of Abraham could not forget their God and their Promised Land.

We are not exiled from our homes. Instead we have been nearly imprisoned within them for the past year! But how many times have you and I remembered our previous lives and yearned for the freedom to travel, to visit with others, to gather together in large numbers, as at church? We look back and ask the Lord to restore us to our former condition. Like the Jews in exile, we cry out, "Let our tongues be silenced if we ever forget!"

God's people in exile did indeed return to their homeland, as our first reading tells us. And we ourselves, when enough people can receive any of the vaccines, will soon get back to some version of our previous lives.

But like the returning Jews, will we be changed by our experience? They rebuilt the temple and recommitted themselves to God's Covenant. For us, what will be different? Will we be more aware of the needs of our brothers and sisters? Will we appreciate our absent family and friends more? Will we be more compassionate to those who performed what before we may have considered simple tasks, like grocery and cleaning services? Will we be more grateful for our healthcare workers and those who provide essential services? Will we more willingly provide for the needs of the least of all our brothers and sisters around us, especially the poor and homeless?

The Jews were changed during their exile when they saw that God was still with them. Have we seen God at work among us? How will the pandemic change us?



Opening Scripture passages:

Cor 3:13 Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.

Eph 4:32 Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

John Paul II: "We are not the **sum of our weaknesses and failures**, we are the **sum** of the Father's love for us and **our** real capacity to become the image of His Son Jesus."

A few weeks ago Father Randy told us about how his parents made him and his siblings ask for forgiveness and give forgiveness as children.

Our parents have had us do the same. Our parents have us say, "I'm sorry for X, please forgive me." And then the other one needs to say "I forgive you" and not "it's okay" or "it wasn't a big deal."

Our parents ask us for their forgiveness as well.

One of the most powerful ways the Lord has worked in my life is through forgiveness, whether it's asking for forgiveness from my wife and asking for forgiveness from my children for ways that I have offended them. It has helped us grow in love for each other and for the Lord.

When you know someone really well or have had them in your life for a long time, it can be easy to let resentment and annoyances grow, to develop baggage or a history with that person. Even if you love them very much. It can be very tempting to want to hold on to our hurt or anger. It gives us power and some sense of control or armor against the hurt.

These moments of forgiveness cut off the string of resentment when it is working. It is the daily (sometimes more than once a day) creating of a clean heart. Acting like a new creation. Giving our loved ones the mercy that has been given to us.

The kind of reconciliation that Jesus offers is the kind that blots out our offense. That doesn't remember it. It's not like he crosses out the sins once he forgives them, but erases them such that they are not on the list anymore.

Psalms 103:12 as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

Asking for forgiveness can be hard. Giving forgiveness can be hard. Accepting forgiveness can be the hardest.

Sometimes we focus on the hard instead of the love that makes the hard possible. Love cleanses and fills and heals – create in me a clean heart and put a steadfast spirit within me could be translated as "by the power of the spirit give me your love oh Lord that I may love as you love."

1 Peter 4:8: Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.

May the Lord bless us during this Lent as we prepare to celebrate his resurrection.

During the season of Lent, it is important for us to "tune up" our faith, taking some time to renew ourselves through prayer, meditation and education. By deepening our knowledge and understanding of faith, we are often better attuned to its richness and meaning for our life.

Lent is an intense retreat, a forty-day period of reflection and penance that prepares us to celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of Christ. Our communication with God and our awareness of him is the purpose of prayer. Setting aside extra time each day helps intensify the season. Prayer includes daily Mass, Stations of the Cross, communal penance services and private confession. Making restitution for sin as well as disciplining our hearts and minds to focus on God is the purpose of penance. It helps us restore a sense of balance to our souls, thrown off kilter by sin. Penance includes personal sacrifice, self-denial, fasting, almsgiving and charitable works.

Finally, spiritual practices help us sharpen our understanding and insight into the meaning and understanding of our faith. When you take your faith seriously, you do what is necessary to follow Jesus more closely, to integrate your life and your faith more carefully.


