Dear Followers of Jesus,

This year we will celebrate Triduum 2021 with simplicity. According to guidelines from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the liturgies for these sacred days are to remain simple and limited in ritual in order to follow safety protocols during the pandemic.

On Holy Thursday, April 1 at 5:30 pm, we will not wash feet or have any processions. There will be no altar servers and no Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. We will continue to celebrate the Eucharist with the bare bones as we have in this past year, including no hymns and with safe distancing.

On Good Friday, April 2 at 3 pm, we will not have the Veneration of the Cross, but we will adore the cross in our seats as a community. We must continue this year with safety precautions.

On Holy Saturday, April 3 at 8 pm, we will not bless a new fire outdoors, but we will bless the Paschal Candle in the church. We will proclaim only three Old Testament scriptures and we will not bless ourselves with Holy Water. The same safety precautions will override much of this sacred liturgy this year.

Unfortunately, in this year of pandemic, our numbers are still limited for in-person prayer. Perhaps, watching the live-stream on our website may increase our desire to live our faith in the world, but nothing really takes the place of worshipping with others in Holy Week. At least this year, we can actually celebrate Holy Week with people unlike last year.

As Holy Week begins, the scriptures of Palm Sunday reveal to us a feast of the senses. We hear the crowd singing, "Hosana!" They push their way through a crowd to see Jesus. We listen to a woman break open an alabaster jar of oil to anoint the feet of the Lord. We can almost smell the healing of that outpouring of devotion. We take into our hearts the reverence and love of her longing for Jesus. We hear the whispers of betrayal. We can recognize them within our own lives. We can almost smell the bread Jesus breaks for his disciples and we can nearly taste the wine he shares in his desire for communion with us.

There is the cross on Jesus' shoulders as he bears the weight of our lives and sins. We feel the confusion of the disciples to stay awake in the garden and the weight of their fear and potential grief even in our sleepy eyes. We can hear the lots being cast for Jesus' garments. We sense the sky darken and the world waiting for something new to happen. We smell the dead body being carried to the grave. We feel the weight of the stone being rolled over the tomb. We all understand what it means to wait and long for new life.

I invite you into these important moments in our liturgical year even if you must pray at home. The events of this week remain vital for the growth of faith within our lives and the survival of the Church and of our community.

Holy Week liturgies are not only about the past. These liturgies help us see that God's work continues in and through us. Grace is active in our lives. God is still redeeming the world in every action of our lives, how we think and perceive, what we stand for, and the commitments that we live in the world. God's grace is acting upon our world so that we may all turn to Christ Jesus and know him as our Savior and Redeemer.

Holy Week liturgies surround us with the big story of our salvation. This meaningful journey is far deeper than our own daily routines or even the hopes we carry deep within our hearts. This story helps us make sense out of our suffering, the turmoil of our relationships and the illusions out of which we live. Faith transforms us. Faith is lived with a deep and passionate relationship with Jesus Christ.

Holy Week outlines our relationship with Christ, that we die to ourselves and live in him. Jesus is the container of meaning for us, not politics or our national parties, not where we went to high school or the cool car we drive. The container of our lives is the Paschal Mystery, where we can live far beyond the limits that we put on ourselves.

Holy Week frees us from the fear of change and even death. We believe that Jesus prepares a home for us in heaven. Holy Week forms our lives, our hearts, our consciences, so that we will recognize our path in Jesus Christ. He prepares for us a place far beyond this earth and he will come back to bring us home with him. Meanwhile, we learn to live his love by lifting up people who most need us on earth.

Holy Week is a blueprint for us to follow and trace over again in our earthly lives, even during a pandemic, all the way home to his side.

Reflection

When Jesus announced in Mark's gospel today that one of the disciples would betray Him, each of them questioned, one by one, "Surely it is not I?"

Even though they were Jesus' faithful companions, they could not be sure. They wondered whether they would buckle under the pressure of the Jewish leaders and the Roman government, who both were trying to silence Jesus.

Over the course of the days that were to come, we discovered that Judas was the one who betrayed Jesus, and who despaired of it by killing himself. But Peter also denied knowing Jesus while He was on trial, and Thomas later doubted that Jesus had risen from the dead. In fact, all of the disciples abandoned Jesus immediately after the crucifixion, except for the few faithful women who stayed by the Cross and visited the tomb soon after.

Thankfully, except for Judas, all of Jesus' disciples were reconciled to the Risen Christ and eventually became great apostles for the Church.

How might any of us turn away from God in acts of selfishness, lust, or anger? None of us know the ways in which we might betray, deny, or abandon our faith in Jesus. Yet, as with the disciples, we are assured that the offer of forgiveness is always available.

Holy Week gives us the opportunity, especially through the sacrament of reconciliation, to be reconciled to Christ as Peter and the other disciples were. We may not know when or how we may each betray our Lord next, but we are convinced that Jesus will always call us back to Him in love and in mercy.

more sensitive to the disadvantaged, poor and marginalized. We invoke God's name when we want victory and keep silence when it comes to global solidarity. We talk out of both sides of our mouths too, looking only to what works or suits us at the time and leaving the rest. There exists in each one of us a person who hails our King with hosannas and a person who is all too willing to choose Jesus over Barabbas for the cross. Something to think about this Holy Week!

St. André Meeting House Project Update

We are moving forward with three aspects of the Meeting House project to renovate the old rectory next to Sacred Heart Church. The first aspect develops construction drawings and some firm bids for the work. We hope for completion of the drawings and bids in mid-May. The second aspect cleans up asbestos issues in the interior of the building. Construction of the north addition in the mid 1900's included several products containing asbestos. That part of the demolition must come first before we move on to other tasks. *Asbestos abatement on the old rectory has begun and will take several weeks to complete.* Please be careful of any construction equipment on the sidewalk around the old rectory. Lastly, we contracted to develop a design for the parking lot including some new fencing, curb, and gutter. This design includes asphalt and new striping throughout.

These steps will position us to present to the parish a solid plan this spring for construction and completion of the Meeting House by Christmas of 2021. It will also allow us to ask for some firm bids for the parking lot renovation. Soon we will start a Capital Campaign to raise funds for the project. We thank you for your patience and support with this project. We can't wait to have a shared meeting space with restrooms and accessibility for all!



Hello to our Sacred Heart family. We are Elisabeth and Corey Almond and have three children— Lucas (age 17), Anna (age 15), and Leo (11). Like the families before us, we have been asked to speak on the topic of a clean heart.

To be totally honest— and many of you who know me, know this could be exciting!— this has been a hard year. And, for me, most days a clean heart has been hard to come by. Luckily I have teenagers who also have lots of thoughts and ideas. Through my older two I was introduced to a rap song that I have come to love, “Blessings” sung by Chance the Rapper and Jamila Woods. In the song they sing:

I'm gon' praise Him, praise Him 'til I'm gone

When the praises go up, the blessings come down

It seems like blessings keep falling in my lap

These lyrics struck me because it became so clear that whether I wanted to clean my heart or not, God was going to do it anyway. It seems like blessings keep falling in my lap.

The days that I can't see the blessings or give the praise, I fall back on this lyric:

He has ordered my steps, gave me a sword with a crest

And gave Donnie a trumpet in case I get shortness of breath

When the praises go up, the blessings come down

I don't know about you all, but I've had a lot of Donnies helping me out over the last year when I got too short of breath to see. I work as a nurse practitioner in a rural health clinic. My patients are already isolated by location and circumstance, and it's been hard this past year witnessing their fear, anger, and very solo existence. The blessing that keeps falling in my lap— making my heart clean— is the COVID vaccine. As a clinic, we have been given the opportunity to distribute this miracle to the eastern plains. My clinic is tiny with only six exam rooms, no fish tank in the waiting room and probably ten parking spots.

The day we started giving out the vaccine, all of the staff parked at the Family Dollar Store next to the clinic and began receiving patients one by one for the vaccine. They lined up outside, elderly people who had missed each other and their daily meetups for a donut and coffee at the gas station, or a Pepsi together at noon when the cafe opens. They lined up with their masks on, distance in place, oxygen canisters, canes and wheelchairs. After filing inside and getting the shot, we placed them in chairs (6 feet apart, of course!) in our halls, offices, break room and they talked. They talked and talked and brought us cookies and pizza and cakes and flowers and cards. The joy and gratitude of what has been normal— being together, community, a vaccine— has been a great blessing and moments I look forward to. These people filing in have been my Donnie, reminding me that He has ordered my steps, given me a sword with a crest and blowing the trumpet when I got short of breath.


