


Take it; this is My body. June 6, 2021

Dear Followers of the Christ,

During this year of pandemic, we have all learned a great deal about food. At times, we have not been able to share a meal indoors with family and loved ones at a restaurant. We have been alone for many holidays that normally are brimming with food, drink and conversation. We have all watched on television or on the internet the long lines of people waiting for food distribution in various parts of the country. Many people who have never asked for food before, have been in those meandering lines because they lost jobs during this past year. We have also witnessed on various social media platforms many people who have served food to others, especially celebrity chefs who have given away their own money in order to feed people. We have learned much about food insecurity and hunger across the globe during our shut-in months from our global pandemic. Issues of food are still everywhere.

We have also been distant from the Eucharist. Many people have not received communion in over a year. Many folks miss the Real Presence, and many have given up on returning. The Eucharist that we celebrate today is food for today, for tomorrow, and for all eternity. We celebrate today, the Body and Blood of Christ, commonly referred to as Corpus Christi. This is our real food.

Today's gospel, Mark 14: 12-16, 22-36, brings us into the tight quarters of the Upper Room. On the night before Jesus died, Jesus gathered those he had chosen to share a meal. In this intimate setting, Jesus shared his desire to be with his disciples forever. It was a meal unlike anything the disciples had shared before. In the midst of sharing a meal, he broke bread with them and told them he would be in the world forever. He held a cup of wine and repeated such empowering words. Through his suffering, his death and resurrection, he would remain always as food for people in despair, in loss and in the joy of life here on earth.

In the context of the meal in the Upper Room, something else happened. He also took a basin and washed the feet of those who were with him. This act of generosity, of service, of extending the meal to help people is the beginning of sharing the actions of prayer and service. This action is key in the mission of the Church. The Eucharist is not just a meal or offering in the church sanctuary, but the Mass becomes a way of life for every Christian.

We have celebrated forms of this mystery throughout the world ever since the Upper Room. As we lift up the Body of Christ at the altar, we also lift up those who are hungry for God, the sick, the lonely, and the tormented. As we lift up the Blood of Christ, we lift up those who sip the Cup of Salvation who are longing for sobriety, for release of doubt and sin and for a new sense of belonging. The Eucharist is action among us, transforming our hearts into the message of love that is the Kingdom of God. This Kingdom is right now, here before us on earth.

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is not a personal piety alone. This feast celebrates us on earth since we are also named the Body of Christ through our baptism. We, as Church, are witness to what we celebrate at Mass. We also become what we celebrate. The Church challenges us to live this mystery as a people redeemed in love. We are the Body of Christ and we break open our lives in service and in integrity for other people, just as the host is broken to be shared among us. The Eucharist makes sense when the poor are fed, when the sinner is forgiven and when the oppressed find justice. The Eucharist makes sense when we are all brought into communion, into unity with God and one another.

While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it.

Reflection

We've been on a roll of great feasts lately, four in a row! Ascension, Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and now today is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. The Church makes sure each year that our joyous celebration continues even after the Easter season ends.

For both Easter Sunday and for Pentecost, I wrote here about the sequences, or songs, connected with these two feast days, and today I will do the same for Corpus Christi.

Today's sequence is called *Lauda Sion*, or "Praise Zion." My favorite stanza is this one:

*Thousands are, as one, receivers,
One, as thousands of believers,
Eats of Him who cannot waste.*

Although at Mass many consume the Eucharist, we always do so as one. The sacrament is called "communion" precisely because it was never intended to be a private pious act alone. When we receive the host, even if we do so from an extraordinary minister of the Eucharist while sick at home or in a hospital bed, we are never truly alone. The entire community of the Church receives the Body of Christ with us, in each instance that we receive it ourselves.

And the last line of this stanza refers to "Him who cannot waste." Christ is consumed, but never exhausted. He is broken, but never divided. He is shared, but never diminished in any way. In fact, when it comes to celebrating the Eucharist, the more we break the bread, the greater the loaf becomes. The story of the sharing of the loaves and fishes is not just Biblical history, but the miracle of multiplication continues to this day.

We celebrate the Body of Christ because we ARE the Body of Christ, thousands together as one. As we receive Him, so do we join together to become the Church, the presence of Christ on earth.

OLPH Ramp Update: The ramp, the grotto, and the bathroom renovation in the Fr. Schultz House should all be completed in time for the Feast Day of Our Lady of Perpetual Help on **Sunday, June 27**. Restore Our Heart Capital Campaign



The next phase of "Restore Our Heart" begins this weekend. The plan since June 2016 has been to, first, restore our church, then, to repurpose the former rectory which hasn't been used in decades, and, finally, to repave the tired parking lot. In Phase 1, the parish focused on renovating the church and in the process transformed this historic structure into a place of unsurpassed beauty and inspiration. You and your fellow parishioners supported the effort by donating \$2.5 million to pay for the project. The final payment on the loan that was used to partially finance the construction will be fully paid off in one more year.

You should have received a letter from Fr. Ron this past week. In it he reaffirms his vision for "Restore Our Heart" and outlines our plans for moving forward with Phase 2. This phase will concentrate on renovating the rectory

and repaving the parking lot. The goals for the rectory are to turn it into St. André House—a much-needed place for the parish community to gather and meet; to create two new classrooms; and, for the first time on the parish grounds, to offer handicapped-accessible restrooms. This part of the project will update and transform a building originally built in 1922. Along with the rectory, Fr. Ron wants to address the parking lot, too. It's well past the time it needed to be repaired and repaved.

The timeline we're working on now anticipates approval from the diocese in July, the beginning of construction in early August, and completion of St. André House and the parking lot by Christmas 2021.

While our cash reserves will cover some of the cost of renovating the rectory and repairing the parking lot, we will need \$1.2 million to finish this phase. We're initiating a capital campaign to raise this money and we hope we can count on you to complete the plan we started with the restoration of the church. The campaign is scheduled to conclude on December 31.



Bill Carter, Tony Cichello, Mike Kestner and John Goddard will be reaching out to as many of you as possible in the coming weeks to see how best you can participate in making this next phase of "Restore Our Heart" happen. Please welcome them when they call. If you are eager to meet with any of them right away, just give them a call by contacting the Parish Office at 719-633-8711 and leaving a message.

Let's look ahead a moment to July 16, 2022, the 100th anniversary of the parish. On that date, we'll have fully restored Sacred Heart Church, opened St. André House, and rejuvenated our parking lot. The church will be fully paid off and we'll amortize the loan for St. André House and the parking lot with the donations from the upcoming capital campaign. Sacred Heart will be ready for whatever changes the future brings!
