

Dear Followers of Jesus,

Today's gospel, Mark 4:26-34, invites us deeper into an image of the Kingdom of God. A small seed becomes a place of shelter, protection and new life for others. If we examine this image of seed as our hearts and lives, we shall awaken to new growth and perspective and even imagination about our lives of faith.

I often hear parents tell me that the summer growth spurts of their children are such a wonderful gift of life to them. They say, "our children are growing like weeds." Our children take on a life of their own, their own identity, their own talents and gifts, and it all happens very quickly, as if during the night such growth happens. Parents seem so delighted that their children become what God is inviting them to be. For some parents, of course, this is a real time of adjustment to let them flourish and to not smother such gifts.

I admit that I also love to see young people with a beginner's mind and a kernel of faith. In the riches of their own hearts, added with naivete, and much grace, young people begin to form a trust that the seed of hope given to them by God will flourish in the world. I adore watching the seed of faith grow and blossom into a life steady on the earth in trust and love.

The seed of faith given to our young needs help to flourish. We all have to trust that the Kingdom of God is at hand in ways we can't even imagine. We cannot grow bitter or angry as elders when we see the gifts of our young people change the world. Allowing a tree to grow takes patience, tenderness and good will. This also takes on our part, the ability to trust God and the next generation. Learning to trust our children is never easy, at least that is what parents tell me since they always want to be the parent of a child whom they have raised and loved.

This image of the Kingdom of God is beautiful and offers us a garden of hope if we can learn to trust in life itself. The Kingdom can sprout up in the most unexpected places. The Kingdom is here even when we are so often blind to the process of life. The Kingdom changes us and what it offers us is a new way of seeing ourselves and the world. This gospel today invites us also into a new way of being in the world. The Kingdom reveals everything, even the smallest seed can grow and influence the world in so many ways. The Kingdom leads to truth, to fidelity, to solid hope, to a life of gratitude. All we have to do is stand back and watch it happen and trust in God who is always restoring life and hope in our world.

Please take some time this week to pray for our children and our children's children. In doing so, we may even see hope spring up in our lives fashioning within us a place where the Kingdom of God will surprise us.

"To what shall we compare the Kingdom of God or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants..."

St. André House Update

The next phase of the "Restore Our Heart" Capital Campaign has begun. The goal is to raise \$1.2 million to repurpose the old rectory into the St. André House and repave the parking lot. The St. André House is a much-needed place for the parish community to gather and meet; to create two new classrooms; and, for the first time on the parish grounds, to offer handicapped-accessible restrooms. The current timeline for the project anticipates approval from the diocese in July, the beginning of construction in early August, and completion of St. André House and the parking lot by Christmas 2021.

We need your financial support to complete this project! Members of the Parish Finance Council will be reaching out to parishioners to ask for their participation in the Capital Campaign. Pikes Peak Ave., Colorado Springs, CO 80904. The campaign will end December 31.

We look forward to our parish's 100th anniversary in July 2022, when we will have fully restored Sacred Heart Church, opened St. André House, and rejuvenated our parking lot! The church will be fully paid off and we'll amortize the loan for St. André House and the parking lot with the donations from the Capital Campaign. Sacred Heart will be ready for whatever changes the future brings! Thank you for your support.

Reflection

My dad loves azaleas. He loves them because they are broad leaf plants that are green all year round and have colorful flowers that bloom for much of the spring. And they grow so well in his yard! He rarely buys azaleas to plant, because he takes branches and roots them in the ground to start a new bush which he then transplants somewhere else in the yard.

In Ezekiel, the Lord God promises to do the same thing with a cedar tree. (I'm not sure that Dad has ever successfully tried rooting a cedar tree, but I don't think God would have any problem with it!) Ezekiel tells us that the shoot will grow into an enormous tree, with birds nesting in its branches.

Ezekiel is talking about the nation of Judah, of course, after the Babylonian exile of the kingdom had begun. He promised, as Isaiah did elsewhere, that a shoot will sprout and that the line of kings over the people of Judah will be restored. This becomes the promise that is eventually fulfilled in Christ, as the King of Kings.

Similarly, in the gospel today Jesus reminds us that our faith is like a tiny seed grows into a large plant. As my dad can do with just a small shoot, God can do great things with seemingly small beginnings. We don't need to plant full grown gardens or transplant large trees, because we know that nature will do most of the work. Likewise, God will do great things through us if we but provide a small beginning.

Our ambition as Christians to build the Kingdom of God on earth does not need to be a grandiose project. We start with small things: forgiving folks who offend us, truly listening to the complaints of those ignored or mistreated by society, assisting those in most need around us, and doing what we can to right the wrongs that have been done to others. We don't have to fix everything wrong with the world, just the stuff right in front of us. God will do great things if we only attempt to begin them.

Food Pantry Update: The Food Pantry has adjusted its service hours on Thursdays to noon– 2 pm and continues service on Mondays from noon– 2 pm. The Food Pantry continues to offer only non-perishable food items. Food Pantry services are available to all. No voucher required.

As a reminder, we DO NOT accept donations of non-perishable food items. We also DO NOT accept donations of baby items. We currently accept donations of food items that we provide in our pre-packed food bags:

Powdered milk (individual or box) Ind' 5 oz -6 oz ; box ~ 15 oz; Dry Cereal 12 oz -18 oz box; Canned protein (chicken, tuna, ham) 5 oz -12 oz cans; Mac-n-cheese 6 oz - 8 oz box; Soup (can or dry) 12 oz -15 oz cans; Canned vegetables 15 oz -18 oz cans; Canned fruit 15 oz -18 oz cans; Dried beans 1/4-1/2 lb bag/ box; Rice (Instant) 8 oz - 12 oz box; Peanut Butter 12 oz - 18 oz; Jelly 12 oz - 18 oz; Raisins small snack size boxes.

OLPH Ramp Construction has begun!

Construction on the Our Lady of Perpetual Help ramp project has begun! The project will provide a handicap accessible ramp to the entrance of the church, allowing everyone access to the church— a much needed improvement! The project will also provide a handicap accessible restroom in the Fr. Schultz house next door and restore the outdoor grotto on the property. The ramp and the grotto should be completed by OLPH's Feast Day on Sunday, June 27th when Bishop Hanifen will join the community for Mass at 5 pm (save the date!).

Although the grounds of the chapel will be a construction zone for some time, we should be able to have Sunday Mass each week as usual.

Postcards were mailed to all parishioners to remind everyone that each dollar given toward our project up to \$45,000 will be doubled by a grant from Catholic Extension. **OLPH needs \$30,000 to complete this project.** Please take advantage of the matching grant we received! Contributions can be dropped in the collection basket at any Mass. Be sure to designate the donation for the "OLPH building fund." 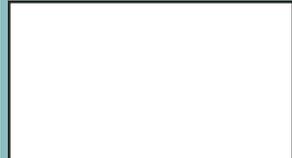
