

Dear Believers,

Mark 6:1-6, today's gospel, invites us to reflect on wisdom. Jesus comes back to his native place and people wonder how he became filled with such ease and authority, with such wisdom. People around Jesus were both astonished at his gift and also afraid of it. They questioned his beginnings. They thought they knew his roots being a carpenter and the son of Mary. They took offense at him because wisdom has a cutting edge. People familiar with Jesus grew jealous because of the gift he was given and his expression of such a gift in the world. People were both curious and afraid. His folks were warmed by his wise heart and at the same time felt the heat of him seeming to be better than others. Wisdom changed many of Jesus' relationships, including those who were closest to him.

Wisdom is challenging to many people. Many folks like mediocrity. Sometimes it seems to be a more comfortable place to be, because to engage in wisdom means change for everyone. So, in the middle of the summer, it is difficult to participate in such a profound gift of wisdom proclaimed by the gospel. Yet, this scripture invites us into such a reflection on this Fourth of July weekend.

We are unshuttering our lives from the pandemic. This weekend, our care about life is flapping in the wind, in a weekend that for many people is carefree, a time away from the daily grind of work. However, we still live with responsibilities of caring for our families and our faith communities and our nation. Our common values are lived not in whim or fancy. They are grounded in love and hope. This is our faith, genuine care and concern for our neighbor and for the real issues of our lives. Wisdom, even on the waning months of a pandemic, remains challenging at best for all of us.

As we celebrate Independence Day, I wonder what it means for us to seek wisdom. For in faith, community means learning an inter-dependence, since the source of wisdom is community. Having a sense of community is a real starting place for many people as we seek our way out of the pandemic. What will community be like now? How will we learn to trust one another? What is it that we all want from our communities? Are we expecting too much? Can we grieve the loss of family gatherings, hugs, handshakes and socializing, all from this past year? How will wisdom form our lives, our churches and our world?

There is much to ponder as we celebrate the Fourth of July. Our common life is deeper than eating hot dogs and lighting sparklers. We have many roads and options to consider. Faith always deepens our lives and broadens our horizons. Wisdom helps us expand our notion of God and how to live in the world. Wisdom broadens our world view, expands our imaginations of caring for the planet, the earth, the sea, and every person under heaven. Wisdom is not a luxury, but a way of believing in God with our lives firmly planted on earth.

Jesus healed people; these were miraculous actions. Jesus continues such awesome wonders.

Reflection

"A thorn in the flesh was given to me, an angel of Satan, to beat me, to keep me from being too elated. Three times I begged the Lord about this, that it might leave me, but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:7-9)

St. Paul's second letter to the Corinthians reveals the most intimate and poignant portrait of Paul's relationship with God. And yet at the same time, reveals no details whatsoever. Paul does not tell us what his thorn is, nor what persistent sin or affliction bothers him. But he tells us only that he begged the Lord to take it away from him, to heal him, to make him sinless.

But the Lord's response was "no." Christ would not remove his sin, his affliction, whatever it was. Instead, God's grace would be enough. Paul needed to depend on God's grace rather than on his own virtue. Christ came to forgive us, not to make our life on earth perfect.

Whenever we have sins we constantly have to confess, habitual problems or personality traits that afflict us, asking for God to take them away is the easy way out. Instead, our strength comes from our weakness. We know that we cannot save ourselves, that we are not God. We rely on the love and forgiveness of our Savior.

Being perfect in virtue is our goal as Christians, but if we should ever accomplish perfect virtue, we would have no need of forgiveness, no need of redemption, no need for Christ. Each time we acknowledge our own "thorns," we thank God for the grace of forgiveness, for our dependence on a loving Savior.

Like Paul, we all have thorns. We humbly accept God's grace and forgiveness, and humbly learn to extend forgiveness to others as well.

June Recap for "Restore Our Heart – Phase II"

Sacred Heart has made a lot of progress since June 5th and 6th when "Restore Our Heart – Phase II" was introduced at all the Masses. The parish's Building Committee met with the Building and Properties Committee of the Diocese on the afternoon of June 22nd. For an hour we reviewed the construction plans for St. André House and discussed why Bob McGrath Construction was selected to renovate the former rectory and repair and repave the parking lot. We also went over in detail how we intend to finance the project, including the capital campaign we initiated a few weeks ago. The next step is for the Finance Committee of the Diocese to review the results of this meeting at their next scheduled meeting during the last week of July. If they endorse our plan, the Bishop will grant final approval. We anticipate that construction will begin in early August.

If the first three weeks of the capital campaign are at all indicative of how you feel about "Restore Our Heart – Phase II," then there is a lot to be excited about! Sixty families have donated and / or pledged \$130,000 towards our goal of \$1.2 million. What an amazing start! We're already at 11% and it feels like we've just started! We're deeply grateful to those who have contributed to St. André House and the new parking lot. We are reaching out to as many families as we can as quickly as we can, so please anticipate a call from one of us in the near future. On the other hand, don't hesitate to contact us if you have questions about the project or would like to make a contribution.

Why do we choose to Baptize? By: Cathy Kusman, Faith Formation Director

BAPTISM

Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) 1213 - Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit (*vitae spiritualis ianua*) and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: “**Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water and in the word.**”

CCC1243- Baptism is God’s most beautiful and magnificent gift... We call it *gift, grace, anointing, enlightenment, garment of immortality, bath of rebirth, seal, and most precious gift.* It is called **gift** because it is conferred on those who bring nothing of their own; **grace** since it is given even to the guilty; **Baptism** because sin is buried in the water; **anointing** for it is priestly and royal as are those who are anointed; **enlightenment** because it radiates light; **clothing** since it veils our shame; **bath** because it washes; and **seal** as it is our guard and the sign of God’s Lordship.

CCC 1217-1225 -Since the beginning of the world, water has been the source of life and fruitfulness. Noah’s ark saved a few through the waters; crossing the Red Sea gave us the liberation of slavery. Crossing the Jordan, the people of God received the gift of the new land. Through water the New Covenant is fulfilled. Christ is Baptized by John in the River Jordan teaching us what the Father reveals to us as “*His Beloved Son.*” Blood and water flowed from Christ’s side when he was crucified. Baptism and Eucharist are the Sacraments of New Life.

Baptism is the sacrament of Faith. But faith needs the community of believers. It is only within the faith of the Church that each of the faithful can believe. The Faith required for Baptism is not a perfect and mature faith, but a beginning that is called to develop. The godparents and parents are asked, “**What do you ask of God’s Church?**” the answer... **FAITH!** This is the beginning of our journey of growing in our faith. At each Easter Vigil the Church celebrates the renewal of Baptismal promises. Baptism seals the Christian with the indelible spiritual mark (*character*) of his belonging to Christ. No Sin can erase this mark, even if sin prevents Baptism from bearing the fruits of salvation. Given once for all, Baptism cannot be repeated. *The Holy Spirit has marked us with the seal of the LORD for the day of redemption. Baptism is the seal of eternal life.*

Sacred Relics Of The Saints: Treasures Of The Church
St. Gabriel the Archangel Parish presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on **Thursday, July 15 at 6:30 pm.** Fr. Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross will be here with an extraordinary Vatican collection of over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be a portion of the Veil of Our Lady and one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. Throughout history, many healings have been worked in the presence of relics; and thousands have been occasioned through this ministry. Do not miss this opportunity. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends and family members, which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.


