Dear Followers of Jesus,

In John 6:41-51, we continue to listen to Jesus's words about food that lasts. Jesus becomes the way the Father feeds us. His presence is real food in the Eucharist. He also fed us with his actions, his healing, and his commands while he was on earth. Jesus feeds in so many ways. We so often want to avoid many of the ways he nourishes us, especially when he invites us to let go of possessions, to welcome the abandoned poor, and to turn the other cheek. We so often ignore such food, such advice, such relationship.

There have been numerous studies, questionnaires, and opinion polls recently about what Catholics believe about the Eucharist. In most of these surveys, only about one third of Catholics believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist. There are many reasons for people slipping away from faith and the Church. However, I believe that one reason is that the Eucharist is not lived out in our lives in the Church. It is not noticed. Most people would never think that Christians believe in such a miracle because they do not see it revealed in our lives.

This notion reminds me of a quote from C. S. Lewis. In 1910, he noted, "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been difficult; and left untried." I hold on to this because it seems so true to me. Christianity, especially viewed from the Eucharist, is so often stifled by so many of us thinking it is only for personal piety or private salvation.

Instead, the Eucharist is meant to give us a vision of what heaven is and how to live it in the world. As believers, we become the Body of Christ from baptism. The liturgy is corporate prayer of the People of God. In this prayer, we lift our deepest humanity to the Father. We stand among one another learning how to be animators of love in the world. Justice, peace, unity among racial divides, forgiveness among enemies, release of captives, lifting the poor out of desolation, feeding the hungry, forever working for peace, are all gifts of the Holy Spirit from the Eucharist. Perhaps, Lewis is on to something. Christianity is meant to be a revolution, not just a devotion. Christianity does not really ask much of anyone in our world today. Therefore, people have walked away, and the Eucharist has faded into devotional prayer. Challenge, conversion, transformation are the opportunities for rebirth and deeper commitment in the Church today.

Also, a personal relationship with Jesus Christ is essential. As Catholics, most people were never given the tools to develop a relationship with Christ. We leaned on the Mass as our only prayer in the Church, as an obligation. We were told we seldom deserved God. We were not good enough or devote enough. Our lifestyle was not holy enough or we were not saintly enough. The outcome of developing a genuine relationship with Jesus Christ is ultimately to examine each day in view of his love for us not his condemnation. Being in relationship with Jesus helps us to learn how to forgive each day, how to examine our lives each night and how to learn ultimately that we are loved by God beyond measure. We are created in him, through him, for him, with him, all for the glory of the Father.

In today's gospel, we hear Jesus say, "I am the bread of life." If we hear this at Mass, we need hearts in which these words can resonate. We need a relationship with Jesus that knows what it means to be hungry for his love, his mercy, and his kindness. We also need a life that supports an understanding that only God can ultimately feed us with lasting things, with soul nourishing things such as peace, wisdom, and tenderness.

People were surprised that Jesus, the son of Joseph and Mary, was saying amazing and unbelievable things. They were murmuring among themselves. In so many ways, we have not moved beyond people's questioning him. We are still murmuring among ourselves, scratching our heads, wondering if Jesus is still among us in this most beautiful and marvelous way in the Breaking of the Bread and in our sharing in the Cup of Salvation.

*Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life.*

## Reflection

*[Elijah] prayed for death saying: "This is enough, O LORD!  
Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." (1Kings 19:4)*

Last week, we read that the wandering Israelites would rather have died as slaves in Egypt than die of hunger in the desert (Ex.16:3). Moses himself prayed for death rather than continue to carry the burden of leading the Israelites through their wanderings (Numbers 11:14-15). This week, it is Elijah who prays for death in the face of his difficulties in combatting the evil King Ahab and the prophets of Baal.

God is Love. We might think that hatred is the opposite of love, but that's not true. Hatred arises from fear, and it can indeed destroy our ability to love. But the true opposite of love is neither hatred nor fear, but despair.

Despair is when we do not feel loved, when we cannot acknowledge the worth that God (and others) see in us. Despair is a blindness concerning the reality that we all are brothers and sisters to each other. It can result from an exaggerated feeling of shame or a lack of self-worth; it can be the result of irrational fears; or it can simply be the result of chemical imbalances in our brains as well. But despair can lead to apathy and feelings of abandonment. It can also lead to thoughts of suicide.

Whatever the reason, despair means that we are only able to focus on our pain and suffering, that we can see the Cross, but not the Resurrection. Despair ultimately means that we do not feel valued or loved. This is why we must never forget that we have a God who loves us, even in the midst of our struggles.

The Israelites overcame their despair and felt loved when God gave them manna in the wilderness. Moses overcame his despair because God continued to be revealed to him; Elijah himself overcame his despair by listening for the small, quiet sound of God's presence, after the violent wind, earthquake, and fire had all passed by (1 Kings 19:11-13).

## Parish Life

### Why do we choose Godparents/ Sponsors for baptism?

The role of the godparent/ sponsor arose when there was a need in early Christian times for someone to vouch for the candidate (usually an adult) who wanted to join the Catholic Church, acting as a guide on the side, like with our RCIA candidates today. The godparent/ sponsor acted as a mentor for the person as he/she lived out and developed their faith. This godparent/ sponsor in the early church often had the one to be baptized live with them for up to two years so they could nurture them in the faith. When the godparent/ sponsor felt the candidate was ready, they would bring them to be baptized knowing fully that they had taught them well in the faith and were ready to live the Christian faith of Christ. They received Baptism, Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation as they joined the faith fully.

During the first four centuries, the Catholic Church was under intense persecution by the Roman Empire. To avoid persecution and the infiltration of pagans into the Church, every person who was received into the Church was required to have a godparent/ sponsor. This godparent/ sponsor performed two roles. First of all, they protected the Church by authenticating the sincerity of the convert to the faith. Secondly, as a catechist, they supported the person as a candidate into the Church.

The Catholic institution of godparenthood survived the Reformation largely unchanged. Godparents must be fully initiated Catholics (one who has celebrated Baptism, Eucharistic, Confirmation and practices their faith by regularly attending Mass) and not labored under a canonical penalty, whether imposed or declared. If the person you are considering as a godparent is not married according to the laws and practices of the Catholic Church, or is cohabitating (living together without marriage), you will need to consider someone else. Catholics who are divorced and remarried, and whose previous marriage has not been annulled by a Decree of Invalidity are considered members of the Church living in an irregular (or invalid) marriage and as such, are not eligible to be a godparent or Confirmation sponsor. This restriction ensures that whoever is appointed as godparent, that person will be able to represent and attest to the beliefs of the Catholic Church, the community of faith in which the child is being baptized.

In the modern baptism of an infant or child, the godparent or godparents make a profession of faith for the person being baptized (the godchild) and assume an obligation to serve as proxies for the parents if the parents either are unable or neglect to provide for the religious training of the child in fulfillment of the faith. Godparents are to be present to witness the baptism. Sometimes a "Christian Witness" is chosen in addition to a Catholic godparent. This is someone special who is faith-filled and wants to support and nurture the child and parents as the child grows in the faith. A baptized non-Catholic may serve as a "witness" to the ceremony, as long as a Catholic Godparent is present. The non-Catholic should be an active and participating member of his/her Christian community

Only one godparent is required for the Sacrament of Baptism. But you can have more, as you know those who will be nurturing your child in the faith.





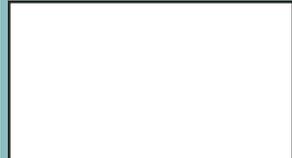
