Dear Believers in the Christ,

In John 6:60-69, we hear Jesus say to his disciples, *“Do you also want to leave?”* Jesus understands that his words and commands will not be accepted by everyone. Not all people will be able to listen with a soft heart or act with his loving power. It seems every day we all must make decisions in our lives about what we believe. Will we entrust our lives to God’s goodness and love, or will we work in this world with only our bloated egos? Will our thoughts and actions be at the center of life, or will we believe that God has a plan for us, even when life is pretty darn complicated?

We live in complicated times. Mass shootings are weekly occurrences. Mental health issues among teens and older citizens seem out of control. Divisions among racial lines, among people with money and power and those with little of each, control in politics and the cursing of people in the opposite party seem to be considered normal today. It seems that we have already answered Jesus in so many ways, perhaps we have already left him.

In this text Peter answers Jesus with another question, *“Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.”* Peter asks Jesus this question because he has seen with his own eyes the beauty of his relationship with Jesus. He understands his deep human concern for people and Peter has also captured insight about his divine life. Peter has taken the words of Jesus seriously because he knows in his heart that Jesus is the Word-made-flesh.

There are many things that have shattered our rhythms of life in these past two years. We are all still trying to recover from job loss, discovering how to educate our children, and grieving the loss of loved ones who have died in the pandemic. We are all tempted to abandon God who promises to be with us. However, if we settle into our pain, we know that God’s love and purpose in our lives is the only thing that will set us on the path of community, friendship, support, and encouragement.

Some of Jesus’ followers left him. Not everyone today takes faith seriously. Yet, we must take the Eucharist and the scriptures to heart if we are to live with genuine hope. We must live the mystery we celebrate on Sunday. It is not enough for us to just show up at Mass or at our family dinner tables once a week. Our lives are calling out for sincere connection. We must believe that Jesus is in our fear, in our questions about our future, in our inability to calm our restless teens. Here are some things to consider:

- 1. Admit our restlessness:** In our spiritual lives, we take this text seriously. We must admit to Jesus that life is difficult. Assess your life in faith. Tell the truth.
- 2. Admit we cannot fix our fear:** We need something greater than ourselves to survive and for life to flourish. Are we willing to do the work of reflecting on our fear? Or do we just let fear continue to stifle us because it is what we have always known?
- 3. Admit we need love:** Only love will change things. Violence will not change things. Divisions and rage will not change things. Can we decide to turn to love beyond our fear? Can we allow God to love us into the new life we seek?
- 4. Admit our surrender in God:** If we are to grow and mature as human beings, we must surrender to life beyond our anger, our rage, and our addictions. If we are to raise our families to be vibrant contributors to life and the world, then love and hope become central and vital. *“Where else shall we go?”*
- 5. Admit we are instruments of hope:** If we make our lives available for God, then we learn God uses us for the common good and that is healing, assurance, community, and peace. We become what we seek only in Christ Jesus.

Life is easily bruised. We may blame others for our pain. In Jesus Christ we become instruments of justice, of peace, and gain the courage and conviction to stay with him. We do so because, like Peter, we have seen and witnessed incredible things.

Reflection

For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. (Ephesians 5:31)

So, it's that time of year when a celibate priest gets to man-splain (or is it priest-splain?) marriage to married people, or to folks who may be getting married one day. Well, here I go. (Deep breath!)

In our second reading this weekend, Paul tells us that the husband is "head" of his wife. Clearly, this is a position of dominance. There's no way to avoid seeing that. It offends, rightly, our modern understanding of mutuality in a Christian marriage.

And yet, Paul's point in writing this was not to stress dominance of men over women, since that idea was already presumed in his day. It didn't even occur to him that things could be otherwise. He wasn't teaching men that they *should* be dominant over women. He simply lived in a world where that was already the perceived reality, and nobody in his world (among the men at least) questioned that.

Instead, Paul was stressing that there should be complementarity within Christian marriage, even within a patriarchal social environment. The husband is not separate from his wife, but like a head, he is part of the same body with her.

Notice that Paul also implores husbands to love their wives, even as they do their own bodies. Not as chattel, or as a possession, but as himself. That's less of a claim for dominance and more like a First Century idea of mutuality!

Paul's quotation about leaving one's father and mother and becoming one flesh with one's spouse comes directly from Genesis, and it reflects the fact that Adam and Eve were created of the same substance and were intended to complete or complement each other.

The final hint of Paul's message comes when he concludes by saying, "I speak in reference to Christ and the Church." Just as a husband and wife should be "one" in love and concern for each other, so should the Church be.

Paul often described the Church as the Body of Christ, having many different members, but being united as one. That's really what Paul is getting at. A married couple, a family, should be as one! Different roles perhaps, but one in being and in purpose. So should the Church!

May all married couples act together as one. May our Church, also, end all divisions and follow Christ as one people of faith, loving one another in mutual respect.

"Restore Our Heart" Capital Campaign Update

Over the coming weeks we will explain some unusual approaches for making a donation to Sacred Heart's Capital Campaign while also receiving beneficial tax treatment of the donation. The approaches that will be covered can be used for a one-time donation to the campaign or a multi-year pledge.

Donor-Advised Fund – What is it and how do I use it?

A donor-advised fund allows an individual to donate stock, mutual funds or cash to a fund that has been established with an investment company or similar organization. However, such donation is irrevocable and thus cannot be returned to the donor. The donor can direct all or part of the fund amount to a charity such as Sacred Heart.

The donor gets an immediate tax deduction for the fair market value at the time of donation to the fund. If the donor has a gain on the donated stock, the donor will not have to pay capital gains tax on the appreciation. While donors should consult their tax professionals, it's generally considered that those taxpayers that itemize their deductions will be able to achieve a more tax efficient donation.

An example of a donation to a donor advised fund.

Assume the donor acquired \$20,000 of XYZ stock in 2015. Further assume that since 2015, the stock has appreciated to \$45,000. If the stock is donated to a donor-advised fund, the donor will receive a \$45,000 charitable contribution tax deduction and will not have to declare \$25,000 gain that has accumulated since 2015.

If you would like to make a donor-advised fund contribution, please contact your financial services company (e.g., Vanguard, Schwab, Fidelity, etc.) that is holding the donor-advised fund and instruct them to make the donation to Sacred Heart. A withdrawal for the specified amount would then be made from the fund and sent to Sacred Heart with a record of the transaction sent to the individual.

Last Sunday, over 70 people gathered in the Parish Center to brainstorm and discern our future. We spent a few minutes reflecting on these two questions: **Who is God asking us to be and to become? How is God calling us to pray, educate, and serve?** Parishioners then shared their God inspired ideas with others at their tables. Then a representative from each table shared with the larger group.

Ideas and suggestions poured forth. Nostalgia, memories, and laughter caught us. However, I was moved by how *love* is at the center of our parish life. People want to live their faith in the Church and continue to pass it down to another generation. People want to serve people and become more hospitable. They want to care for all life, for the planet, for the out-cast, and our neighbor. They love Jesus Christ and want to learn how to pray.



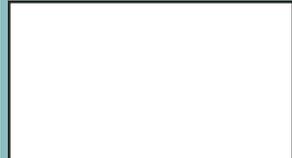
