Dear Believers,

In Mark 8: 27-35, Jesus asks a question to his disciples, "But who do you say I am?" This divine question must be considered in our prayer, in our relationships, and in our world. We cannot skirt this prayer or brush it away.

Every day, we recommit our lives to the essentials in life. We love our families over again and we work diligently. We care for our bodies. We love life. However, an essential daily renewal is also a commitment to listening to Christ and following him. We also need to recommit ourselves to who he is for us. How would we answer Jesus who poses this question to us?

We cannot answer him until we come closer to him. We cannot keep him in a container of piety or indifference. This question opens us to the Trinity, to the divine life within us and in our world. However, we will never be able to answer him until we come to know him.

The gospel also reveals to us that following him will take us to places we would rather not go. We shall lose our lives, take up our cross, and find our hearts in his. This is a lifetime of prayer, reflection and answering his questions. Jesus' question to us is at the heart of our conversion to his divine life within us. Our answer is much more than lip service. Our answer is life converted to him in every aspect of our humanity. His love invites and changes us. His divinity is an invitation for us to live beyond our own selfishness.

On September 15, the Church celebrates the Memorial of Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows. This is the feast day of the Congregation of Holy Cross. Our religious community has served this parish since 1984. Our Lady of Sorrows guides our spirituality and our prayer as a professed religious community. I invite you to pray for our brothers, our priests and our sisters this week as we again learn to imitate Mary's posture toward suffering.

I have learned in my priesthood a deep reverence for Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows. This image pierces my heart. She stood next to the suffering of her son, Jesus, without controlling his pain or changing it. She held such mystery in her heart. She models for me a posture of such witness to the pain I behold in our parish and community. I cannot solve the pain and hardship in any life. However, I can learn to behold its mystery, to sit with the dying, and to listen to the grieving. Mary's witness teaches me to overcome my false opinions about how life should be or how I think others ought to live. The real life of people shows me the beauty of God. Mary's example of witness enables me the patience to hold up other's unnamed and unredeemed pain.

So, in today's gospel, Peter answers Jesus, "You are the Christ." As we know, Peter also denied Jesus three times. We live in constant paradox. We know that answering Jesus' question takes us many years of life, prayer, and sorting through the issues of life.

I believe Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, helps us understand the mystery of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. These are the events of our life of faith. These are the mysteries that enable us to come to know within our own hearts, that Jesus is the Christ. Oh, happy day.

He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

Reflection

I very much enjoy studying scripture, learning its context, and discovering the original intentions of the lines based on an examination of the words and history. But sometimes, in prayer, it's good to just sit with a line that strikes me and to listen to it, allowing my mind and heart to follow wherever its words and meaning takes me.

Take, for example, the psalm response today: *"I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living."* (Psalm 116) I could pick up a commentary and read about the meaning of this line, what "land of the living" meant in Hebrew to the author of this line nearly three millennia in the past. I could discover what the geo-political situation was for the people of Judah at this point, whether they were in exile or whether they were rebuilding the city of Jerusalem; whether the Babylonians or the Persians were in charge of the area.

But instead, I occasionally prefer to dwell on the words as they've been translated into my language, as I hear them now in the twenty-first century, here for me, in Colorado, at Sacred Heart Parish.

Do I walk before the Lord? Am I aware that God is always behind me, beside me? Am I even walking, or has my faith become stagnant? Am I growing in my understanding of God's love? Where is my walking leading me as a disciple, a follower of Christ?

For those who are familiar with the Camino of Santiago de Compostela (which I've been trying to plan for parishioners for the last two years!), walking becomes a metaphor for a faith journey through life.

And what does "the land of the living" mean to me? Do I live in hope? Do I see positive growth and movement from the Holy Spirit around me? Do I acknowledge others around me as living, breathing brothers and sisters, walking beside me, or do I instead see them as mere background to my life, where I am the center of attention in my own story?

Perhaps you can spend some time praying scripture in this way. Ask yourself, while in the land of the living, am I walking before the Lord?

Update On Where We Are with "Restore Our Heart – Phase II"

The Diocese has approved our plan.

Sacred Heart, the Diocese and Bob McGrath Construction are finalizing the contract for the project.

Construction is scheduled to begin on October 1, 2021.

Construction is scheduled to be finished by February 15, 2022.

We have achieved 33% of our campaign goal.

156 families have contributed \$382,000 for restoring the rectory and the parking lot.

34 families of the 156 total have made multi-year pledges for the project.

Because there are 1,000 families in the parish, we are optimistic that in the coming months we will benefit from contributions and pledges from the many families that have not yet participated.

With the start of construction the full financial support of the parish is especially important.

We are exploring ideas from several parishioners to make the parking lot more climate friendly and will share our findings in the near future.

OLPH Ramp Project & Wall Update: The ramp and landscaping are done, and all looks great! Insurance covered the rebuilding of the broken wall. And it's finished already! We used the same stonemasons that worked on the grotto and the ramp. Construction on the handicap accessible bathroom is moving along. They have begun working on the inside wall of the church to put in a new handicap accessible entrance from the church to the new deck.
