Catholic and Divorced

CCC (Catechism of the Catholic Church)1638: From a valid marriage arises a bond between the spouses which by its very nature is perpetual and exclusive; furthermore, in a Christian marriage the spouses are strengthened and, as it were consecrated for the duties and the dignity of their state by a special sacrament.

CCC 1639: The Consent by which the spouses mutually give and receive one another is sealed by God himself. ... confirmed by divine law, and in the eyes of society.

There is no part of being married or divorced that is easy. As our Catholic faith states, it is a bond, sealed by God.

Sadly, divorce still happens. It can be one spouse or both that want or even need the separation. Reconciliation is not easy. It takes a lot of work to rebuild a broken relationship. But, there are many who have done the hard work of rebuilding. There are also those couples who work hard from day one to “make it work” and succeed in finding joy with God on the journey of marriage.

I work with those who have not found that success. I work with those who are as broken as their marriage.


Divorce Survival and Recovery. It is truly a survival and recovery mission that the divorced are on, and it is important to remember them in your prayers.

The Colorado Springs *Diocese Divorce Survival and Recovery* program has been in effect since 2015. Hundreds have gone through the 12 week program (some twice) and most have found a healing journey to rebuild their lives.

Our first few weeks are painful evenings of introductions and personal stories. When the group goes through 12 weeks together, the group is bonded and has found a journey of healing that takes them into life again.

No one understands divorce like the divorced. It is something that is impossible to understand unless you have been through this painful journey. It seems the divorced should *get over it and move on*. Did you know the average divorcee’ takes four years to fully recover from divorce? So be gentle with those you know that are struggling with picking up the pieces of their broken lives.

God is with the divorced no different than the rest of the parish, so be gentle to those going through this journey.

Reflection

We have to stop using the Bible to justify our own prejudices and biases! For example, Eve has long been blamed for tempting Adam with the apple. And, since Man was created first, as our first reading from Genesis 2 tells us, for far too long Woman has often been slighted as some sort of afterthought in the creation process.

First, there are no apples in the story of the Garden of Eden. European artists painted apples because apples were common in Europe, but the ancient Middle East did not grow apples. The Bible instead mentions “fruit of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.” The knowledge of good and evil represents our conscience, our loss of innocence. A small child does not know the difference between good and evil, and so remains innocent of sin. All of us adults, who have sinned, know, or should know, the difference.

Second, in the Garden story, Adam is as equally culpable as Eve for their sin, and both are equally punished and banished from the Garden. The chain of guilt from Serpent, to Eve, to Adam, and then later to Cain, shows how sin affects us like a poison. Adam is guilty for his own actions, even though everything started with the serpent. We, too, must take full responsibility for our own personal failings, even though we sometimes, like Adam, are tempted to make excuses out of the circumstances surrounding our decisions.

Finally, the creation of the woman is not an afterthought, as if women were not initially part of God’s plan. (The fact that generations of men have taught this says more about those men than it does about God.) Instead, the Genesis story tells us that humanity is not complete without both genders. In fact, it is only with both the feminine and the masculine sides of our individual nature that any of us are fully human.

Historically, the Bible has been used to defend other biases as well. For centuries, we justified slavery, and bigotry against other races, using the Bible to proof-text our selfish prejudices. Do we still justify our feelings today about people who are different than us, foreigners, non-Christians, and immigrants, because of our misunderstanding of the Bible? We need to listen to the entirety of Sacred Scriptures, especially the gospels, which tell us to welcome the stranger in our midst and to forgive one another, not to draw lines of distinction among us.

Jesus challenges us to rethink the laws of Moses and instead listen to the more challenging Law of Love.

Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

On October 7, the Roman Catholic Church celebrates the yearly feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Known for several centuries by the alternate title of “Our Lady of Victory,” the feast day takes place in honor of a 16th century naval victory which secured Europe against Turkish invasion. Pope St. Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was invoked on the day of the battle through a campaign to pray the Rosary throughout Europe and amongst the soldiers fighting in the battle.

The feast always occurs one week after the similar Byzantine celebration of the Protection of the Mother of God, which most Eastern Orthodox Christians and Eastern Catholics celebrate on October 1 in memory of a 10th-century military victory which protected Constantinople against invasion after a reported Marian apparition.

During this month of the Holy Rosary, all are invited to join us in praying the Rosary before Daily Mass at 7:40 am at Sacred Heart Church.

"We're all part of God's Plan(et)"

A look back at the Season of Creation:

Orthodox Christians have been marking the Season of Creation for decades. It started in 1989, when Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I proclaimed September 1 a day of prayer for the environment. That day actually marks the beginning of the Eastern Orthodox church year. Around that time, focus on the environment was ratcheting up worldwide. Over time, the single day of prayer expanded to a full season, with the World Council of Churches playing a leading role. More recently, the Season of Creation has become a more ecumenical celebration among all Christians and persons of other faiths, including Jews, Muslims, Buddhists, and others.

And the past few years have seen it gain traction among Catholics. For that, you can point to Pope Francis. Just months after publishing his 2015 encyclical "*Laudato Si'*, on Care for Our Common Home," Pope Francis formally added the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation to the Catholic calendar as an annual day of prayer. And in 2019, he officially invited Catholics to celebrate the full season.

"Now is the time to rediscover our vocation as children of God, brothers and sisters, and stewards of creation. Now is the time to repent, to be converted and to return to our roots," he wrote. "We are beloved creatures of God, who in his goodness calls us to love life and live it in communion with the rest of creation. For this reason, I strongly encourage the faithful to pray in these days that, as the result of a timely ecumenical initiative, are being celebrated as a Season of Creation."

The Season of Creation is supported by a number of leading Christian organizations, including the World Council of Churches, Christian Aid, the Lutheran World Federation, the Anglican Communion Environmental Network, the Global Catholic Climate Movement and the Vatican's Dicastery for the Promotion of Integral Human Development. Monday, Oct. 4 is the Feast Day of St. Francis Assisi

St. Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226), known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. He left a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land.

Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith.




