

Dear Followers of the Messiah,

Today's gospel, Luke 21:25-28, shakes us by the shoulders. It is spiritual cold water in the face. This message of urgency begins the New Year of Grace, 2022.

Advent creates within us a desire for God. This is the message of our ancestors who waited for the Messiah. We know this urgency to wake up when we are confronted with severe illness or when our children are rushed to the hospital in the middle of night. We know it when divorce strikes our home or when a spouse is counted among job-loss statistics. We utter cries from the heart when

life seems unfair. We raise a fist to heaven when we cannot control the outcome of life.

Advent begins with an eternal cry for justice. This is because our ancestors waited for the Messiah whose promise was peace, light and hope for all people. So, we begin this new liturgical season in deep human need, a condition we know well. We stand among others who ache for Jesus Christ. This penetrating longing of the heart is our food for prayer.

Advent begins with a wake-up call to not let our hearts become drowsy. We are to cease carousing. We are to stop drunkenness. We are to be vigilant. We are to stand on the earth and desire God in the deepest recesses of our hearts and in the visible needs of the planet.

God is nearby. God is here. God is within us. Advent allows us to see for ourselves the miracles of what God offers us and the world. So, let us calm our expectations. Let us put aside the frantic activity of December. Let us instead, wait in joyful hope for God to change everything in our hearts and on our planet. We begin the story of Jesus Christ over again. We wait. Pay attention to Advent. Wake up.

Reflection

Justice has so many connotations. Justice can mean the strong arm of the law. Justice will arrive at your door if you have committed any crimes. Or, justice means that you will finally get the recognition and reward that's coming to you, after years of suffering or being neglected.

Christian people, who may know nothing of Hinduism or Buddhism, often speak of *karma* as if some sort of magic justice can reward the good and punish the evil during our lifetime. But *karma* is not a Christian concept, and there is no such thing as magic. We know that sometimes bad things do happen to good people, and that some bad people get away with horrible crimes, with no real consequences.

In the first reading today, Jeremiah claims that "the days are coming" when we will call "the Lord our justice." Jeremiah is not promising us that bad people always get thwarted and good people eventually become wealthy. He is certainly not suggesting that everything will always go our way.

We know this to be true because we look around us and we do not always see justice. Some people go hungry and shiver in the cold while others have warm homes and good meals to look forward to. Some suffer from racism, poverty, mental illness, or from some tragic event that was in no way deserved. Some children face enormous pain and suffering, sometimes from the hands of their peers and sometimes from the adults in their lives whom they are supposed to trust.

Believing in Jesus does not make justice happen. However, imitating Jesus does get us closer to justice. Feeding the poor, clothing the naked, comforting the downhearted. There are lots of ways to help bring justice to the world. Jeremiah promises that the God of justice will come. He has. And after He rose from the dead, He asked us to follow Him. As we await to celebrate Jesus' birth, let us remember to bring about justice in His Name.

Advent Season 2021

Advent. It's the time to begin a new season of faith. We see the seasons change as the leaves change. Green leaves transform into joyous colors of orange, gold, and red leaves. We know soon they will be replaced by a landscape of white, all crisp and clean.

Advent is so like each of us, searching for new, clean holiness; to be drawn closer to Jesus.

Covid has caused many of us to stagnate. We search harder to find Jesus, longing to be closer to Him. We know the beauty of a new season is here. We are begging God to draw us closer and make us more holy.

I have been on a challenging journey the last 4+ months, yet I have discovered myself closer to God as I cling to Jesus to help me find healing. A life-threatening motorcycle accident followed by a stroke has caused me to see the world differently. This traumatic experience humbled me. It gave me a new look at myself and my faith. I know that thousands of people all over the world prayed for me. I am grateful that each of you prayed for and loved me during this time.

After the accident, my loved ones were unsure how I would survive. The road to recovery would prove to be long and difficult. I will never forget the Sunday morning, a very special July 4th, when Father Ron visited me in the hospital before my surgery. He held my hand, prayed for me, gave me the sacraments, and then blessed me with oil. He began to chant prayers to bring comfort to my family and me. As I waited to be taken to surgery, I softly fell asleep. I knew that God was with me. I never doubted.

During recovery I had a stroke. I was terrified. I did not know my name and I didn't remember anything for a week. Sacred Heart Parish continued to remember me in its prayers. My hard work of recovery began. Every day the doctor asked me "What is your name?" One day I woke up and replied, "My name is Cathy Kusman." He said, "Awesome! What is your age?" I said, "I am 29 years old." Well, I got it half right! The power to know my own name and say it out loud gave everyone a new day of hope.

After one month in the hospital, starting rehab brought the next level of hard work. I have never worked so hard in my life. I work daily to find my memory again and relearn how to do simple things. Not only did I have to put back together all the pieces of my broken body, I had (and still have) the hard work of putting my mind back together.

At one point I struggled with my biggest loss ... *how to say my prayers again?* My prayers used to be so easy and come so naturally. Now they were a jumble of words that I couldn't put together to make any sense. I would cry out to God at night, "I am sorry. I want to say the prayers I have said my whole lifetime. The words won't come back together, LORD."

In other areas I did not struggle as badly. I began to gather my memories of people at Sacred Heart Parish. I recalled the things I wanted to be doing at my job at Sacred Heart. These things came back together in my mind, but the memories of prayer were not connecting for me. At night I would cry, "God help me!" and God would tell me "Cathy, I hear your prayers. I am listening." I know God heard me, but I was accustomed to being able to speak aloud easily to groups as a leader and guest speaker. I wanted to continue living my life as I did before as someone who could easily pray and share my faith life with others. But I could not put my prayer life back together...

...until one day when church friends stopped at the hospital and asked, "Can we pray for you?" We began to pray aloud all the prayers that we all know - *Glory Be, Hail Mary, Our Father*. My injured brain remembered! The pieces came back together! Tears ran down my face and God whispered to me, "I told you I was hearing and listening to you."

On that day I knew I never had given up. What I had been through had been hard because IT WAS HARD! On every day of this journey, my family, friends and Sacred Heart Parish never left me alone. God never left me alone. God trusted me on the hard days, but I have learned so much about what God wanted, what He wanted me to know.

Many things are different for me now, yet many things are the same. My faith continues. I am never alone. I find joy in my work at Sacred Heart with the incredible people of our faith. The children of our parish bring us joy as we see them weekly at Faith Formation. We welcome new members who are joining our beautiful faith with those in RCIA and new baptisms. This is evidence that the beauty of our faith has not become stagnant. Our faith is real and here every day. Our faith is alive and open to everyone.

Remember - don't give up on the hard days. Believe me when I say that I know that many days are HARD! For me, every day is a fighting journey, but I know I am not alone. God is with me.

As each of you take this journey of Advent, I ask you to open your hearts to what God wants for you and where he wants to take you on His journey of love. God is waiting for you. God is good and ready for you to open your heart for HIM! No matter what your journey struggle is, remember you are never alone. Know that I am praying every day for YOU!

Thank you again for your prayers and your faithful love for me.
