



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The past five months have been pretty much a blur since I pulled my Pennsylvania-plated car into the parking lot at the Sacred Heart Parish Center back in July. While Fr. Ron was still with us, we celebrated the church's Centennial, joined by Bishop Wack and our own new Ordinary, Bishop James Golka. We celebrated the First Vows Mass of the outgoing Holy Cross Novices and then welcomed a new class of novices. Fr. Randy took several of our parishioners on Pilgrimage and we enjoyed seeing their pictures and hearing their stories.

I know there are still many of you that I haven't yet had the opportunity to speak with at any length, and I keep meeting more of our parish families, it seems, every week. I am so grateful to God for the opportunity to be your pastor, and I want to thank Fr. Randy, our staff, our volunteers, our councils and parish groups, and all of you who have helped and continue to help me learn how to lead a parish community through your words and your prayers.

A great many of you have been "little Christs" for me since my arrival by showing me hospitality, welcoming me, sharing your lives and experiences and expertise with me. This is the claim we make when we call ourselves "Christians:" we are trying to be like Jesus and in our own way to bring Christ into the world. Bringing Christ into the world means sharing the Good News that the Angels first proclaimed to the shepherds— this world needs to be saved and God has sent you a Savior. Every single human being is worthy of receiving this message of salvation, and no one will be excluded who says "yes" to the invitation to be part of the Kingdom of God.

Please accept my best wishes and pastoral blessing for you and your loved ones this Christmas. May God listen to your prayers and grant them according to His perfect will. May Jesus Christ, the Word made Flesh, be born more deeply into your heart and life this year, and may the Angels preach to you anew the Good News that you are known, loved, and saved by the King of Kings, the Prince of Peace.

Norman Rockwell was a masterful artist who illustrated hundreds of iconic images of everyday life, capturing feeling and emotions that resonate with so many people. He was a close observer of the way many wanted to see themselves. Images of Thanksgiving and Christmas, along with Fourth of July and other American celebrations, became for whole generations the standard of what family life should be like.

<u>The Saturday Evening Post</u>, whose covers Rockwell graced for many years, tended however to exhibit only stereotypical Caucasian, middle-class images of American culture, thereby excluding so many Americans who didn't fit this image, thus setting up unrealistic expectations for nearly everyone. Although Rockwell himself created other works that showed his personal empathy with Americans of all colors and backgrounds, the standard stereotype endures.

The very idea of a "Norman Rockwell family" is one of warmth and togetherness, of simple comfort and innocence, but nearly always made up of a nuclear family of a white middle-class background. Christmas today is still measured sometimes by how well we hold to the standard of the Rockwell image, an image that was never accurate for many Americans, but one that has been amplified even today by endless Hallmark Christmas movies.


The truth, however, is that Christmas is celebrated best not by trying to imitate a Norman Rockwell painting nor a Hallmark movie, but by remembering that God became fully human, representing all humans, not just the middle-class. Jesus was not white, and neither He nor His apostles would ever have recognized 1950's America, much less the America of 2022. His concern for the poor, the downtrodden, the immigrant, the imprisoned, the hungry, and even the sinner calls us to widen our Christmas ideal beyond just our own nostalgic memories.

Many spend Christmas alone, many have broken families or divisions among siblings and children. Some are suffering somehow, from illness or depression or loneliness, and the sound of carols only amplifies their sadness. The fullness of humanity is present at Christmas, representing all peoples and all emotions.

Thankfully, our God became fully human precisely in order to embrace the fullness of humanity. As we remember His birth, may we remember the needs and concerns of all those whom Jesus came to save— everyone!
