Padre's Corner

Dear family,

Today is the last day we can validly say, "Merry Christmas!" The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season. But what does this day have to do with Christmas at all? By this point in His life, Jesus is no longer a helpless infant, but a grown man. What does His baptism have to do with the Incarnation? Everything! The whole point of the incarnation is that God is truly with us. In the Sacrament of Baptism, which Jesus consecrated today, God comes to dwell in us! Incorporated by His grace, we become in Baptism His presence in the world. Secondly, the Incarnation of Christ we celebrate at Christmas is the beginning of God's promise of salvation for the world. The child would grow to reconcile all of us into His divine life. Baptism is the beginning of God's promise in us and our journey of faith. Like His earthly journey, our lives baptized in Him are meant to build up the kingdom, announce the good news, and in the end spend eternity with Him. What He promised us in general, he makes to each of us individually at our Baptism: He is Emmanuel, God with us!
