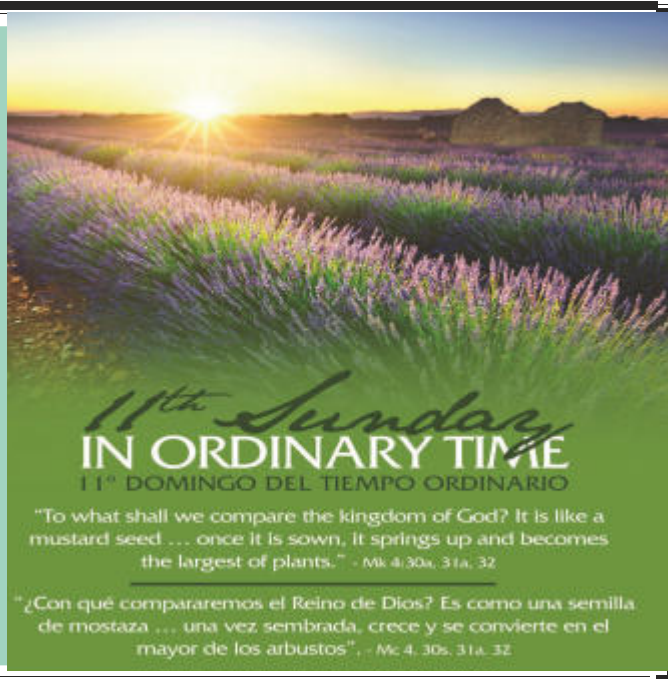


Cathedral of the Sacred Heart

Ordinary Time

On the Church's Liturgical Calendar, this Sunday is the 11th Sunday in 'Ordinary Time'. *The last time we celebrated a Sunday in Ordinary Time was February 11th!* Since then, Catholics in parishes around the

world have been experiencing their lives through the lens of the most profound mysteries of our faith. During Lent and Easter, we experience how the story of Jesus' passion, death, resurrection and ascension becomes 'our good news'. Sin and death are not the final word. *We are forgiven, healed, and destined for eternal life!* At Pentecost we receive anew our commission to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ here and now under the guidance and in the power of His Holy Spirit. We surrender to the Truth that because of Jesus' embrace of us, we live, and move, and have our being in the Heart of the Trinity. Last Sunday, we re-member the gift of the Risen Jesus Christ, truly Present to and in us in the Blessed Sacrament of Holy Communion. It is with the force of these experiences of union with God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – that we enter these weeks of 'Ordinary Time.' Living with the knowledge that we are created, sustained, and sanctified by the Loving God who formed us for mission makes everyday extraordinary.
