






Most of us are quiet people who desire to live a good and holy life, promote the values and mission of the Gospel as best we can and desire to one day inherit the surprise of life eternal God promises to us. We are not trail blazers. We are simple people who want to do the simple things of life well. But there are others who left a more profound impact along the way of the paths they walked. Folks like Dorothy Day, Martin Luther King, Thomas Merton, Gandhi, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and many others left lasting impacts and legacies. Like Moses, they show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose driven life look like. They show us how to be holy. We need Moses people like these to give us inspiration, hope and an example of holy living.

We do not need to do what they did or even mirror their relationship with God. Each one of us is God's special creation, with a purpose and soul known only to us. We need to learn how to open up and bring, without compromise, our soul-ness to life. We know when someone is authentic and centered because they always point to truth, even though they struggle and sin themselves, and they embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and it astonished many who listened. We do not need to move mountains, advance a cause, write books or become notable. All we have to do is become credible witnesses of the faith we profess. Moses people can teach us how to do this.

St. Oscar Romero was an amazing man and a Moses figure for sure. He saw God in the burning bush and brought the flame of Gospel faith to the poorest of the poor, challenging the evils of the society in which he lived. He was tireless and persistent. He must have gotten very close to the problem because it cost him his life. He suspected it would. St. Romero said, "When we leave Mass, we ought to go out the way Moses descended Mt Sinai: with his face shining, with his heart brave and strong to face the world's difficulties." We can learn from this wisdom. If we allow the power of the Mass to truly

allow the power of the Mass to truly transform us, we will leave that holy encounter changed. Our face will shine, and we will have courage. We can then bring what we have received to life's challenges. That sounds doable, doesn't it? Because of the example of our simple holiness, people will be amazed. ©LPi

Ongoing Mass Guidelines

Whether you have been regularly attending Mass or if you have been sidelined by the pandemic or by choice, we are glad you are here. As the Christmas season ends, we enter into a short period of Ordinary Time before we begin our Lenten journey. And, as the vaccine rollout advances and the restrictions appear to be lifting slightly, we can expect to see an increase in Mass attendance.

St. Frances Cabrini continues to maintain a rigorous schedule disinfecting of the church and meeting rooms after each use and the expectation that participants will wear masks and maintain physical distancing requirements continues. We continue to provide our overflow space where the Mass is simulcast so that we can accommodate more persons safely. Holy Communion is brought to the simulcast space so all may participate fully.

It remains important that you properly sign up at sfcparish.org for all weekend Masses. *Please do not come to church without having signed up*. And it is important that you arrive to Mass early to ensure you can safely access a place to sit in the church or in the hall. In a spirit of compliance with local governance and out of an abundance of caution and Christian charity, **masks should be worn**


at all times, while entering, exiting and sitting in the church, as well as going forward and returning from Holy Communion.

The Presentation of the Lord / Candlemas

The celebration of **The Presentation of the Lord** (also known as Candlemas) is celebrated on February 2nd. This feast day commemorates the ritual purification of Mary forty days after the birth of her son, Jesus,

and His first public appearance at the Jewish temple with Simeon's prophecy that Jesus would be "a light to the revelation of the gentiles." On this day, Christians all over the world remember the events of Scripture (Luke 2:22-39) and in commemoration have brought their candles for blessing. Candles are still a reminder that Jesus is a guiding light in the darkness, The Light of the World. If you would like to have your candles used in prayer and time of need blessed, you may bring them to the Parish Office.



Feast Day of St. Blaise

This **Wed.**, **Feb. 3rd**, is the Feast Day of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr. The *Blessing of the Throats* will take place after the 9am Mass. Although we know few facts about Saint Blaise, stories about him have long been part of our revered and received Christian tradition. He was said to have been not only a bishop, but also a physician. One story handed down to us says he miraculously saved a boy who was

choking to death on a fish bone. As this story spread, people began praying to Saint Blaise for healing, especially from diseases of the throat. To this day, we still celebrate Saint Blaise's feast day on February 3rd with the Blessing of Throats. Two candles which were blessed the day before (February 2nd - the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord) are joined together (often tied together with red ribbon) in the shape of a cross. These candles are then touched to our throats as Saint Blaise is invoked to intercede for us that God may deliver us from diseases of the throat and all other illnesses.

Baptism Classes


Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. -ccc 1213

Jacques Maritain on Formed.org



This film tells the story of Jacques Maritain, a highly respected French philosopher, teacher and writer in the 20th century, who was a principal exponent of Thomism and an influential interpreter of the thought of St Thomas Aquinas. He lived for many years in the United States, and taught at Princeton University and Columbia University from 1941-1944. After WWII, he served as the French ambassador to the Vatican for 5 years, and he also helped draft the United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948).

Maritain was born in 1882 in Paris, and studied at the Lycee Henri IV and at the Sorbonne where he fell in love with Raissa Oumancoff, a Russian emigrant student of Jewish origin. This was the beginning of an extraordinary love story, and they married in 1904. In search of truth and tormented by existential questions, they decided to

search intensely for a year to discover the meaning of life, and if that meaning not found, they would commit suicide together. Through the philosophy of Henri Bergson, and the literature and friendship of Léon Bloy, they found the answers they sought, in the Catholic faith. They were baptized June 11, 1906.

Jacques became a famous philosopher and writer, teaching at the Institut Catholique from 1914 - 1939, and Raissa became a noted poet and mystic. The Maritains were friends with many well-known personalities in the arts, politics and the Church: Peguy, Bloy, Cocteau, Green, Bernanos, Rouault, Chagall, Satie, De Gaulle, Cardinal Journet, Pope Paul VI and many others. Those relationships are explored in this documentary film. Jacques was deeply engaged in the battles of his time denouncing anti-Semitism, fascism, Nazism, and during World War II the Maritains took refuge in America.

After Raissa died in 1960, Jacques lived in the religious community of the Little Brothers of Jesus in Toulouse until his death in 1973. He is buried next to Raissa in Kolbsheim, France.

Our call (as St Paul reminds us) is to replace the current culture of death with a new culture of life and a civilization of love.



Author Jennie Allen writes, "The greatest spiritual battle of our generation is being fought between our ears. The danger of toxic thinking," says Allen, "is it produces an alternate reality, one in which distorted reasoning actually seems to make sense." Our first step in battling anxiety is to become aware of the negative garbage our brain is telling our body. We then have to disrupt those thoughts and anchor them to a new thought that combats the toxic lie we believe. When I purposefully disrupt my negative thinking and anchor my mind to God's Word, I am making a choice to teach my brain and body that my anxious thoughts do not define me. Who defines me? My creator God does. And who does God say I am? I am chosen and loved. (1 Thessalonians 1:4)I am a child of God. (John 1:12) I am secure in Him. (1 Peter 1:3-5) Choosing to disrupt our anxiety and replace it with healthier habits takes perseverance. It takes patience and being gentle with ourselves, but it's so worth it. Each time we make a choice to disrupt our destructive thoughts and anchor our mind to the truth in Scripture about who God says




