Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

"Behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying 'Where is the newborn king of the Jews?

We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." How strange to journey so far for perhaps so little. Of course the magi go to the capitol city. Of course they entreat with King Herod. Of course this is where they expect newborn royalty to be. But where is the child? "In Bethlehem of Judea," the scribes say. And so the magi go on to what is yet another Christmas miracle.

We don't know where the magi met the Christ Child, but it cannot have been lavish. Perhaps it was the stable. Perhaps it was a small hovel Joseph had found to wait out the census. But it would have been the home of a laborer, worn and threadbare. Here, in this unassuming abode, the magi are still "overjoyed...they prostrated themselves and did him homage."

Have you ever gotten to the end of a great work and found the results to be underwhelming? How did you respond? Were you disappointed or elated at God's providence and your upended expectations? The magi journeyed hundreds of miles over treacherous terrain to pay homage to royalty they have seen prophesied in the stars. They encountered an ordinary family displaced from their home. This Sunday, the magi are an example for us. Can we see God in the unexpected? Do we encounter Him in the person who doesn't fit our expectations of propriety? Do we revere Christ's presence in the poor? Or do we expect to meet God only in places of honor and esteem? This week, ask God for the grace to honor Him in the unexpected places and unassuming people. He is waiting for you!

Venerable Fulton Sheen on the Nativity

Bethlehem became a link between heaven and earth; God and man met here and looked each other in the face. In the taking of human flesh, the Father prepared it, the Spirit formed it, and the Son assumed it. He who had an eternal generation in the bosom of the Father now had a temporal generation in time. He who had his birth in Bethlehem came to be born in the hearts of men. For, what would it profit if he was born a thousand times in Bethlehem unless He was born again in man? **"But all those who did welcome Him, He empowered to become the children of God."** John 1:12

Now man need not hide from God as Adam did; for He can be seen through Christ's human nature. Christ did not gain one perfection more by becoming man, nor did he lose anything of what He possessed as God. There was the Almightiness of God in the movement of His arm, the Infinite Love of God in the beatings of His human heart and the Unmeasured Compassion of God to sinners in his eyes. God is now manifest in the flesh; this is what is called the Incarnation. The whole range of the Divine attributes of power and goodness, justice, love and beauty were in Him. And when our Divine Lord acted and spoke, God in his perfect nature became manifest to those who saw Him and heard Him and touched Him. As He told Philip later on: "Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father." John 14:9

No man could love anything unless he can get his arms around it, and the cosmos is too big and too bulky. But once God became a babe and was wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in a manger, men could say, "This is Emmanuel, this is God with us." By His reaching down to frail human nature and lifting it up to the incomparable prerogative of union with Himself, human nature became dignified. So real was this union that all of His acts and words, all of His agonies and tears, all of His thoughts and reasonings, resolves and emotions, while being properly human, were at the same time the acts and words, agonies and tears, thoughts and reasonings, resolves and emotions of the eternal son of God.




1st Year Nativity - Thank You!

The Magi, what do we know about them? For starters we know there was more than one since the word Magi is a plural of the Greek noun magos. How many there were? That is unclear. The accepted number is three since three gifts are described in Matt 2:11. We also know they are from the east. Where exactly they are from is also unclear. We do have one clue in that text that they are not Jewish because of the title they use when asking King Herod the question, "Where is the environment of the Jews?" This is a title that is used by Gentile nations. (Romans inscribed this title above the Cross.) This seems to confirm that they were not Jewish, or they would have asked for the newborn King of Israel. So these were Gentiles coming to see this newborn king. The third thing we read is they were following a star. They seemed to have significant knowledge of astronomy. This star that they follow has been the cause of significant debate. (Might I suggest a movie to watch called The Star of Bethlehem by Frederick Larson.) So many details left out seems to point to a deeper meaning of their search for this baby king. This is the first sign of Jesus gathering all nations unto himself. Those that truly encounter the Lord Jesus are never the same. Where might the Lord be inviting you to go? What direction do you feel the Lord Jesus is inviting you to extend yourself? (Resource: The True Meaning of Christmas by Michael Barber Chapter 9)
