#### **KEEPING YOU SAFE DURING COVID-19**


- Here at St. Ambrose we are continually working to keep you and your loved ones safe. We are still sanitizing every pew after every weekend Mass and focusing on touch surfaces on doors and in restrooms. We like to highlight that we have an abundance of fresh air mixed in our air handlers and we still add quite a bit of fresh air to the building even though we are in heating mode. For larger gatherings we have the ability to open the fresh air dampers even more - we take the air quality quite seriously. During the week the restrooms are sanitized and public areas are deep cleaned and limited to excessive use. If you have any questions about our protocols please reach out to the office and we'll be happy to answer them.
- Those who are sick, vulnerable or who care for others with underlying chronic health conditions, as well as those not feeling well, are encouraged to refrain from going to Church and remain at home. They are encouraged to watch and participate in livestreamed or televised Mass. You may call the parish office and request to receive Holy Communion at home.

St. Ambrose will permanently continue to offer our Sunday video Masses for shut-ins and those who are ill. Due to the size and health airflow in our chapel, mask wearing is optional. The reception of Holy Communion on the tongue, the universal norm of the Latin Rite, is again allowed. Please, if you are ill or think you might be ill whether with COVID or something else,



#### **Bible Bits**

#### <u>December 26, 2021</u>

One of the most mind-boggling verses in the entire Bible is Luke 2:52: "Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and Man." This Sunday we celebrate The Holy Family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus (Spanish: La Sagrada Familia, which is, by the way, the name of the magnificent still unfinished basilica in Barcelona designed by Spanish architect Antoni Gaudí). The holy family were pretty good examples for us, don't you think? The Gospel Reading is Luke 2:41-52 which describes Jesus as a 12-year old, separated from His frantic parents while discussing things "in my Father's house" (verse 49). With regards to verse 52: the all-knowing, all-powerful Creator of everything that exists, who is everywhere all at the same time throughout all time, advanced not only in age, but also in wisdom, and favor before God. The infinite One apparently became finite for a period of time. Nothing is impossible with God.




