#### **Bible Bits**

#### January 28, 2024

Capernaum was a village of about 1,200 people in the days when Jesus walked the earth, and it was the center of His ministry. Franciscan Fathers obtained this site which contains the ruins of that town in the late 1800s and have excavated what is left of the large synagogue built sometime between the second and fourth centuries AD. Underneath what is left of that building. excavations in the 1990s revealed the remains of an earlier synagogue, which experts say is the one in which Jesus taught, and indeed, was teaching in the account of this Sunday's Gospel Reading (Mark 1:21-28). It is exactly where He healed "a man with an unclean spirit" (verse 23). Nearby, are found the ruins of an ancient church, an enlargement of the house of the mother-in-law of Saint Peter. Her healing at the hands of Jesus is described in the passage immediately following this Sunday's Gospel Reading, as well as the fact that "He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons" (verse 34).

HOLY WATER: Holy water is a powerful sacramental as well as a common fixture in Catholic churches. There are often ornate stoups filled with holy

water right at the entrance to the church. You've probably dipped your fingers into these basins and made the sign of the cross without even thinking about it. Water has long been associated with God's saving deeds. It flowed from the rock as God's gift to the people of the Old Testament. The water of the Red Sea was divided to liberate God's people from slavery. Jesus was baptized in the water of the Jordan. He came walking on the water to calm the storm on the Sea of Galilee. and the ritual washings required before entering the temple for Jewish people were a precursor to Baptism. The use of holy water dates back to the first century and some sources relate its early usage to St. Matthew, although written documentation about its usage dates to the third or fourth century. Holy water is composed of two elements, water and salt. Water cleanses and purifies, reminding us that our souls have been washed and made pure by the water of holy Baptism. The salt, which is mixed with the water during the blessing, bears three symbolic meanings. First, salt preserves from corruption. Second, it is a symbol of wisdom. Finally, it flavors food. When added to the water, it helps make our souls pleasing to God. Holy water plays

a very important role in several Catholic rites. It is used for Baptisms; blessings of persons, places and objects; and as protection against evil and danger. It signifies repentance, rebirth, commitment, and devotion. It is a symbol of God's grace. There is no limit to where you can use holy water – Baptisms, blessing of Mass attendees, blessing of the sick, exorcism, cleansing of sins, blessing yourself, blessing your home and your family, blessing religious items, blessing your workspace, blessing your car, blessing wedding rings, and more. There is no standard prayer to utter when sprinkling holy water. You can say a simple prayer like: "By this holy water and by Your Precious Blood, wash away all my sins, O Lord. Amen" Or you can make the sign of the cross and then pray the Lord's Prayer or the St. Michael Prayer. Holy water is a powerful sacramental. It symbolizes purification and protection against evil. It reminds us of our close connection to God and is a constant reminder of faith and spirituality.
