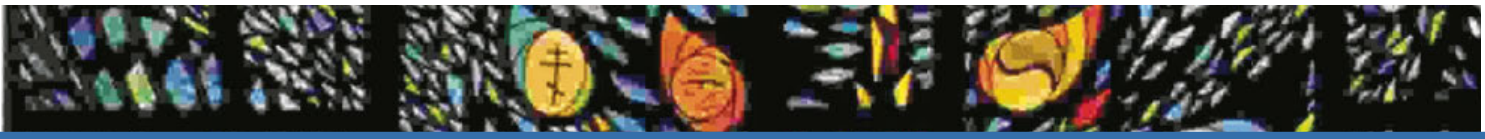

Bible Bits

September 29, 2024:

This Sunday's First Reading is Numbers 11:25-29, and the Gospel Reading is Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48. Both present the same teaching: Do not stand in the way of the preaching of the truth, even if it is coming from someone you think is an infidel! In Numbers, Joshua tells Moses (v 27), "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp," and in Mark's Gospel (v 38), "John said to Jesus, 'Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name . . . [who] does not follow us.'" This just can't be right! Eldad and Medad aren't ordained ministers; we need to stop this! And the response of Moses? Verse 29: "Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets." And what about the response of Jesus to John? Verse 39: "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us." Apparently people who aren't properly ordained and maybe even people from other religions can be used to accomplish God's work.

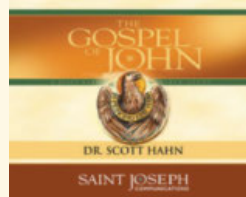

Mission Appeal: Father Andrew Siasa, a religious priest from the Apostolic Life Community of Priests in the Opus Spiritus Sancti, will speak at all weekend Masses at St. Ambrose next weekend, October 5th-6th. Fr. Andrew was ordained priest in 2014 in Moshi Tanzania. Since his ordination, Fr. Siasa has done parish ministry as the administrator in a parish in Tanzania, and at the seminary as a teacher, vice rector, and spiritual director. Currently, Fr. Andrew is a graduate student at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA.

As a young missionary community, the Apostolic Life Community of Priests in the Opus Spiritus Sancti have many needs. At present, they are facing the challenge of meeting the tuition fees for 77 major seminarians diligently studying both philosophical and theological studies at Jordan University in Morogoro, Tanzania. Any assistance they can get from this mission appeal will help support the formation of these young men who will soon move into the priesthood. From the Desk of the St. Ambrose Rosary Altar Society

WHAT IS THE FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS DEVOTION?

Our Lady promised to Lucia of Fatima, on 07/13/1917, that there would be a future manifestation concerning the practice of the Five First Saturdays. Lucia was a Postulant Sister in the Dorothean Convent at Tuy, Spain on 12/10/1925, when Our Lady appeared to her, together with the Child Jesus, who spoke first to Lucia: *"Have compassion on the Heart of your Most Holy Mother, covered with thorns which ungrateful men place therein at every moment, while there is no one who does an act of reparation to withdraw them for her."*

Our Lady then addressed Lucia as follows: *"...all who on the First Saturday of five consecutive months confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the purpose of making reparation to my Immaculate Heart."*

The five Saturdays refer to the five kinds of offenses and blasphemies against the Immaculate Heart of Mary, namely: blasphemies against her Immaculate Conception, against her perpetual virginity, against the divine and spiritual maternity of Mary, blasphemies involving the rejection and dishonoring of her images, and the neglect of implanting in the hearts of children a knowledge and love of this Immaculate Mother. This was revealed to Sister Lucia on 05/29/1930 as Our Blessed Lord appeared to her on that day.

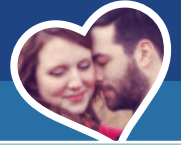
