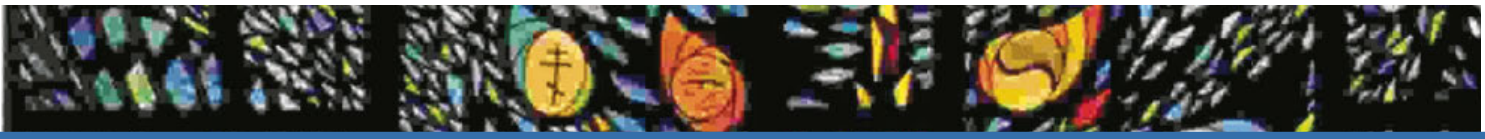

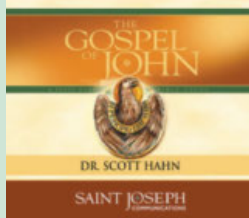
Campaign for Human Development

Bible Bits

November 10, 2024:

The Gospel Reading for this Sunday is Mark 12: 38-44, and it describes the hypocrisy of the Hebrew religious leaders (the scribes) by juxtaposing them with the poor widow who gave everything she had as an offering to God. Mark's Gospel is a compilation of the teachings of St. Peter according to the Apostolic Father Papias of Hierapolis. One of Mark's key depictions is that the people, even the disciples of Jesus, simply did not understand the nature of Christ's ministry, and what He wanted from His followers. And, in fact, most of us today usually fail to understand it. What He wants from us is to be completely humble and empty of self. Peter, through Mark, wants us to realize that the one who dies with the most toys might actually be a loser, as is the one who is only concerned about looking good, rather than being transformed into goodness. Wealth, power, and even piety, when it is simply for others to see, for appearances, isn't what Christ wants us to strive for.

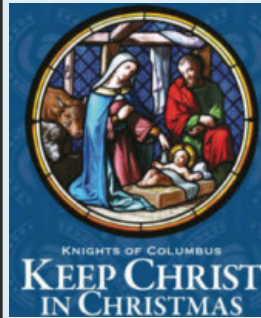

From the Desk of the St. Ambrose Women’s Guild

PRAYER: As Catholics and Christians, we are called to pray and to pray regularly and consistently. What is prayer? How do we pray? Where and when should we pray?



Prayer is simply talking to our Lord and cultivating a friendship with Him. It’s simply making time to spend time with a good friend, getting to know Him better, getting closer to Him, and learning to trust Him.

One can pray anywhere, anytime: while doing daily chores, at work, at school, in the car, and especially in church at Mass. No place is “off limits.” There are many opportunities to pray if we realize we do not have to be on our knees with our heads bowed — although this is always a great prayer posture.

Our Lord is waiting for us to come to Him, wanting to know what is on our minds and in our hearts. He wants us to share our concerns, cares, and lives with Him. If we are upset or angry with Him, tell Him. He already knows how you feel, so tell Him so He can begin to help you resolve whatever is bothering you.

Begin your day with a Morning Offering prayer. That way all you do during the day becomes a prayer. An example is: “Jesus, I offer You my thoughts, words, deeds, and suffering of this day for the intentions of Your Sacred Heart, in union with all the Masses being said throughout the world, in reparation for my sins, for the intentions of all my associates, and the general intentions recommended this month.” Another suggestion is to bless your children with holy water and pray the Saint Michael prayer with them as they leave for school, placing them in the protection of St. Michael during their day. The more frequently one spends time with our Lord, the more comfortable one becomes and the more graces one receives. Begin with ten to fifteen minutes in the morning and evening. As time goes on, gradually increase the time by five or ten minutes. Begin to explore the various types of prayer and your spiritual life will grow, broaden, and your trust in Him will strengthen.



Keep Kids Safe — Report

Suspicious: Be alert to situations in which you observe potentially inappropriate behavior between an adult and a child. Be aware of warning

signs that may indicate that a child is being abused, and do not delay in reporting any suspicions. If you observe or have reason to believe that a child, young person, or vulnerable adult has been subjected to abuse by a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Salt Lake City, you must report the alleged abuse to local law enforcement and state agencies (see <https://www.dioslc.org/offices/safe-environment/resources>), and you must notify the Diocesan Office of Safe Environment at 801-328-8641, x344.

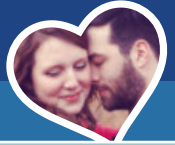
