FROM THE DESK OF FATHER JOHN



Blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it.

—Matthew 13: 16, 17

Jesus makes this statement to His disciples after He shares the parable with the large crowd and before the explanation which He provides to His disciples about the parable. This statement truly makes a lot of sense, to think about the disciples

of Jesus and the fact that they walked the same earth as our Savior did, and they broke bread with Him. They were there for the miracles of the multiplication of the loaves, bringing Lazarus back from the dead, enabling the blind to see, and the lame to walk. What an amazing time to live in. Truly a time that any prophet would have longed to be a part of.

I remember when I was at St. Jude Thaddeus Parish in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and Fr. Ford of the Dominican Order came from the Shrine of St. Jude Thaddeus in Chicago, Illinois, to give a Lenten Mission at the Parish. He brought with him a relic of St. Jude that is kept at the Shrine in Chicago. The relic is a bone from the arm of St. Jude. This relic is kept in a reliquary, a special container made for the sole purpose of safely holding a relic. Before the first mass that Fr. Ford celebrated he invited the lectors, extraordinary Eucharistic ministers, the deacon, and I to venerate the relic and even hold it. The relic, of course, remained in the reliquary. One of the extraordinary Eucharistic ministers mentioned after Mass how amazing it was to hold the relic in his hands for he was holding the arm that shook hands with Jesus, the arm that reached out to pat Jesus on the back. What an amazing time the apostles lived in, witnessing all that Jesus Christ did for humanity. The words of Christ found in our Gospel today are taken from Matthew 13:16-17 are so true, how blessed the disciples were to live in the day and time that they did.

As we ponder the parable about the seed and where it is sown, we can reflect on the fact that the prophet's words were sown in the world before Christ came into the world, like us in all things but sin. We in this present age were sown in the world after Christ was born of our Blessed Mother, was crucified, and rose from the dead. But the time the prophets lived in and the time we live in can be recognized as a blessed time. Our time is not limited to the seed landing on the path

or being among weeds. We can land on fertile soil just like the apostles did, and we too can produce an abundant harvest. It is important to remember that Christ pointed out to His disciples, as He explained the parable in our Gospel, that in any time the seed can land on less desirable soil and because of that poor soil it will not produce an abundant harvest. The challenge we have is making sure that the seed of faith that lands in us lands in fertile soil, and if it does not, we need to make the soil fertile.

We can think and ponder how amazing it would be to have been walking with Jesus and His apostles 2,000 years ago. Also, even though the prophets and Moses lived before Jesus Christ was born of Mary and came into this world, it would have been amazing to live in that time, waiting and preparing for the coming of the Messiah. Living in this present age, we might think we are in the least desirable of times, not the time of the prophets, or when Christ walked this earth, one like us in all things but sin. We are not in the times of the prophets, but we can still learn from their wisdom. We are not living in the time of Christ and the apostles, but we have the Sacraments which Jesus Christ instituted for His followers and the Church. Knowing that we can draw from the past and we have the example of the saints and all the faithful who have gone before us in faith, we live in a very desirable time. The past can and should be our compass helping us follow Christ in this world.

But for us to be the fertile soil where the seed of faith is planted, we need to do our part; we must absorb and learn from the saints who have gone before us in faith. It is not good enough for us to be aware of the past, we must learn from all that has gone before us. It must transform us. Then we will be that fertile soil in which the seed of faith is planted, and we produce an abundant harvest. Of course, we can also see ourselves as the seed, and how do we make sure that we are in fertile soil? We cannot just rely on where we first land, we must choose our soil, be it what we read, what we listen to or who we choose as our companions. We have a choice to make that will determine if we are able to produce an abundant harvest, so with God's grace and wisdom, may we choose wisely.

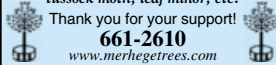
