Ask FATHER ANDRZEJ

Dear Father Andrzej,

My question is why were the Holy water fonts removed from the church entrances and will they be replaced? Is the Baptismal font supposed to be our source of Holy water when we enter and leave the Nave?

Thank you, Leonard

Dear Leonard,

Thank you for your question! The fonts at the church entrances were emptied due to concerns regarding the spread of the COVID-19 about a year and a half ago at the beginning of the pandemic. Catholic churches across the country removed holy water from their stoups as a precaution to help fight the spread of the virus. However, we are using this as an opportunity to return to the original intended purpose of our beautiful baptismal font in the center of our worship area.

The practice of crossing yourself and blessing yourself with holy water as you enter the church is a tactile re-commitment to your baptismal promises. It reminds us of the cleansing of our sins, and our union with Jesus. Our font was designed in the shape of a womb, overflowing just like God's love overflows and cannot be contained.

We do not have plans to replace the water at the entrances of the church, and would like to extend an invitation to all of you to recommit yourself to Christ at the beginning of every Mass by visiting our baptismal font before finding your seat. By walking down to the font, we hope that it becomes more of a conscious effort, rather than just something you do out of habit when you enter. You'll notice that I do it during the procession to the altar on the way in. You can also take the blessed water in the font home with you, if you'd like.



likeness of God, created to share in the very life of God himself. The human person is a "manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory" (EV 34). And we must reflect this truth in how we act and how we treat one another.

The truth of the Gospel of life is at the foundation of who we are as followers of Christ. In his earthly life, Jesus provided the perfect model for how we are to love our neighbor and live out the Gospel call: "Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt. 25:40).

Jesus calls each of us to "care for the other as a person for whom God has made us responsible" (EV 87). The Gospel of life is intrinsic to

the whole Christian life and foundational to the decisions we make on a daily basis. For, "the Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dianity of the person and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel" (EV 2, emphasis added).

In his encyclical on the Gospel of life, Pope St. John Paul II recognizes the full range of threats against human life, from poverty and malnutrition to murder and war. He places particular emphasis, however, on threats to life at its beginning and end precisely when it is most in need of protection. In modern times, children in their mothers' wombs and those approaching the end of their lives are certainly among the

"least of these" in our world's estimation. Practices such as abortion and assisted suicide tragically reject the truth that human life is always to be cherished and defended with loving concern.




