ASK FATHER ANDRZEJ

Dear Father Andrzej,

I never noticed the little maze behind the chapel before the Grounds Cleanup this past fall. What's that all about?

Dear Liz,

I'm happy to hear the cleanup efforts helped you notice something so special here at Pax. That "maze" is actually a prayer labyrinth; there is one way in and out, without any "dead" ends along the way like a maze would have.

The prayer labyrinth is meant for just that—prayer. Much like walking along a circuit that features the Stations of the Cross, a labyrinth gives your body an opportunity to move while in prayer —a quiet space to open yourself up to the voice of the Lord, especially if sitting in quiet is challenging.

There are many ways to pray with the labyrinth. One is to use the walk in to the center as a time of letting go of any cares and concerns you might have. The center represents divine illumination and Christ within—a place for receiving clarity and insight. Spend some quiet time in the center with the Lord and listen for His voice. The walk back out can be viewed as the path of Union with God, bringing back to the world a renewed vision or a refreshed spirit. To others the labyrinth might enhance your prayer life as a symbol of the world's complexities and difficulties, which we all experience in our "journey" through life.

We're not the only Catholic Church to feature a prayer labyrinth. It can be traced back to cathedrals in the Middle Ages. The Chartres Cathedral in France is probably the most well-known. Scholars theorize that many Catholics would make a vow to visit the holy city of Jerusalem, but the plague and other dangers made the journey unsafe. So they would walk through the labyrinths as a symbolic pilgrimage instead.

In our very busy and noisy world, I hope you can take advantage of the quiet and solitude our little prayer labyrinth might offer.


Upcoming Feasts: Candlemas & St. Blaise
