The Prayer the Catholic Church Needs

Bishop Oscar Solis is encouraging all of us to devote time for prayer. In particular, he wishes us to remember all victim-survivors of abuse, their families, and our Church, that in this difficult time, God will bless us with His mercy and love so that justice and peace will prevail.

Benedictine monk and priest Anthony Ruff writes that we need to pray the right prayer for right people at the right time in this time of crisis. Specifically, he advocates: “...what the pope and bishops most need right from us right now is our fervent prayers to the Holy Spirit for them. [They] need courage, wisdom, creativity, and sensitivity...It is precisely in situations such as this, ... that the Holy Spirit enflames hearts, enlightens minds, and loosens tongues. The Holy Spirit is, ... the font of life, fire of love, almighty hand, light for the senses, love for hearts, strength in infirmity, and divine guidance....Let us pray for the renewal and reform of the Catholic Church.”

All our prayers are needed now: for victims, church leaders, and a way forward. Come, Holy Spirit.

Heavenly Father: In every age, you have been our refuge. Yet again and still, we stand before you asking for your protection on your holy Church. For the victims of abuse and their families, pour out your healing and your peace.

Dear Parish Family,

In the gospel for this weekend from Mark 9, we hear, "Jesus took a little child, stood him in their midst, and putting his arms around him, said to [the disciples], **'Whoever welcomes a child such as this for my sake welcomes me...'**"

Why does Jesus single out a child to prove the point that whoever welcomes this child welcomes him? William Barclay, a Bible Commentator, sights this reason: "Because a child has no influence whatsoever; a child cannot advance a man's career or enhance his prestige; a child cannot give us things. On the contrary, it is the other way around: A child is dependent upon others for the necessities of life.

"There is a warning here. It is easy to cultivate the friendship of the person who can do things for us, and whose influence can be useful to us. It is easy to curry favor with the influential and the great, and to neglect the simple, humble, ordinary folk who need our help, for example, the homeless, the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, the imprisoned, the infirm, or *the child*.

"In effect, Jesus says that we shouldn't seek out those who can do things for us, but we should seek out those that we can do things for, because in this way, we are seeking the society of Jesus. This is another way of saying, 'As you did it to one of the least of my brothers, you did it for me.'" -- William Barclay

There are many people that we can do things for, but how providential is it that Jesus highlighted the children in today's gospel, which can and should be a sign for all of us (especially the clergy) that we need to do everything in our power to guide, guard and protect the children and youth within our parishes and schools.

On the front of our bulletin for this weekend, we have the *Prayer of the Church* which all of us are asked to pray so that we offer healing for the victims and their families, for the faithful men and women of the church and for Catholic bishops and priests around the world. May this prayer remind all of us that we are called to live the gospel message which is this: **"Whoever welcomes a child such as this for my sake, welcomes me..."**

Dear Parishioners,

During this period when people might be wondering whether they should leave the Catholic Church or stay, I would like to ask you to be my "eyes" and my "ears" in order to help me reach out to anyone who has left or is thinking about leaving so that I can offer my "ears" to them by listening to any pain or suffering they may be carrying at this time. As their family and friends, you can guide me in the right direction by leading me to those who might not make it a point to inform me about their departure. Fr Ken
