All Saints/All Souls: Commemoration of our final journey

Every November we keep festival in honor of All Saints. We join with the angels in joyful praise to the Son of God.

The Feast of All Saints underscores two fundamental truths. First, that our basic vocation, our very reason for existence, is *holiness of life*. Second, that *we are a pilgrim people*. We have here no lasting home. Our destiny in history is God and his gift of eternal life.

On the heels of All Saints, we remember All Souls. We remember our loved ones who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed underscores two fundamental truths complements to those mentioned above. First, each one of us must say, "At some particular moment I shall die; at any particular moment I could die." Second, though we cannot choose the circumstances of our death, we can and will choose the sort of life that will conclude.

What does this mean? God takes the initiative in the drama of salvation by moving us from sin to the grace of faith. He justifies us and through the sacraments takes away our sins. This is God, out of no motive other than love, working within us. We are not forced to do good works. Good works means growth in love of God and love of neighbor.

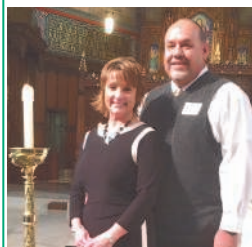
RCIA Brings Joy to Individuals And Families

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults [RCIA] is a program for people considering joining the Catholic Church, or for people who have been baptized, but have not received the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and/or Confirmation, or have not been fully catechized and wish to come into full communion with the Church.

We are blessed to have a wonderful team of sponsors and instructors who participate every year and are very devoted to their students. The sponsors often say that they, themselves learn something new every week. Besides learning about faith and growing spiritually, participants actually become a support group for each other on the journey of faith. Life-long friendships in community are formed.

Each year, thousands are received into the Catholic Church. In the past, inquirers were prepared in individual or small-group private sessions by a priest and were received at any time of the year. In 1971, in response to the Second Vatican Council, the Church dramatically revised the process of becoming Catholic and RCIA was born with laity teaching and entry on Holy Saturday. This was not really "new", but rather an effort to restore the spirit of early Christianity by emphasizing conversion as a participation in the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ, as well as the entire praying, witnessing and teaching Body of Christ in giving support and shape to the journey.

Frankie and Richard Harris are perfect examples of all the class embodies. Richard was searching for a faith he could believe in and Frankie, a baptized Catholic, was wishing to be in full communion with the faith in which she was raised. Richard along with other Catechumens and Candidates made their final commitment to become Catholic at the Cathedral of the Madeleine and signed the Book of Life. Theirs is a story of perseverance in faith.

Dear Parish Family,

In response to the 7,000 Central American migrants who are travelling close to 1,000 miles in order to flee violence and poverty, I read a quote from someone who said, *"If these people are not willing to stay in their country and fight for their rights, why would we want them in our country; they are cowards!"* Her written statement definitely caught me off guard and pricked my conscience enough to make me ponder this: If we only knew the extent of the violence that was taking place in their countries and how it felt to walk in their shoes, to defend their families from murder, and to scrounge around for food, would we be as quick to judge their plight without even blinking an eye or without lifting a finger to help or without opening our heart in a spirit of mercy, compassion and love?

It goes without saying that we can't rescue all the immigrants from every country, but let's pray that we don't fall into the temptation of believing, "I can't do everything, so I'm not going to do **ANYTHING**" or "I can't help everyone, so I am not going to help **ANYONE**." This mentality can lead us into complacency or indifference, while causing us to believe that world wars, world violence and world hunger are way too global for me and way out of my reach, so I'm just going to "close my eyes," turn off the TV, head for bed and pray for a good night's sleep. If we have any inclination to agree with the quote above which states that all these immigrants who are fleeing their country for ours, are "cowards," then we might want to meditate on this weekend's gospel where Jesus highlights the Two Great Commandments: 1) love of God and 2) love of neighbor.

None of us can do everything, nor can we help everyone; however, the gospel reminds us that all of us can do something through our prayers, our words and our actions by proclaiming that all people must be treated with the dignity that God has given to him or to her. To stand by and idly watch or listen to the cries of the oppressed make us just as guilty as the oppressors, for although we might not be guilty of the sin of **commission**, we automatically become guilty of the sin of **omission** just by our silence or lack of empathy towards the weak, the vulnerable, the persecuted, the ostracized and/or marginalized. Individually and collectively as a nation, we're going to have answer for the unborn, the widow, the orphan, the poor, the homeless, the immigrant, the drug addict, the death row inmate, the euthanized, etc. We are not going to be able to stand before God and claim our innocence regarding our neighbor's plight unless you and I have tried (in some small or big way) to make their lives just a little better.

Holly Richardson, an editor for the Salt Tribune, had this to say in the July 24th edition of this year: "44,440 were forcibly displaced from their homes every single day last year. That's one person every two seconds with a record of 16.2 million displaced in 2017... Last year, 73, 400 refugees were naturalized by one of 28 countries. Turkey granted citizenship to 50,000 Syrian refugees, followed by Canada with 10,500, the Netherlands with 6,600, France with 3,800 and Belgium with 1,900. In the U.S, there are now 642,700 people with pending claims in the U.S. government."

Seems a little overwhelming, doesn't it, but not to worry, because God is still in charge and reaching out to the poor through you and me as he tells us in today's gospel: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself!"

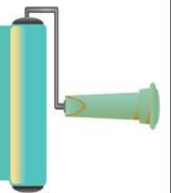
