FORMING A GRATEFUL HEART



“In all circumstance give thanks; for this is the will of God for you.” 1 Thessalonians 5:18

Happy Thanksgiving! Though Thanksgiving Day is not specifically a Catholic holy day, it certainly goes hand in hand with our life of faith. Spiritually speaking, we all know that gratitude is central to the Gospel message. Thanksgiving Day presents us with the perfect opportunity to look at this aspect of our faith. We are called to be eternally and deeply grateful. How grateful to God are you?

Perhaps we all struggle in various ways with gratitude. It’s fair to say that we will never be grateful enough until we are perfected in Heaven. But, for now, it’s important to look at gratitude and to try to let it increase in our souls.

First, we will never be grateful unless we see clearly all that God has done for us. It’s so easy in life to focus in on all the struggles we face and, as a result, to get down, depressed, frustrated and even angry at times. What’s far more challenging is to look beyond the crosses and burdens we face each day to see the abundance of grace and mercy given to us by our Lord. Unless we see that mercy and grace, we will struggle greatly with authentic gratitude.

So, on this Thanksgiving Day, reflect upon this simple question: Do I see all God has done for me? Do I see His abundance of mercy alive in my life?

The Scripture above guides us toward having hearts formed in gratitude. It is how God wants us to live. The bishop of our diocese uses a Latin phrase from the Lord’s prayer as his motto: *Fiat Voluntas Tua*, meaning, *Thy will be done*. St. Paul’s letter to the Thessalonians tell us God’s Will is to have an attitude of gratitude. Sounds simple, but how could we possibly live this way? It’s easy: if we are a people of the Eucharist (a word meaning Thanksgiving), then we are on the way to living our lives in accordance with God’s Will. Also, if you can humbly admit you struggle with having an attitude of gratitude, you will be praying for the grace of the Sacrament to foster the deeper gratitude you ought to have. Being grateful means you see the truth clearly regarding God’s Will for your life. Be open to that truth and God will change your life as He fills you with joy and forms your heart in thankfulness!

Dear Parishioners,

There is a story of a mother mouse and her two baby mice searching high and low for food there in the basement. After spending hours and finding nothing, the mouse gathers her two baby mice together and says, "Now listen up, you and I are going to have to climb the steps slowly and sneak into the kitchen, but we must be very quiet because Felix, the cat, is prowling around looking to devour the first mouse he can catch. Felix can sense, smell and hear us from miles away, so we must try and be as quiet as a mouse.

After giving her baby mice these instructions, the three of them slowly and quietly climbed the steps of the basement. As soon as they got to the top of the stairs, they crept under the door, and found themselves standing right in the middle of the kitchen, and guess who was right there to greet them while licking his chops, none other than Felix, the cat. Needless to say, all three of the mice froze right there in their tracks.

The mother mouse quickly put her baby mice right behind her, and with boldness in her voice, she disguised her voice and yelled, "Bow Wow!" Felix, the cat, immediately arched his back, the hairs of his fur stood straight up, and Felix darted out of the kitchen as if a dog was chasing him.

The mother mouse then turned to her mice and said, "**See, now you know why I keep telling you about the importance of learning a second language!**"

In our lifetime, you and I can learn a few languages, but the language that you and I need to learn the most is the language of God, the language of the bible, the language of prayer. With the Word of God in our hearts and on our lips, we can face every anxiety, every problem, every burden and every trial. As I have said many times before, we don't need to be afraid of the devil; the devil has to be afraid of us because you and I have the power of God within us: "You belong to God, children, and you have conquered them [evil spirits], for the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world" (1 John 4:4). You and I don't have to be like scared mice, afraid of our own shadow, because we know the power of God's Spirit within us: "For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather of power and love and self-control" (2 Timothy 2:7)...and along with the Ghostbuster's theme song, we can sing, "I Ain't Afraid of No Ghosts!"

With the author of this weekend's Psalm, we can boldly proclaim, "**I set the Lord ever before me; with him at my right hand I shall not be disturbed. Therefore my heart is glad and my soul rejoices, my body, too, abides in confidence; because you will not abandon my soul to the netherworld, nor will you suffer your faithful one to undergo corruption.**" (Psalm 16)

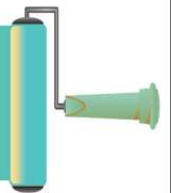
