Prayer for Epiphany

Dear Jesus,

Though a newborn, the wise men knew your greatness. On a hint from the heavens, they traveled far from their places of comfort so that they could honor you. From their belief in your divinity, they gave amazing gifts, offerings that symbolized your life, power, and even your death. And because of a dream in the night, they altered their well-laid plans to return home in order to protect you. May we be so willing to honor, sacrifice, believe, and obey, all for love of you, as we meditate on the meaning of your Epiphany. Amen.

In His Image

Christmas can get a little complicated after Midnight Mass is over. We are called to consider the **Epiphany of the Lord**. In other words, we are to marvel at how the birth of a little child in Bethlehem continues to change the world.

Epiphany: an experience of a sudden and striking realization; "festival of the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles."

Manifestation: proof of the reality of something; the act of appearing or becoming clear; a sign that shows something clearly.



I have a favorite painting that has helped me understand the Epiphany. It's called, 'In His Image' by artist William Zdinak. In it, the face of Jesus is formed by an arrangement of the faces of famous people: Dr. Jonas Salk, Senator Robert Kennedy, Mahatma Gandhi, President John F. Kennedy, Pope John XXIII, Martin Luther King, Bishop Fulton Sheen, Pope Paul VI and Alexander Graham Bell. There are also faces of members of the artist's family. In other words, Christ's

Epiphany is manifested in people – strangers, family, along with the famous.

The story behind this painting is also an Epiphany. According to Zdinak, he had forgotten his commission to create a painting for a religious art show when he got a phone call reminding him that it began the next day. He pleaded for one more day and went to work. After numerous failed sketches, at 2:00 AM he threw his brushes in the floor in frustration. Then came the vision. He raced around his house looking for every face that he could find to form the face of Jesus, finishing just in time for the show. Zdinak called it *In His Image*, the image of God in the face of Jesus formed by many faces of humanity.

While there are recognizable faces, Zdinak says, "It doesn't really matter which people are depicted. We are all one in Christ as St. Paul has told us. Hurting one, we hurt all; helping one, we help all. That is the idea behind – 'In His Image'."

And, in a sense, that is Epiphany: when we learn to see Christ in others, in ourselves, and in every created part of this wonderful world we live in.

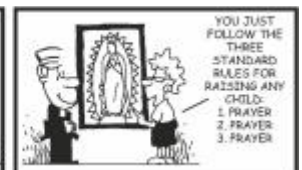

Dear Parish Family,

“Where is the new born king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.” In today’s gospel, whether there were three wise men or many, these wise men or magi represent the whole world that longs to search for the child Jesus in order that all of us, whether Jew or Greek, slave or free, male or female can bow down and worship Jesus as the Word Made Flesh, as the Light of God that has come into the world.

Today, as we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, we celebrate the revelation of the Word Made Flesh, the revelation of the Light of God that is not only revealed to the magi through the star rising in the East, but that is revealed to you and me through the birth of Christ whose light continues to burn brightly in your soul and mine.

In today’s gospel, we hear how the magi had to travel hundreds of miles by camel. As parishioners, you only have to travel a few miles by car, and some of you even live close enough to the church that you could walk to St. Marguerite within a few minutes in order to experience the same light, grace and blessing that the magi beheld there in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago. Each and every time you and I celebrate Mass, we get to visit Bethlehem. In the Mass, it’s not as if we are in Bethlehem trying to worship a King that we cannot see; we are in Bethlehem because the birth of Christ takes place on our altars in every Mass through the transubstantiation, through the changing of the bread into Christ’s body and the changing of the wine into Christ’s blood. In every Mass, the priest extends his hands over the gifts and prays, “Lord, let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of Christ.” With this form and matter, Christ is made present!

Today, as we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, let us pray that we will have the same desire and joy of the magi to seek Jesus, the King of the Jews, by seeking Jesus in Mass, first and foremost, on a weekly basis, if not on a daily basis, amounting to a total of 52 weeks out of the year. Considering the fact we don’t have to travel hundreds of miles by camel to get here, 52 weeks out of the year, including six Holy Days of Obligation, is not asking a lot for you and me during a period of 365 days.

Let us pray for that same desire, hunger and thirst that the magi had so that we can pray, “Where is the new born king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.”

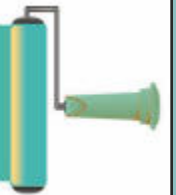
