The True Miracle of Cana

It was a hot, steamy day in June when I visited the Wedding Church in *Kafr Kanna* or *Cana* in the Holy Land a few years ago. I was in the company of 12 married couples who were going to renew their wedding vows at the site of Jesus' first miracle.

Anticipation was high, yet the church gave cool respite from the heat as everyone tried to calm their anxieties over this special moment. On average, they were each celebrating at least 20 years of marriage; one was 35 years. Oh bless these and all married couples, Lord!

I looked around for those big jars of water, imagining what it must have been like to fill them, carry them to Jesus, and watch him give the blessing that turned the water into the finest wine, as his mother, Mary requested. Our guide explained the jars were at least 36 inches high and held 20-30 gallons of water or wine. Super big!

A small bottle of wine from Cana still sits in my box of souvenirs from that pilgrimage. Seeing it today, I remember and pray for all married couples: for the grace to live their love in covenant with Christ. I also remember my own parents who made it to 46 years of marriage before my father died. Bless them, Lord!

My thoughts at reading the Gospel for today also turn to our children who are the first witnesses of the fruits, joys, struggles, and blessings of our marriages. They model the love they see at home and use it to form their future families. Bless the children, Lord!

In Galatians 5:22-23, we read of the fruits of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Perhaps, they are the "wine" from the "water" transformed by Jesus' miracle. Just look around at the families in our parish! They are witnesses of the transformation of the love of a couple, expressed in the love of Christ, expanded to family love, shared with the faith of a parish, and extended to the community where we live, work, shop, learn, and play. Oh bless our families, Lord!

Imagine what would happen if we all did as the Blessed Mother asks and brought our tears, joys, struggles, and lives to Christ so he could turn them into dancing, love, and family. Perhaps, this is the true miracle of Cana: not just changing water into wine but transforming and multiplying the love of two to three and more. Let us proclaim these marvelous deeds to all the nations!

Dear Parish Family,

“Then Jesus straightened up and said to [the woman caught in adultery], ‘Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?’ She replied, ‘No one sir.’ Then Jesus said, ‘Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more’ (John 8:10).

As we enter into the 46th Anniversary of Roe vs. Wade this coming Tuesday, January 22nd, we need to speak out against abortion, we need to defend the unborn, we need to pray for an end to this evil, AND we need to offer HEALING to all mothers and fathers involved in abortion.

The words of Jesus, “Neither do I condemn you,” were not just for the woman caught in adultery; they were (and are) for you and me TODAY, no matter what sins we have committed, even if those sins involved murder, abortion, adultery, etc. We need to remember that Jesus challenged the woman caught in adultery by saying, “Go and from now on do not sin any more,” but even before he challenged her, he consoled and comforted her by saying, “Has no one condemned you...neither do I condemn you.”

As a church, we are not here to “shake our finger” in people’s faces and to condemn them to a life a misery because they committed a mortal sin or a serious crime; we are here to, first of all, recognize that there is a not a single one of us who can “throw the first stone” because of our own sins, and to, second of all, recognize that we are called to be the “heart and hands” of Christ as best as we can by announcing his mercy, compassion, forgiveness and love, just as our Psalm for this weekend proclaims, “Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations. Announce his salvation, day after day. Tell his glory among the nations; among ALL peoples, his wondrous deeds.

Do you think that Norma McCorvey, whose legal challenge that led to the U.S. Supreme Court’s decision that legalized abortion, would have ever recanted and spoken out against abortion later on in her life if she had not received mercy from God and many others years after Roe v. Wade?

“After the court’s ruling regarding Roe vs. Wade, McCorvey went through quite a conversion cycle: Her 1994 autobiography, “I Am Roe: My Life, Roe v. Wade, and Freedom of Choice,” included abortion-rights sentiments along with details about dysfunctional parents, reform school, petty crime, drug abuse, alcoholism, an abusive husband, an attempted suicide and lesbianism.

“In August of 1994, she became a Catholic. Though she was still against abortion, she said she had reservations about the group’s confrontational style. McCorvey formed her own group, Roe No More Ministry in 1997 and travelled around the U.S. speaking out against abortions.”-- Jamie Stengle and Diana Heidgerd (Associated Press)

McCorvey wrote a book called, “Won By Love.” She didn’t write a book called, “Won By Chastisement.” Apparently, and correct me if I am wrong, she must have heard the voice of God say, “**Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more.**”
