Like a Seal on Our Hearts

The journey of faith, hope, and love continues for our parish candidates in the RCIA program. Just a few weeks ago they studied the sacrament of Confirmation.

The class began with the song composed by Carey Landry, *Like a Seal On Your Heart*, inspired by the Bible verse from *Song of Songs 8:6*. In the Rite of Confirmation, the celebrant says to the Confirmandi, "Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit". The response to this profound invocation is, "Amen".

Being sealed involves a spiritual activity of being made known to God in a special way, being filled with the gifts of God's presence in our souls, being marked with a symbol of belonging to God, being enrolled in God's service to make the world a better place and receiving the promise of Divine protection.

The seal is imparted through an anointing with chrism oil – one of the oils blessed by Bishop Solis during Holy Week (or just prior). The Chrism is a sign of the Holy Spirit and the anointing (along with the laying on of hands) is an ancient symbol of imparting the Holy Spirit to the baptized.

The gift of the Holy Spirit, then, is that particular sacramental grace which beautifies our lives with the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. In other words, we are empowered with supernatural charisms (gifts/talents) to increase our charitable acts, to witness the Christian faith, and to help grow the Body of Christ and follow our baptismal call.

If only we could imagine this seal on our hearts, giving us the strength – the grace – to do God's Will and fulfill our ministry as priest, prophet, and servant of the kingdom! Because through the sacrament of Confirmation, we too, are able to claim, like Jesus, that the Spirit of the Lord is upon us because he has anointed us to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to the captives, recovery of sight to the blind, freedom for the oppressed, and a year of favor from the Lord (IS 61:1+).

Dear Parish Family,

As I write this article for the bulletin on January 18, we are on Day 28 of the Government Shutdown, and who knows, our government may still be “shutdown” by the time this bulletin is printed, published and delivered to us for the weekend of January 25-26, the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time. At this time, only God knows how long the shutdown will last and how long it will take the Republicans and the Democrats to realize that “stand-offs” like this do not always accomplish their goals, but on the contrary, weaken the government and our nation as a whole.

Correct me if I am wrong, but I believe that shutting down the government is like “shooting ourselves in the foot” or “cutting off our nose to spite our face,” because whether we are Republicans or Democrats, rich or poor, native or foreigner, we are all members of the one Body of Christ, and therefore, “If one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members share it’s joy” (1 Cor. 12:26). In regards to our present government shutdown, we don’t have to look too far to see how this principle of “the one body” has impacted not only the 800,000 Federal Employees, but how it has impacted their spouses, children, extended families and many parts of our society as people “scramble” around to make ends meet, pay their bills and put food on the table.

Because this shutdown has had a negative impact on our nation, I don’t believe that this weekend’s gospel about the “one body of Christ” is accidental or coincidental, but providential, because St. Paul tells us in our second reading, “The body is one and has many members, but all the members, many though they are, are one body, and so it is with Christ. It was in one Spirit that all of us, whether Jew or Greek, slave or free, were baptized into one body” (1 Cor. 12:12,13).

This passage from St. Paul is one of the most famous pictures of unity of the Church ever written. Men have always been fascinated by the way in which the different parts of the body **co-operate**, and so I think that this is a great time for Congress, for the House and the Senate, and for all of us within the nation to capitalize on this word, “**co-operation**” at this point in time. I like the advice of William Barclay, a bible commentator, regarding this particular passage of the one body:

- 1) “We ought to realize that we **need each other**: There can be no such thing as isolation. Far too often we become so engrossed in the bit of the work that we are doing and so convinced of its supreme importance that we neglect or even criticize others who have been chosen to do other work.
- 2) We ought to **respect each other**: In the body there is no question of whose job is more important. If any limb or any organ ceases to function, the whole body is thrown out of gear. It is so with the Church: All service ranks the same with God.
- 3) We ought to **sympathize with each other**: The Church is a whole: The person who cannot see beyond his or her own organization, the person who cannot see beyond his congregation, worse still, the person who cannot see beyond his or her own family circle, [race or nation], has not even begun to grasp the real unity of the Church.” -- William Barclay


Loving God, as we endure the Government Shutdown and face the issue of immigration, the wall security at the border, may we always know that we are all members of one body! Love, Fr. Ken

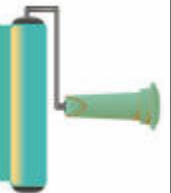
