WE BELIEVE IN THE RESURRECTION OF THE DEAD AN OVERVIEW OF CATHOLIC FUNERAL RITES

“At the death of a Christian, whose life of faith was begun in the waters of Baptism and strengthened at the Eucharistic table, the Church intercedes on behalf of the deceased because of its confident belief that death is not the end, nor does it break the bonds forged in life.” (Order of Christian Funerals, no. 4)

The Catholic funeral rite is divided into three parts, each with its own purpose and distinct location.

The **Vigil Service** is a time in which the Christian community keeps watch with the family in prayer. The Service usually takes place during the period of visitation and viewing at the funeral home. It consists of a Service of the Word with readings from Scripture and prayers and may be accompanied by music and reflections. Since this is a time to remember the life of the deceased and to commend him/her to God, the Church encourages eulogies to be done at the funeral home during the Vigil Service.

The **Funeral Liturgy** is the central liturgical celebration of the Christian community for the deceased. The Church encourages the celebration of the funeral liturgy at a Mass in the parish church. When Mass cannot be celebrated, a funeral liturgy outside Mass may be celebrated in the funeral home. At the funeral liturgy, the Church gathers to give praise and thanks to God for Christ's victory over sin and death, to commend the deceased to God's tender mercy and compassion, and to seek strength in the proclamation of the Paschal Mystery. The funeral liturgy, therefore, is an act of worship, and not merely an expression of grief.

The **Rite of Committal**, the conclusion of the funeral rite, is the final act of the community of faith in caring for the body of its deceased member. It is celebrated beside the open grave or place of interment. In committing the body to its resting place, the community expresses the hope that, with all those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith, the deceased awaits the glory of the resurrection. The Rite of Committal is an expression of the communion that exists between the Church on earth and the Church in heaven: the deceased passes with the farewell prayers of the community of believers into the welcoming company of those who need faith no longer but see God face-to-face.

Dear Parish Family,

In our first reading from the book of the Prophet Jeremiah, God reminds us, in more than one way, about the First Commandment: Thou shall not have other gods before me! We might think that this commandment just applies to worshipping foreign gods or other deities, but it entails much more: It includes all the people, places and things that we put before God, and therefore, the Lord tells us through the Prophet Jeremiah in our first reading, "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord" (Jeremiah 17:5).

As pastors, we run into a few people in the parish who believe that they can worship God on Sunday, and still dabble in New Age practices by relying on other mediums such as fortune tellers, psychics, palm readers, horoscopes, Ouija boards, eight balls, tarot cards, crystals, etc, anything that is going to give them some information about their deceased relatives OR give them insight into the future. I'm confident that many, if not most people who pursue these mediums are not consciously thinking that they are serving other gods; however their actions definitely speak for themselves and convey this message to God: "I trust you to be my Good Shepherd, but I am still dependent on these other sources to be my light and guide on my journey through life.

Are these mediums actually forbidden and condemned by God and Scripture, or is this just a personal opinion of the pastor of St. Marguerite here in Tooele, Utah? Believe it or not, God clearly banned occult behavior from the lives of his people, especially before they entered the Promised Land. Before the people crossed the Jordan River, Moses addressed the people with the message of the Lord:

"When you come into the land which the Lord your God gives you, you shall not learn to follow the abominable practices of those nations. There not be found among you any one who burns his son or daughter as an offering, anyone who practices divination, a soothsayer, or an augur (that is an enchanter, one who looks for and uses omens), or a sorcerer, or a charmer, or a medium, or a wizard, or a necromancer. For whoever does these things is an abomination to the Lord; and because of these abominable practices the Lord your God is driving them out before you" (Deuteronomy 18:9-12).

If you and I have been involved in any of these prohibitions listed in the Book of Deuteronomy or in the list I just gave regarding New Age practices, let's confess our sins to God through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, amend our lives, and recommit ourselves to abiding by the First Commandment: Thou shall not have other gods before me.

In the booklet called, "Spiritual Warfare Prayers," the author has this prayer: "Heavenly Father, in the name of your only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, I denounce Satan and all his works, all forms of witchcraft, the use of divination, the practice of sorcery, dealing with mediums, channeling with spirit guides, the Ouija board, astrology, Reiki, hypnosis, automatic writing, horoscopes, numerology, all types of fortune telling, palm readings, levitation and anything else associated with the occult or Satan. I denounce and forsake my involvement in all of them in the name of Jesus Christ who came in the flesh and by the power of his cross, his blood and his resurrection."

May the words of the Lord through the Prophet Jeremiah remind us to keep our eyes fixed on him: "Cursed is the one who trusts in human beings, who seeks his strength in the flesh, whose heart turns away from the Lord" (Jeremiah 17:5).
