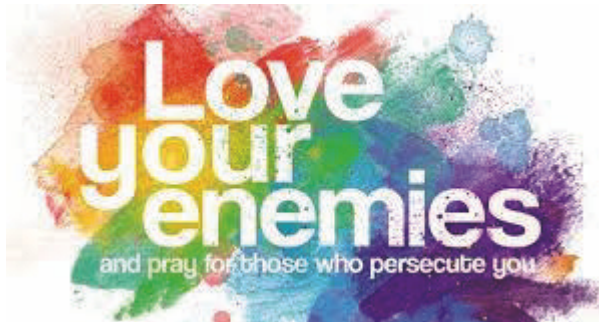

How do we celebrate ourselves and our diverse community?
Colors! Dances! Food! Fiesta! Fund raising!

Let me tell you about an interesting new ministry in our parish. “The Margaritas” are a special group of eight women who love to help people rejoice in God’s love with dances, colorful costumes, delicious food, and funding the parish.

Wearing traditional dresses from Mexico, these lovely ladies delight in sharing their special talents. The group includes: Victoria Hurtado, Rosalva Martínez, Carmen Carillo, Blanca León, Lucita Aguilar, Kassandra Horta, Eva Herrera, and Rosario Tovar.

They started their ministry prior to last year’s Parish Fall Festival. It was during that celebration that DJ Rich Valdez bestowed the name, Las Margaritas, on them. Since then they have prepared several succulent breakfast fund raisers and shared special dances during the festivities for Our Lady of Guadalupe. Dances are their favorite part of their ministry. It takes months to learn each dance, rehearsing once or twice a week for several hours. At present, they know 4 traditional dances. Each dance requires a special costume. They are handmade and come directly from Mexico.

One dance in particular is called the *Pineapple Blossom* or *Flor de Piña*. It is performed only by women and conveys the joy of being a woman through a good pineapple harvest. Dancing is mentioned often in the Bible and is used throughout the Old Testament as a means of worship and praise to God and as a sign of God’s healing graces. Along with King David, Saints Theresa of Avila, Philip Neri, and Gerard Majella, many holy people danced to show their love for God. We are blessed to have the Margaritas lead our parish celebrations in this way, too.

Dear Parish Family,

"Abraham Lincoln left for all history a magnificent drama of holiness through his desire to be reconciled with those who hated him. When he was campaigning for the presidency, one of his arch-enemies was a man named Edwin McMasters Stanton. For some reason Stanton hated Lincoln and used every ounce of his energy to degrade Lincoln in public, even going as far as yelling at him in front of a large gathering by saying, 'Mr. Lincoln, you are nothing but a two-faced liar.' Abraham Lincoln could have shot back with some words of anger, vengeance and spite, but instead he calmly looked at Mr. Stanton and said, 'Do you think if I had two faces, I would be wearing this one?'"

In spite of all this harassment, Lincoln was elected as the 16th President of the United States, and so when the day finally came for President Lincoln to choose the all-important post of Secretary of War, who do you think he chose to fill this post? None other than Mr. Stanton, his arch-enemy, which definitely caused an uproar within the cabinet, especially when advisor after advisor stated, "Mr. President, you must be crazy. You're making a big mistake. Do you not know that Mr. Stanton spent a good deal of his time and energy during your campaign saying ugly things about you in order to sabotage your election?"

President Lincoln responded quickly to their concerns by saying, "Yes, I know Mr. Stanton and all the ugly things he has said about me, but after looking over the nation, I find that Mr. Stanton is the best man for the job." As the story goes, Mr. Stanton became President Lincoln's Secretary of War and rendered an invaluable service to the nation and to the president. When President Lincoln was assassinated, Mr. Stanton stood near the coffin of the man he once hated and said, "President Lincoln was definitely one of the greatest men who ever lived."

Unlike President Lincoln and Mr. Stanton, thanks be to God that we do not have any divisions within our present day government between the Republicans and the Democrats or between President Trump and Mrs. Nancy Pelosi. We are all "united" as one nation under God; however, if we were not, President Lincoln's love for his arch-enemy would be a good lesson for our government and for all of us in our nation to take heed, especially with the message of this weekend's gospel which proclaims, "**Jesus said to his disciples, 'To you who hear me, I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you; bless those who curse you and pray for those who maltreat you...'**" (Luke 6:1)

Because President Lincoln followed the advice of Jesus and didn't believe in the philosophy which states, "*An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth,*" President Lincoln was able to cause a ripple effect of holiness which began with one man, Mr. Stanton, and which spread throughout Washington D.C. and impacted the entire nation. Whether we believe it or not, each and every one of us, like President Lincoln, has the power within us to create the same ripple effect of holiness within our family and local community here in Tooele and St. Marguerite...if... we have the courage to take the leap of faith and to start turning our enemies into our friends, one enemy at a time.

There are some who believe in the philosophy, *an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth*, but you and I, as Christians, must truly believe that the cross of Christ is not only God's answer to the wrath of the Sadducees and the rage of the Pharisees; the cross of Christ is God's answer to any anger or hatred that we may have towards others. If we are not allowing the cross of Christ to transform our hatred towards our enemies into our love for our neighbor, then perhaps you and I are not embracing the cross as Christ intended, just as Christ tells us today in the gospel, "**I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.**"
