There's a Pelican in the Church!



Below the crucifix in the Cathedral of the Madeleine is a painting of a mother pelican with her 3 chicks. A similar image is carved into a pillar at the Cenacle, the upper room in Jerusalem where tradition holds Jesus shared the Last Supper with his apostles and instituted the Eucharist. The pelican and chicks image is often found on the doors of a tabernacle; the front of the altar; a hanging cloth in front of the lectern or ambo; a stained-glass window in the sanctuary area; a decorative design on a chalice or chasuble; or even on the ends of pews.

Why is the pelican image found in these places? The answer lies in some interesting parallels between the mother pelican and her chicks with Christ and his followers.

Whenever a mother pelican is unable to find food for her chicks, she uses her beak to poke holes in her breast until she bleeds and the chicks are nourished with their mother's blood. Similarly, the side of Jesus was pierced by the soldier's sharp, pointed spear to give us eternal life. Blood flows from the pelican's breast, and blood flowed from Jesus' side.

The mother pelican represents Christ; the chicks represent us. Chicks live in the safety of the nest, while we dwell in the shelter of the Church. The mother pelican is the head of the nest, while Christ is head of the Church. With an intense concern for her chicks, it is against the pelican's nature to allow any of them to perish; likewise, Jesus loves us with an everlasting love and wants none of us to perish. The pelican's blood is drink for her chicks, and the blood of Jesus is "true drink" that gives us eternal life (JN 6:54-55). The mother pelican gives her life that her chicks might live, and Jesus laid down his life that we might live (Jn 15:13).

Because of these striking similarities, the mother pelican and her chicks have come to represent the Eucharist, as well as, redemption and salvation. Thus, we may prayerfully consider the words of the song, *The Pelican*, by John Bennet.

As from her bloodied breast the Pelican gives life to given life and dies to save, so Christ upon the cross, so God in man, took iron through his flesh to close the grave.

Dear Parish Family,

As we celebrate the Second Week of Lent, we get to hear the story of the Transfiguration: In Luke's gospel which we are reading from this weekend, Luke states that Jesus took Peter, John, and James and "went up the mountain to pray," whereas in Matthew's gospel, Mathew states that Jesus took Peter, James and John up a high mountain "by themselves." Although both gospel accounts are accurate, I prefer Matthew's account because of those two words, "by themselves" which can, could and should give us the sense that Jesus is somehow taking these three disciples on a spiritual journey or retreat up a high mountain "by themselves," apart from others so that they can separate themselves from the world for a little while in order to experience the peacefulness, silence, quiet and solitude of another dimension, namely the Kingdom of Heaven.

From time to time, Facebook posts pictures of a get-a-way cabin next to a lake high up in the mountains with the inscription, "Would you be willing to live without a cell-phone and a computer for a few days if you could camp up here for a while?" So far, I haven't seen anybody post this response: "No way—I need my cell phone and computer 24/7!"

Just as Jesus took Peter, James and John up that high mountain "by themselves," he's asking you and me to be "holy," to set ourselves a part from the rest of the world, to make a distinction between the followers of Christ and the followers of the world, and yes, to find some time yearly, weekly, monthly and daily to talk to him one on one with no other people or distractions around us. Jesus took these three disciples up the mountain "TO PRAY!"

Do not get me wrong—you and I can experience God wherever we are at, whether we are alone on top of a high mountain or whether we are surrounded by thousands of people at Disney Land; however, before we can experience God all around us, we need to first of all develop that one on one relationship with him where he can speak directly and intimately to our souls as if you and I were the only person who existed in the world. Knowing that God wants to spend quality time with you and me should fill us a deep sense of honor, respect and humility to say the least. Like Elizabeth who said, "Who am I that the mother of my Lord should come to me," we should be able to say, "Who am I that my Lord should want to be with me like he was with Peter, James and John apart from the rest of the world."

Get this, when Jesus was transfigured there on Mt. Tabor where his face shone brighter than the sun and his clothes became "dazzling white," Jesus wasn't transfigured in the presence of everyone for the whole world to see; he was just transfigured in the presence of those three disciples who were willing to leave relatives, friends, work, etc. in order to follow Christ. With that in mind, can you imagine how the light of Christ that was present there on Mt. Tabor can enlighten our minds, hearts and souls each and every time you and I are willing to break away in order to spend some one on one time with Christ? Yes, Mass is the greatest prayer of all, but in order for us to get the most out of the Mass every Saturday/Sunday, we need to capture Christ's light during the week.

May this Season of Lent offer you and me an opportunity to climb that "mountain." Mt. Tabor might be out of the question, but God is willing to speak to us wherever we are at, even in the quietness of a bedroom. Happy Lent! In Christ, Fr. Ken
