The Greatest "Yes" The World Has Ever Known

It was in a small village in Alabama where I discovered how a tiny word uttered over two thousand years ago has become the model for all baptized people to exercise free will and respond to God's call to holiness.

During Mass for the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord in 2001, a special moment was added right after the homily. All religious sisters, brothers, and priests attending that Mass were asked to stand and renew their vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. I knew they had all taken these vows at some point in their vocations, but I had never heard them recited.

While I don't remember the exact words they said, I recall they promised to keep their sacred commitment made publicly before God and the Church to live a life of total availability in service to God and God's people: in freedom from material goods, to live completely for God, and to care for and serve God's people as Missionary Servants (their particular charism).

It was a prayerful, solemn moment that I witnessed, but wasn't allowed to participate in. So, I simply sat there, listened, and imagined how it must have been for our Blessed Mother to have made her vow to the Archangel Gabriel as she humbly responded, "Let it be done to me according to your Word." (Luke 1:38)

Mary's response is often called a *fiat*, which is a Latin verb for to make or to do. It's just a tiny word, but it conveys a firm decision to carry out, in this case, God's Will, that the Word (Jesus) would be conceived and brought to birth in her. This special "yes" marked the beginning of a continuous flow of graces to Mary that would mark her as a holy person.

In the crucial Vatican II document, *Lumen Gentium*, the Church proclaimed we (the baptized) are all called to holiness, to perfect ourselves in love with the graces of our baptism and throughout our lives as Christians. It's a enormous challenge, but if we are serious about our faith, we can take a moment on March 25 to prayerfully make Mary's Annunciation our annunciation.

In the words of the David Haas song based on the words of the prophet Micah, "We are called to act with justice. We are called to love tenderly. We are called to serve one another, to walk humbly with God." (Micah 6:8).

May our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, almsgiving, Eucharist, and Reconciliation prepare us to live out our personal vocations as we respond to God's call for justice, love, service, and humility and help us grow in holiness.

Dear Parish Family,

The Samaritan Women, whom we hear about this weekend on the 3rd Sunday of Lent, had a life changing experience. Because of her former lifestyle, she was a woman who was despised, rejected and persecuted. Like Adam who had to hide in the Garden of Eden because of his sin, this woman went to the well at a certain time during the day hoping no one would see her, but little did she know...she was going to encounter the Messiah, the One who would know everything about her and convert her heart and soul.

Jesus didn't *just* stop at the well in Samaria *by accident*; Jesus intentionally made it a point to go through Samaria because he could read the Samaritan Woman's heart from a distance. He saw her heart which was torn into a million pieces, and he made it a point to be right there because he knew that she was going to be at the well on that day at that particular time. Their encounter was not accidental or coincidental; it was providential for God to be there, to look into her heart, to see her pain, to recognize her past and to lead her into the future by saying, "If you continue with this same lifestyle, your heart and soul will always be thirsty, but if you drink the water I shall give you, you will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in you a spring of water welling up for eternal life.

As you and I read this story about the Samaritan Woman at the well, we need to recognize that it is not just a beautiful story between a Jew and a Samaritan; it's a story of Jesus looking into our hearts, seeing our pain, recognizing our past and leading us into the future by saying, "If you continue down this same road, you are going to eventually run into a DEAD END!

Within seconds of Jesus informing the Samaritan Woman about the water of eternal life, she immediately responded by saying, "Sir, give me this water so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water again." At that point in time, she didn't even know that she was speaking to the Messiah, but you and I do. We know that every time we celebrate the Mass, every time we celebrate one of the seven sacraments, we get to stand at the well in the presence of this Jewish Man, in the presence of the Messiah who looks deeply into our spiritually, dehydrated souls and not only offers us a drink; he becomes our DRINK!

In his book called, "*Come Thirsty*," Max Lucado proclaims that Jesus could see the thirst of his people. "The people thirsted. They needed water, not for their throats, but for their hearts. So Jesus invited: Are your insides starting to shrivel? Drink me. What H2O can do for our bodies, Jesus can do for our hearts. We need to lubricate our souls. We need to quench them..."

Jesus invites all of us by saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. Are you anyone? If so, then step up to the well because you qualify for this water. All ages are welcome. Both genders are invited. No race excluded. Scoundrels, scamps and rascals are ALL invited. All Are Welcome! You don't have to be rich to drink or religious to drink or successful to drink. You and I simply need to follow the instructions of Jesus who points to himself as the fountain of living waters. In order for Jesus to do what water does, you and I must let Jesus into our hearts. We must internalize him, ingest him and welcome him into the inner workings of our lives. You and I need to let Christ be the water of our souls." -- Max Lucado
