Go and Announce the Gospel – Let Us Build the City of God

In 2008, now Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI announced new options for the dismissal formulary at Mass. The reason: he wished to clarify the relationship between the Eucharist and our Christian mission to transform the world.

The current options are: Go forth, the Mass is ended. Or: Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord. Or: Go in peace.

Since the grace to fulfill a particular mission is given to each of us weekly in the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, then these words, especially the option directing us to “Go and Announce the Gospel” guide us in a special way to doing works of mercy through the social teachings of the church.

To understand “social teachings”, we turn to the seventh commandment’s dictate to *not steal*. It is actually our mandate to *act justly*. Just actions build a just society. A just society is one which reflects the Kingdom of God: where an awareness of Christ’s presence prevails, all strive to fulfill God’s Will, and where love, peace, joy, patience, kindness, and justice flourish.

Acting justly also requires an awareness of how our actions affect our neighbors and how we must respond with compassion and generosity to meet the needs of others. It means we constantly grow our conscience to make better choices in all we think and do.

We can’t act justly without acknowledging that we were not created to live alone in this world; thus, the Church gives us a social doctrine to guide relationships within society. It does this through seven themes.

1. We are called to act with respect toward the lives and dignity of others because all human life is sacred.
2. We need healthy, strong families and communities.
3. Everyone has a right to life. We are to protect basic human rights to build a healthy society.
4. While there are very rich and extremely poor people, we must strive to ensure the poor and vulnerable can meet their basic needs.
5. Work gives us dignity. Workers have the right to fair wages, unions, productive work and to pursue economic opportunity.
6. Solidarity is the Christian approach to sharing spiritual and material goods, while recognizing our interdependence.
7. We are called to care for Creation.

Through every age and every stage of development of our conscience, we are called to announce the Gospel in deeper and more profound ways. So, let us go and tell the Good News of the Gospel to all the Nations as we build the City of God here and now.

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's celebration of the Holy Mass the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. The theme is Families.

This week, while reviewing today's readings, I noticed a key word that shined forth as a star in the sky. The word was **humility**.

Today's First Reading from the Book of Sirach teaches us that if we perform our tasks with humility, we will be loved by those whom God accepts. The greater we are, the more we must humble ourselves, so we will find favour in the sight of the Lord. When Jesus taught His disciples the meaning of true greatness, He called a child and said, "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like children, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greater in the Kingdom of Heaven."

Humility is practiced by providing the opportunity for others to be heard. When attending class, study groups, meetings, there is no humility when one or two persons always take over as if the others did not exist. The others cannot grow in knowledge and wisdom unless they are allowed to participate in the group, whatever it may be. It takes a lot of humility to sit back and to be silent, even to allow others to make mistakes without condemning them, so they too may grow in knowledge and wisdom. Humility is also found in families where both parents are united as one in their decision making process. Neither spouse strives to control the other one. All decisions are made in harmony and love, both spouses humbly respecting each other.

This week, let us reflect upon these words of humility and ask ourselves if we are humble as we should be.

I would like to conclude by thanking you for the wonderful reception you prepared for me last Sunday. It was so great to meet you and to see you happy and enjoying the food that was prepared for us. Even though I had a sore throat all week from the flu, it has been a good beginning. Thank you so much and may God continue blessing our ministry among you and for you.
