### Peace, Prophecy, and Promise with The Light of the World

Today we are celebrating an ancient feast day in the history of the Church. In addition to being known officially as the **Feast of the Presentation of the Lord**, other names include **Candlemas** and the **Feast of the Purification of the Virgin**. Each represents a particular aspect of a special event which took place 40 days after the birth of Jesus. This reflection will focus on one aspect: going forth in peace after an encounter with the Savior of the world.

The message of today's Feast neatly coincides with the theme of the recent Southwest Liturgical Conference: **Go in peace, glorifying the Lord with your life**, which was designed to put emphasis on the dismissal rite of the Mass.

In today's Gospel, Simeon proclaims, "Lord, now let your servant depart in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your People Israel." (Luke 2:29 - 32).

In the Concluding Rite of the Mass, the deacon or priest proclaims one of four dismissal commands:

- Go forth, the Mass is ended.
- Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.
- Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.
- Go in peace.

Something profound happens when we are dismissed from Mass in peace that is parallel to when Simeon asks to depart in peace, specifically, **we are dismissed into the world for the mission of evangelization**.

What does this involve? Living as a Christian, developing our spiritual gifts, participating in the threefold ministry of Christ as priest, prophet, and servant of the kingdom, and giving our best efforts to belonging to family, parish, diocese, community, and the world as sons and daughters of the Lord.

How have we changed in the past 40 days? How are we light for the world? Do we bring the peace of Christ with us wherever we go? Have we invited someone to Mass?

Let us go forth and share the good news of our salvation so that the Lord may be glorified by our lives.

### The Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Candelaria Virgin of Candelaria - February 2

In the Spanish tradition, everyone who has a Baby Jesus dresses him up and bring him to the church to have him blessed.



The Baby Jesus images are dressed in white christening gowns or saint-inspired robes. Some follow the custom: the first year they receive the Baby he is dressed all in white. The second year, colored clothing and then, on the third year, he is dressed like royalty.



Some people choose godparents for their little Jesus. They are expected to rock the baby to sleep on Christmas, bring him presents on Three Kings Day and be present at the church blessing on Día de la Candelaria.

On the Día de la Candelaria, tamales are eaten in his honor emphasizing the influence of the still present pre-Hispanic traditions and how they mix with Catholic beliefs in Mexico.

### My Dear Brothers and Sisters!

**For my eyes have seen your salvation.**

These are the words that echo the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord that we are celebrating today.

As some of you know, the Feast of the "Presentation of the Lord" in the Temple, which is always observed on February 2nd in the Roman Rite, is also known as "Candlemas Day" and the "Purification of the Blessed Virgin."

Some may ask, what does "Candlemas Day" means? During the 11th century, the liturgical calendar required that the First Reading be the Book of Zephaniah on this feast. And the prophets Zephaniah says: **"At that time, I will search Jerusalem with lamps..."** So, in harmony with the words of this biblical verse, the faithful of those days participated in a candlelight procession. Today, the Catholic liturgy still allows for a procession. Using the rite in the sacramentary, the candles are blessed at the beginning of the Mass.

Now you may wonder why today's Feast is also called, the "Purification of the Blessed Virgin?" In the days of Jesus' birth, Jewish custom commanded that a woman who gave birth to a child be kept in semi-seclusion for 40 days. Counting from December 25th as the first day, the fortieth day fell on February 2nd, which is today's date.

Therefore, the Presentation of the Lord to the Temple by the Blessed Virgin Mary was executed in obedience to the precept of the Law. She redeemed her firstborn from the Temple and was purified by the prayer of Simeon the righteous in the presence of the prophetess Anna.

Although today's readings echo both, the Presentation of the Lord to the Temple and the Purification of the Blessed Virgin, in its wisdom, the Catholic Church deemed it more praiseworthy to place emphasis on the Feast of the Lord Jesus.

We, as members of the Catholic Church which is led by the Spirit of Christ, have also found in our lives the Lord Jesus, our Redeemer. Therefore, when we go out after the celebration of the Holy Mass, it can be said that we also *go in peace*.
