

In recognition of his incredibly charitable act, the name of Jacob Thomas Paskvan is inscribed on the **Celebration of Life Memorial**, located at 500 S 300 E in Salt Lake City. His name appears in Wall Panel 6, Row 21. Hope you will stop by to visit and perhaps do a little dance....



We have learned from our partners that Jacob's bone grafts have been able to help approximately 26 people and went to recipients in California, Michigan, Maryland, Hawaii, Indiana, Ohio, Utah, Texas, Tennessee, and Washington. Most of the grafts were used in spinal fusion surgeries, helping to relieve back and neck pain or for general orthopedic surgeries to repair injuries from trauma and other defects.

Specifically, I was able to learn that Jacob's tissue was used in the ACL reconstruction for a 15-year-old male, a total hip revision in a 75-year-old male, a spinal fusion in a 54-year-old male, scoliosis correction in a 67-year-old male, and a shoulder surgery for a 19-year-old female.

Jacob's heart valve was transplanted to a 7-year-old girl in North Carolina. Receiving a donated valve versus a mechanical valve is a life-saving transplant and most often go to those born with congenital heart defects.

Changing Mourning into Dancing

The experience of grief when a loved one passes is often so crippling that we think we will never be free of the pain. A member of our parish described it like this: *“Grief for a loved one, especially for a child, can drown you. It comes in waves that make it hard to breathe and it can be relentless.”*



Just 16 months ago, the light and love of the Paskvan family, 14-year-old Jacob, left this earth for his eternal home. As his funeral Mass was ending, the sky wept, simultaneously displaying a soft rain and a double rainbow witnessed by many across the Tooele Valley. A friend of their family wrote: *“A rainbow is a promise of sunshine after rain, of calm after storms, of joy after sadness, of peace after pain, of love after loss.”*

When we are baptized, we inherit the promises of God as His adopted daughters and sons. One promise, in particular, is important to claim. It is from Psalm 30: our mourning will be turned into dancing.

Evidence of the fulfillment of God's promise for the Paskvan family came a few weeks ago in a letter from **Donor Connect**, an organization dedicated to helping with organ donation. The letter acknowledged that Jacob was able to save and help 26 people aged 7 to 75 in 10 different states through the donation of his tissues and bones.

Upon receiving the letter, his mother wrote, “It gives us comfort knowing that he lives on in these individuals.” She is right. Jacob does live on. His soul, all our souls were made to live eternally. Jacob's obituary proclaimed he had a beautiful soul and a loving heart that enabled him to think about others more than himself. Unquestionably the gifts of his love, his selflessness, and his vital tissues to give life to others were more than sufficient to admit him to eternal life, allowing us to proclaim with his family, “he lives on”.

Human life is sacred because it involves the creative action of God and “must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception” (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2258, 2270). Loss of life grieves us in a deep and profound way. Transforming that loss through the “noble and meritorious act” of organ donation (2296) was an act of faith for the Paskvan family, resulting in an inner joy and peace that life goes on as their mourning is slowly turned into dancing.

Parking Lot Safety

School has begun and, as you can imagine, we are navigating a number of changes. Our main priority is to keep the students safe while trying to minimize the impact our new processes will have on our Parish community. You may have seen brightly colored cones set up each morning as students arrive. We use the cones as a guide for our families to pull through the lot, ensuring traffic is not backed up onto the street. We are happy to report that we were given a generous grant that will allow us to purchase rubber car stops for the stalls in the parking lot. What this means for the church and school – no more cones blocking parking stalls. Parishioners can now park on both sides. No more cars speeding through or doing “donuts” in the parking lot after hours. The pavement was a huge investment that should be safeguarded. No risk of bumping the car in front of you – the car stops will serve as a buffer to protect cars from pulling into one another, and now our faculty can focus on keeping the children safe and the building disinfected as we adjust to the new “normal.” The plan is to keep the car stops up throughout the year and hope they will be well received as a positive addition to our church and school.

Students are participating in a traditional classroom setting as well as remote learning with a team of educators and staff who are committed to the values of Catholic education.
