### CELEBRATING THE BIRTH OF OUR BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This Tuesday, September 8 is The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September nativity was first recognized by the Eastern Church because they begin their Liturgical year at that time.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the Protoevangelium of James fills in the gaps and reflects the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile, but prayed for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan for salvation of the world. This, like many Biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the very beginning.

Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with the saving work of Jesus. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious Lily of the Valley. Through her birth, the nature inherited from our first parents [Adam and Eve] is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation for an increase of peace.

We can see every human birth as a call for new hope in the world. The love of two human beings has joined with God in His work of Creation. The loving parents have shown hope in a world filled with travail. Every new child has the potential to be a channel of God's Love and Peace to our world.

This is all true in a most magnificent way in Mary. If Jesus is the perfect expression of God's Love, Mary is the foreshadowing and the promise of that Love. If Jesus has brought the fullness of salvation to the world, Mary is its dawning – just as the birth of every child is a new dawning of hope and healing in our troubled world.

Birthday celebrations bring happiness to the celebrant as well as to family and friends. Next to the birth of Jesus, Mary's birth offers the greatest possible happiness to the world. Each time we celebrate her birth, we can confidently hope for an increase of peace in our hearts and in the world at large and devote special prayers for the sanctity of life and the health and safety of every child in the womb.

*Hail Mary, Full of Grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and Blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death, Amen.*

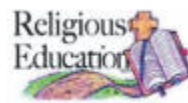

Greetings to all of you,  
my dear parishioners!

During today's readings from the Holy Scriptures, we heard that the Lord God gave us the responsibility to be our brothers' keepers. Therefore, the term, *"It's none of my business"* is not biblical, nor is it acceptable in the practice of the Christian life.

Such an expression echoes a passage that is familiar to us from the Book of Genesis where it states, *"Then the LORD said to Cain, 'Where is your brother Abel?' Abel answered, 'I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?'"* (Genesis 4:9) As parents and caregivers, Christians are responsible and made accountable for the well-being of those in their care, be it their children, grandparents or even friends.

The Word of God that we have heard today, command the spiritual responsibility and accountability that each and everyone of us has towards our neighbors. The meaning of the word "neighbor" in biblical sense has a greater significance than just "fellow Jews" or the neighbor next door. It speaks of our responsibility to correct our brothers and sisters in Christ who are living in error.

From the Book of Ezekiel, we heard God commanding us to speak on His behalf. As Christians and ministers of the God's word, through the promise that we made to God and the Church when we were baptized, we have a responsibility and are obligated to warn the wicked to turn away from their sinful ways so that they may be saved from spiritual death. If the sinners ignore our pleas for repentance, they will suffer eternal damnation. Their condemnation will not be by us; it will be by their own free choice of having embraced their evil ways and to have rejected the grace of God that was at work through us when we warned them.

The Church, the Mystical Body of Christ, is like a large life-giving tree extended throughout the world. We are the branches that have been attached to the tree of life who is Jesus Christ. Through our actions, we *"Either make the tree good, and its fruit good; or make the tree bad, and its fruit bad; for the tree is known by its fruit."*

This week, let take some time to reflect on our responsibility to God. Let's reflect on how we will account to God for the actions of those around us. Let's do what we must do so that when we stand before God on Judgment Day, we can repeat the words of Jesus, *"Not one of them was lost, except the one destined to be lost."*
