“Mission” is defined by Webster as “the act of sending”, that is “to entrust someone with mission.” “A Missionary is a person undertaking a mission...*in this case a religious mission*”.

Here in Utah the word “Missionary” most often brings to mind two young men in dark suits and white shirts knocking on doors, eager and well versed, to bring the Good News according to Joseph Smith and his followers to the neighborhood.



This picture may indeed be very parochial but most likely best reflects what Jesus probable had in mind when he sent his disciples out two by two to bring the Good News of God’s kingdom “**according to Jesus Christ**” to the whole world.

However, society in the 21st Century is very different from society in the 1st Century... very different. Society in the 1st Century was a “Godfearing” society. Society in the 21st Century is anything but Godfearing. The very belief that there is a God is not seriously adhered to by many of our technologically satiated society.

On this Mission Sunday Pope Francis reminds us that the current situation demands that we must first “put on Christ” ourselves before we attempt to bring Christianity to others.



He challenges us to make a greater effort and sacrifice to grow and mature in our knowledge and understanding of our faith and in our relationship with Jesus. As “Christ-Followers” we are challenged to become more and more like Jesus. We have to be willing to make personal sacrifices to become more “Christ-like” in the way we live our lives.

Only then can we begin to do what is one of the primary obligations of our covenant with Jesus, that is “Go Therefore and Make Disciples of all nations, baptizing them *in the name of the trinity*”.



And, Pope Francis strongly suggests we start with our own family. There isn’t a Christian family in the world, he says, that could not benefit from some well-versed evangelization by a well-trained, faith-filled, Catholic missionary. (If interested please see your pastor.)

Mt. 22:21

Beginning with the first reading from the Book of Isaiah, the Lord God addressed His anointed one. As spiritual children of God, having been anointed during the Sacrament of Baptism, we can all welcome this message as if it were meant for each and every one of us.

In today Gospel Jesus was asked, "Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor or not?" Jesus asked for a coin and said, "Whose image and inscription is this?" They answered, "The emperors." So Jesus told them to give to the emperor the things that belong to the emperor and to God the things that are from God's.

To condemn the paying of taxes would have meant to be in disagreement with the occupation of the Romans. To agree to the payment of taxes would have meant supporting their occupancy of the land.

The Book of Genesis teaches us that man was created in the image of God. Having lost that original image through Adam's disobedience, God set in motion a progressive Divine Plan to transform us once again into his glorious image. That's why God gave us so many gifts and blessings. That is why Christ died for us. That is why we are being transformed into the image of Christ through faith, hope and charity.

Belonging to God, we are called to become his image. We are called to actively maintain our gifts by living our faith in Christ. We are called to give to God what belongs to God so it will not be said, "In your case the god of this world has blinded you so that you do not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God."

Today's message my brothers and sisters, is, let's appreciate what God has given us. By the power of the Holy Spirit, let us preserve our gifts and blessings with all our souls, our minds, our spirits, our hearts and our strength. In the Most Holy Name of Jesus, let us keep these gifts intact so that one day, when we come before the Lord God, we will proudly return to Him back what He given us. Then, we will rightfully inherit the assurance of our salvation.

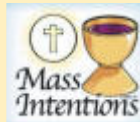
