

The History of Three Days

ALL HALLOWS EVE – The definition of the word "Hallow" in Middle English means "to make Holy". The tradition of Halloween originated with the ancient Celtic Festival of Samhain, when people would light bonfires and wear costumes to "ward off ghosts". It also meant to make sacred, sanctify, consecrate and venerate.

In the 8th Century AD, Pope Gregory III designated November 1st as a time to honor all Saints. Over time, All Saints Day incorporated some of the traditions of the Samhain, which is now why we see little ghosts, goblins and princesses knocking on our doors and receiving gifts on the night before All Saints Day. This year, October 31 falls on next Saturday.

THUS BEGINS THE THREE DAY OBSERVANCE OF "ALLHALLOWTIDE" – The time in the Liturgical Year dedicated to remembering the dead, including Saints (Hallows), Martyrs and all of the faithfully departed.



ALL SAINTS DAY – Falls on Sunday, November 1st this year. It is a Holy Day of Obligation and is in honor of all Saints. Pope Boniface IV formally started what would later become known as All Saints Day on 609 AD when he dedicated the Pantheon in Rome as a church to honor The Virgin Mary and all Martyrs and declared it a Holy Day of Obligation. Particularly celebrated are those saints who have no Feast Day of their own. It is now celebrated in over 50 countries around the world.

ALL SOULS DAY – Observed on Monday, November 2nd. This is a day of Masses and prayers for all deceased baptized Catholics. It commemorates the Church Penitent of all the Souls in Purgatory. It was first instituted at the Monastery in Cluny, France in 993 AD and quickly spread throughout the Christian world. It is a time when we particularly remember those who have died and to remind us that we are joined in the Communion of Saints with whom we share in the hope of the Resurrection of the Dead.



So Let Us Remember that next weekend is not just about candy and costumes. It is very much about the history and development of our faith.

“The church isn’t empty; its been deployed!”

A few thoughts on how great it is to be a part of Saint Marguerite Catholic Church during this crisis.

If you are on social media, you may have seen or heard that phrase already. I love it because it really captures the moment we are living in right now.

I know that this is a somber time. Millions of Americans have contracted the virus and sadly too many people have died across the country, and the cases are increasing in Utah. We have all been impacted either by the illness, or the quarantine, or by the economic shutdown. It has been hard on everyone. I know it has been hard on you.

I mourn those who have died, and I sympathize with those who are suffering. But I also feed a sense of incredible joy and hope at the *goodness* that I’m seeing. Is that wrong? For me to feel joy and hope right now? I hesitate to even write these words because I do not want people to take them the wrong way.

“Father” they’ll say, “you can’t be joyful and hopeful when people are dying and businesses are closing, and your parish budget has been blown to smithereens.”

Here’s why I say that: this coronavirus pandemic has revealed what kind of people we are, and what kind of parish we have built here at Saint Marguerite, and what kind of parish we will be when we come out on the other side.

And I see that we have something special here. Because, for the past few months I have witnessed the kind of love and sacrifice and care for others that proves, beyond a doubt, that our parishioners are followers of Jesus Christ.

These are busy days. And while social distancing makes it impossible, I wish that you could spend a day with me, see what I see and hear what I hear. Every day brings a dozen new examples of God’s love and His work in our community.

Volunteers are finding new ways to help the parish - calling elderly parishioners, donating can goods so that the Knights of Columbus can take them over to the Tooele Food Bank to help our community, keeping our church and office sanitized or just being available to assist wherever the need may be.

I bet you are nodding as you read those words because I think you have seen it too. You have seen

families spending time together. You have seen people coming together, praying together, and caring for one another. And, you are not alone in feeling that something important is taking place. You are not alone in feeling joyful and hopeful. Because, something truly special is going on right now. I sense the Holy Spirit guiding our community as the Catholic Church is deployed to share the Good News.

We have something special here. We are a family of believers who have Jesus Christ lighting the way and the Holy Spirit guiding us. And, *you are a part of Saint Marguerite, and you belong right here in our community. We are lucky to have you as part of our family. Whatever comes our way, our parish families are all in this together. We are showing the world what it means to be Catholic in a time of crisis. And it fills me with joy and hope. God bless you for all that you are doing.*

You and your family are in my prayers, and I hope that I am in yours.



Second and Third Grade had a little free time after PE so they got to create chalk art. **We love our students!**






