WORDS FROM OUR DEACON

Epiphany means **Reality**, it is a Christian feast celebrating the manifestation of the divine nature of Jesus to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi. Although St. Matthew does not tell us the names of the wise men, in the West they have traditionally been given the names Gaspar, Melchior and Balthasar but in the Eastern Church the tradition is that there were twelve magi. From reading St. Matthew we do not know how many wise men came because he does not tell us, he simply states that they offered three gifts and from that it has been deduced that there were three wise men. However we can well imagine that others also accompanied them.

The wise men were not Jews; scholars tell us they were priests of an Eastern religion that consulted the stars (Zoroastrian priests). We could say they were followers of some kind of pagan religion. Yet in some miraculous way God inspired them about the birth of Jesus.

Their journey of a thousand miles or more westward from Persia which could have taken three months is really a symbol of the inward journey they made in their hearts, a journey from paganism to belief in Jesus as the Saviour of the world. Indeed, not just the wise men but all of us are on a journey to get closer to Jesus because none of us is fully converted yet and each of us has corners in our hearts and lives that are in need of Jesus' healing and redemption. Like the wise men we too are relying on the grace of God to lead us to the light of Jesus.

Like the wise men, we too are on a journey. We need each other to make it to Jesus and we need the Grace of GOD to get there. And the easiest way to Jesus is with the help of our Blessed Mother.

Pope Francis proclaims “Year of St Joseph”

With the Apostolic Letter “*Patris corde*” (“With a Father’s Heart”), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a “Year of Saint Joseph” from 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved, tender, obedient father, welcoming the will of God, a creatively courageous father, example of love, a father who teaches the value, dignity and joy of work, and a father “in the shadows,” centered on Mary and Jesus.

The Holy Father wrote *Patris corde* against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of “ordinary” people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, “the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence,” who nonetheless played “an incomparable role in the history of salvation.”

*Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father
