

NSDG COVID-19 POLICIES:

The Archdiocese has given the Parish Priest the discretion to mandate their own COVID-19 Policies. Masks will be REQUIRED in all church facilities at **ALL** times. This policy goes for all Priests, Deacons, Lectors, Ushers, Choirs, all Ministries, and the Congregation. If you are at the Altar serving, reading, singing or in a Choir, the mask must remain on at **ALL** times. All ministries who participate must be fully vaccinated with proof of card on file and have taken the Child Protection Training ages 18 and above. ASF Policy: Parish Staff must be fully vaccinated with proof of card on file or adhere to weekly testing. Dispensation from attending Mass remains; Spanish and English Videos are recorded so as to serve for the homebound or those fearful. Thank you for your continued cooperation.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: The Holy Spirit descends upon the Apostles gathered in Jerusalem.

Responsorial Psalm: God's Spirit renews the earth. **Second Reading:** We are all one in Christ Jesus. **John 20:19-23**

Jesus appears to his disciples and gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost. On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks the beginning of the Church. The story of Pentecost is found in the Acts of the Apostles, today's first reading. The account in today's Gospel, taken from the Gospel of John, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts to each other. It is enough to know that, after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world. We previously heard today's Gospel on the second Sunday of Easter. At that time, we also heard the passage that follows, which describes Jesus' appearance to Thomas. In that context, we were led to reflect on belief and unbelief. In the context of the feast of Pentecost, this reading reminds us about the integral connection between the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." As he breathes the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus sends his Disciples to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins.
