

#### **FAMILY CONNECTION**

In our families, we are able to share good news and bad news. All too often, because of our busy-ness, we find ourselves only dealing with the bad news. Start a family tradition of inviting each family member to share something good that happened to him or her that day as you gather for dinner. Explain that, in the Gospel for the Christmas Mass at dawn, the shepherds were told the good news of Jesus' birth by the angels, and then they in turn went forth to share with others the good news. Point out how the people who heard the good news of the shepherds were amazed. Talk about how Mary treasured all this in her heart, meaning that she pondered the significance of these events and sought to recognize God's presence in the midst of them. Talk about how you can each ponder one another's good news and see how God is present in your family's everyday lives.

#### **ENVELOPE USAGE**

By using your Church Offering Envelope **OR** a plain Envelope with your envelope number, you are indicating your presence at Mass. What you put in the envelope is between you and God. Parishioners are asked to include first name, last name, envelope number, and your mailing address on any envelope that is not provided by the Parish. **Thank you for your continued support.** 

#### **NSDG COVID-19 POLICIES**

The Archdiocese has given the Parish Priest the discretion to mandate their own COVID-19 Policies. Masks will be **Optional** while attending Mass. However, they remain strongly **recommended** for those over 65, with medical conditions that make them more vulnerable to the virus and those that are unvaccinated. If you are serving at the Altar, (Deacon, Acolyte, Lector, Cantor, EM, or any Server) you **MUST WEAR A MASK AT ALL TIMES**. All ministries who participate must be fully vaccinated with proof of card on file and have taken the Child Protection Training ages 18 and above. ASF Policy: Parish Staff must be fully vaccinated with proof of card on file or adhere to weekly testing. Spanish and English Videos are recorded so as to serve for the homebound who are ill or those with a serious reason. (Cf. CIC, c. 1245) Thank you for your continued cooperation.

#### SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Isaiah 62:11 –12 Say to daughter Zion, your savior comes.

**Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 97:1-6, 11-12** A light will shine on us this day: the Lord is born for us.

**Second Reading: Titus 3:4-7** He saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit.

Gospel Reading: Luke 2:15-22 So they went in haste and found Mary and Joseph and the infant lying in the manger. There are four Masses that are celebrated for the feast of Christmas, and each is given its own set of readings to help us contemplate Christ's birth. The Gospel for the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve is taken from the beginning of the Gospel of Matthew, the genealogy of Jesus and the angel's announcement of the birth to Joseph. The mass at midnight proclaims the birth of Jesus through the angels' announcement to the shepherds in the Gospel of Luke. The reading for the mass at dawn on Christmas morning continues the story of the birth of Jesus with the shepherd's visit to the infant Jesus. Then, the Gospel for Christmas Mass during the day is taken from the beginning of John's Gospel. It is not an Infancy Narrative like those found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Instead, John's Gospel starts at the very beginning of time and presents Creation as the framework for announcing the Incarnation. John's opening words echo the first verse of Genesis, "In the Beginning was the Word." As the angels return to heaven, the shepherds decide to go see "this thing" that has happened in Bethlehem. Their visit confirms everything the angels had told them about the birth of the Savior and Messiah. They spoke publicly about all they had seen. Mary ponders all this in her heart, and the shepherds return to their fields praising God. What had been told to them really happened. The scene is simple, two parents and child in a stable. But the reality is great. God's salvation offered to all.
