
REFLECTION OF SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER/

Divine Mercy Sunday: The first reading calls us to remember that we are a "community of believers of one heart and mind". It also tells us the community of believers shared everything without greed, and everyone had what they needed. The second reading tells us that we show our love for God by keeping the commandments. Some of those commandments are hard: not to be jealous, not to be greedy, not to lie, and most important, to love one another as Jesus loves us. Its very difficult to believe in a love that strong when we look around us and see devastation and destruction, when we see hurt, despair and sickness. We have trouble believing and feeling that love when we can't see it. The reality is that most of us in this community of believers have to look hard to see the risen Jesus. We aren't waiting in a upper room for him to appear. Sometimes we are all Thomas's. Sometimes we are the other disciples in the room, pulling the Thomas's along, holding them up, convincing them God's love is real.

FAMILY CONNECTION

Within normal family life, there are many opportunities for conflict. Jesus did not promise us the absence of conflict in our lives. Instead, he gave us the gifts of peace, forgiveness, and reconciliation so that we could reduce conflict. The measure of Christian family life is not the absence of conflict, but the manner in which conflict is resolved. Filled with the gift of the Holy Spirit, we ask Jesus to help us to bring peace and forgiveness to situations of conflict in our families. As your family gathers, take this opportunity to examine how your family resolves conflict. Recall a recent argument or disagreement and discuss how the conflict was resolved. Consider whether the conflict was resolved peacefully, in the spirit of Jesus. If not, discuss alternatives that might be tried in the future. The Holy Spirit helps us to forgive others.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 4:32-35 The first Christian community shared their possessions, and no one was needy.

Responsorial Psalm: 118:2-4,13-15,22-24 The Lord's mercy endures forever.

Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-6 Those who love God keep his commandments.

Gospel Reading: John 20:19-31 Thomas believes because he sees Jesus.

Today's reading from the Gospel of John is proclaimed on the Second Sunday of Easter. This fact should alert us to the significance of the encounters with the resurrected Jesus. This Gospel combines two scenes: Jesus' appearance to his disciples after his Resurrection and Jesus' dialogue with Thomas, the disciple who doubted. Part of the mystery of Jesus' Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit, but in bodily form. We do not know, however, exactly what this form looked like. When Mary of Magdala first encountered the risen Jesus, she did not recognize him until he spoke to her. The disciples walking along the road to Emmaus did not recognize Jesus until he broke bread with them. In his resurrected form, Jesus was not bound by matter, he appeared to the disciples inside a home even though the door was locked. Yet the disciples could still touch the marks of his Crucifixion. Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun; as Jesus was sent by God, so Jesus sends his disciples. He gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit so that they will be able to accomplish this task. Jesus' words to his disciples also highlight the integral connection between the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share forgiveness and reconciliation with others. Like Thomas, we may doubt the news that Jesus, who was crucified and buried, appeared to his disciples after his death. Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative in obtaining this evidence. He gives witness that the Jesus who was raised is the Jesus who died for us.
